I. PURPOSE

To highlight your six-point economic plan, focusing on increasing opportunities for U.S. manufacturers, and to discuss jobs and the economy with employers and employees from the Detroit metropolitan area.

II. BACKGROUND

Recent economic news is positive, with overall economic growth in the third quarter revised upwards from 7.2 percent to 8.2 percent, the highest level in twenty years. This positive growth is spreading to the manufacturing sector as well. New orders for durable goods rose sharply in October, as did shipments of non-defense capital goods. Orders and shipments of these goods were also revised upwards for September.

More importantly, the positive economic trend is starting to translate into job creation. According to the Department of Labor, nearly 300,000 jobs were created in the last three months. More recently, the four-week average for initial weekly jobless claims has fallen to 359,000, down 46,000 from the average eight weeks ago, indicating the new job growth will continue in the fourth quarter.

The two companies highlighted today reflect this positive trend. Dynamic Metal Treating is a family-owned business started in 1984 by Loren Epler, its President and the host for this event. Dynamic went through layoffs a few years ago, but has rehired everyone (those who were available) and actually increased its workforce by three this year.

Spectrum Automation is another family-owned business, started by participant Tom Zimmerman's father on April 1, 1969. Tom began working in the business in 1984 but is still referred to as the "new guy." Tom had to lay off two long-term employees last August, but was able to hire them back this year due to rising orders. Tom's business is up 60 percent this year, and he attributes many sales directly to the 50 percent bonus depreciation you signed into law.

Today's event is in Congressman Thad McCotter's Congressional District (R, MI-11).

Remarks on the Economy – Detroit, Michigan
December 1, 2003

Thank you for the warm welcome and the tour of your facility. Dynamic Metal Treating helps make metal parts durable and strong for a variety of important industries.

Our Nation is facing challenges to our security and to our economy – and we are meeting those challenges.

On the economy:

- We cut taxes for everyone who pays income taxes.
- We reduced the marriage penalty. We doubled the child credit to 1,000 dollars. We cut taxes on dividends and capital gains.
- Income tax relief helps small business owners who file as Subchapter S corporations, sole proprietorships, or limited partnerships.
- And we passed additional tax relief for small businesses, quadrupling the amount they could deduct from their taxes for their investment in new equipment.

Now, our economy is coming around:

- 286,000 jobs in the last three months.
- Consumer confidence is at its highest levels in more than a year.
- Economic output rose at an annual rate of 8.2 percent in the third quarter – the fastest pace in nearly 20 years.

But we still have work to do. We need to take action on a full agenda, so that every person who wants to work can find a job.

Six-point economic plan:

- Control health care costs – association health plans; medical liability reform; health savings accounts in Medicare Law.
- Litigation reform
- Trade
- Regulatory reform
- Energy – Senate failed to act, but the Nation still needs an energy policy.
- Make tax relief permanent

This is a full agenda, but we have proven that no challenge is too great. We are protecting the peace of the world, and we are building the prosperity of our Nation.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION FOR STAGE PARTICIPANTS

Loren Epler, President, Dynamic Metal Treating (Canton, Michigan)

- Loren started Dynamic Metal Treating in 1984. Dynamic heat treats steel components and tools for the automotive and oil industries.
- Dynamic employs 26 people and has revenues of \$2.5 million.
- Loren has plans to purchase \$300,000 in qualified investments this year, which includes a new furnace and a part washer.
- Dynamic Metal Treating had layoffs a few years ago, but have called back everyone and have hired three additional employees in the past 10 months.
- Loren is married to Diane, and has five children – Loren (20), Ashley (18), Meaghan (17), Rachel (14), and Sarah (12).

Note: With the increased small business expensing and bonus depreciation from your Jobs and Growth bill, Loren's business will save \$56,000 if he invests \$300,000 and has sufficient income this year.

Sam Domke [DOM-key], Quality Manager, Dynamic Metal Treating

- Sam has been a quality manager with Dynamic Metal Treating since October.
- Prior to working at Dynamic, Sam worked for a manufacturing company that went out of business 10 months after he started. Previously, he had worked for another automotive manufacturing company before being laid-off after eight years.
- Sam was fortunate to have found this job with Dynamic quickly and was not out of work during this transition; however, he was laid off for six months between his previous two jobs.
- Sam took the job at Dynamic thinking that the product it produces and the quality of its products will allow it to continue growing and give him some job stability.
- Sam and his wife, Deborah, have two sons – Joel (16) and Garrett (13).

