Just in case you're keeping score at home, when President Bush walked across to the Navy side of the field, he sat in Section 142, Row 25, Seat 22.

Two more things: UberBrain Karl Rove was along for the trip, and had his colleagues in stitches as they sat in the SUPPORT van before Bush left the stadium. Marvin's son, Walker, accompanied his father.

POTUS rolled out of the game early, with Navy crushing Army. At 5:21, his limo pulled out. Wheels up at 5:40. On AAFB tarmac at 6:06. Bush immediately off and over to his chopper.

But Sen. John McCain talked to your pool. On the game he said: "Great game. I knew Navy would win."

More substantively, he talked about steroids. For your dining pleasure, a transcript:

WHAT ABOUT STEROIDS?

I warned them a long time ago that we needed to fix this problem. I met with Mr. (Freer?) I talked with Selig many a time. It's time for them to sit down together and act. And that's what they should do. If not, clearly, we have to act legislatively, which we don't want to do.

HOW WOULD YOU DO THAT

Oh, you can...both interstate commerce (clause) and antitrust, baseball's antitrust exemption gives Congress oversight of professional baseball. They need to fix the problem they know they need to fix it. We know they need to fix it. It's time to do it.

HOW?

Well I'll introduce legislation in January but I hope I don't have to do that.

AS PART OF THE INTERSTATE COMMERCE BILL?

No, it would be stand-alone legislation but we can add it as an amendment on most anything.

WAS IT THE BARRY BONDS THING THAT SPURRED YOU HERE...

Yes.

OR SOMETHING YOU'VE BEEN THINKING ABOUT FOR AWHILE?

It's not just the Bonds thing, it's the entire revelation. It's not just the Bonds but Marion Jones. I watched Mr. Conte on 20/20 last night, dare I offend any network here, and it's very clear that there was a number of people involved in this.. And finally, I don't care about Mr. Bonds or Mr. Sheffield or anybody else. What I care about are high school athletes who are tempted to use steroids because they think that's the only way they can make it in the major leagues.

Quote fix from Pool Report #2: "We need your character, we need your class. God bless you." Another pooler was able to hear better on his tape recorder.

President Bush arrived at Andrews Air Force Base on time, walking swiftly across the tarmac on the clear, crisp day. Clad in a knee-length cloth coat, blue shirt with no tie and dress shoes, he stopped atop the stairs and gave a quick wave before ducking in.

Also aboard Air Force One: COS Andy Card, Sen. John McCain and wife, Sen. Zell Miller, Secretary of Veteran Affairs Tony Principi, OMB Deputy Director Clay Johnson, brother Marvin and several VIP children (said to be those of the McCains and Marvin).

Wheels up at 12:27 p.m. Just 20 minutes later, the Big Blue Plane blasted over Lincoln Financial Field, dipping a wing in salute. The plane was low -- really low. As it approached the stadium, we appeared to be below the tops of some nearby skyscrapers: If anyone looked out the window at the moment, they would have shocked by what they saw.

AF1 doubled around and came back in on the same line, but a mile or two from the stadium. Wheels down at Philadelphia International Airport 12:49.

On the tarmac, POTUS greeted a couple and their two children. The little boy (staff does not know his name), wearing a big cowboy hat, was a part of the Make-A-Wish Foundation, and his wish was to meet the president. Bush bent down low to talk to him, stood for pictures with the family, then pulled the boy in front of him for another picture. The little boy beamed. Before he left, Bush reached into his pocket and pulled out two small items, handing one to the boy and a little girl. At 1:02, Trailblazer was on the move.

The motorcade was even briefer than the flight, winding through the bowels of The Navy Yard, past warehouses and huge gunships moored along the docks. (The press van's radio gave a traffic update: A 6-mile backup on I-95 to get to the stadium).

The pool was led to a small hold. About 15 minutes later, at 1:36 p.m., staff led poolers out to the field. Bush, Miller and the McCains were already on the field on the Navy sideline near the 10-yard-line, watching the Navy players stretching and running some scrimmage plays. McCain elbowed Bush when the big screen showed a fan waving a life-sized cutout of Bush: the two laughed and laughed. At one point, White House staff and Secret Service agents opened a rope, allowing about 50 Navy fans and cheerleaders to approach POTUS for handshakes and pictures. (The Secret Service held back the Navy mascot, a guy in a goat costume with a big, horned goat head, when he came running up, presumably to get a better look).

As the party moved toward the Army side of the field, a pooler asked, "Who's going to win the game?" Bush said, "The United States of America."

Just under the goalposts, Bush pinched his coat's lapel, pulled at it and, apparently addressing a fan who looked cold, said: "Want to borrow my coat?"

On the Army side, he shook hands with some cheerleaders, who looked freezing. In the stands, a woman held a sign that said: "Lt. Hoot Stahl -- Marine -- Come Back Soon!"

After heading in to the Navy locker room at 2:13 to hear -- well, nothing, since the staffers rushed us out as some Navy guy was speaking inaudibly -- your pool rushed to the Army locker room. You have those quotes (see fix above). After Bush moved out of the Army locker room, McCain, who had accompanied him, shook a few hands.

Your pool was not allowed out on the field for the coin toss, which featured a coin from Fallujah. At halftime, cadets and midshipmen lined the 50-yard line. Bush, accompanied by the superintendent of the Army, walked the cordon to mid-field. The Army guy was soundly booed. At midfield, the superintendent of the USNA took Bush's elbow and accompanied into the Navy stands. The Army superintendent returned, alone, to his side.
