I think the Welfare Dept Food Stamp Program treated me very unfair. They wrote to me last April of 1990 & said I moved when I did not move. I live 41 years on East Canton Boston Ma, but the last 7 years at number 89 East Canton St. I didn't move. I had a hearing & they admitted the Food Stamp Unit

was not accurate & that the Food Stamp Unit moved. They moved from 6 Hamilton Place to 600 Washington St also under the name of Boston St office at 600 Washington Street. I still won't give me my ten dollars for lost July, 1990. Because when I called them up I was told to give it one day more in case the \$1,000 came 1 day to me.
