Dear Governor Sununu:

It was good of you to speak to me, last Friday, and I'm glad to see that our discussion regarding Mayor Kollek's letter was given consideration and that the President did respond to it this week. I've been away for the past few days and Bobbie Kilberg read it to me on the phone to Europe. I believe it is a great step forward in helping to resolve the issues we discussed.

There is a slight nuance that, if addressed, would clarify the Jerusalem matter. I've given some thought to what could be done besides meetings and other normal channels. I believe it would be of great value if the President could, on an early occasion, either in a letter or a press conference or a speech, say the following:

"Since American policy calls for Jerusalem to remain an undivided city, Jews and Arabs should have the right to live anywhere in Jerusalem."

I hope you will have the opportunity to discuss this and other matters in the near future.