Note: Sam received tax-relief checks both this year and in 2001. His total savings from the tax relief passed in 2001 and 2003 will be approximately \$2,000.

Rick Sullivan, Sales Manager, Dynamic Metal Treating

- Rick has been the Sales Manager at Dynamic Metal Treating for the past two years.
- Prior to joining Dynamic, Rick worked as a salesman for another manufacturer and started his own engineering company.
- Rick was approached by Loren to join the team at Dynamic and decided the company had enough promise for him to work for Dynamic full time.
- He says that sales have increased over the past 1 ½ years and the "economy is coming back around." They are seeing more work and have recently hired three new employees.
- Rick and his fiancée, Kathy, live in Toledo, Ohio.

Tom Zimmerman, Secretary and Treasurer, Spectrum Automation Company (Livonia, Michigan)

- Tom's father started the business in 1969.
- They design and build "parts feeding" equipment, mostly for automotive applications.
- They have 20 employees.
- They laid-off a couple of employees in August of 2002 due to slow sales but have since re-hired them.
- Sales are up 60 percent this year, to around \$2.9 million.
- Tom says several customers recently have made orders based on the bonus depreciation.
- Tom is married to Mia, and has two children – Mark (9) and Mary (4).

Note: While Tom has no plans to make capital investments this year – "Our people are our capital" – he says the bonus depreciation in your Jobs and Growth package has directly resulted in at least two recent orders for his business – a \$53,000 bolt feeder and a \$70,000 brass billet feeder.

Cliff Daniels, Machine Operator, Spectrum Automation Company

- Cliff operates the machines and handles shipping.
- He's been with Spectrum for 26 years and hopes to retire at the end of 2004.
- Cliff says he has seen impressive growth at Spectrum this year and believes the economy is improving.
- Cliff is married to Shirley with two grown children.

John Krynak [CRY-nack], Project Mechanic, Spectrum Automation

- John builds the machines and then services them.
- He is married to Crystal and has four children – Jenna (7), Trisha (9), John Jr. (11), and Thomas (11).
- His income fell from \$100,000 "before 9/11" to \$50,000 last year. Now that he gets overtime again, he expects his income to rise to \$65,000 this year.
- Crystal runs a daycare center out of their house.
- Tax relief and refinancing their mortgage helped during this past year.

Note: John received tax relief checks both this year and in 2001. His total savings from the tax relief passed in 2001 and 2003 is approximately \$2,700.

3. Background: Born and raised in Plainfield, New Jersey, Pat graduated from Plainfield High School and Rutgers University. Pat currently owns Meetings of the Minds, Inc., a special events and planning business in Plainfield, New Jersey.
4. Age: 58 years old
5. Service Record: Pat has been an active volunteer in the Plainfield community for the past 35 years. Since 1988, Pat has volunteered with the School Based Youth Services: Plainfield Teen Parenting Program, Inc., a non-profit organization that helps teenage parents graduate from high school while teaching them how to give their babies a healthy start. Pat serves as a mentor to young mothers and is also the President of the Board of Directors and oversees the mentor program and all fundraising activities. A former unwed teen mother herself, Pat has a very personal connection to the young women she mentors.

As a mentor to young mothers, Pat talks to her mentee on the phone at least twice each week, frequently visits the mother and her baby at their home, serves as a role model, friend, and listener, and takes her mentee to social events. As part of the program's Life Skills Training class, Pat meets with the young mothers each week. Throughout the year, Pat receives toys and clothing for the mothers and children and has a warehouse of donated furniture for mothers in need.

Each young mother in the program is paired with a mentor in the Plainfield community and is also provided with free transportation and child care at Plainfield High School so that they can attend school. Teens may be in the program for up to three years and must be a parent and in school. During the program, the young mothers attend classes each week to learn parenting skills and about pregnancy and child abuse prevention. The program also offers male mentors and parenting education for young fathers and recently completed a two-year project to teach young men building, carpentry, plumbing, and electrical skills while restoring a local home.

Pat also serves as a council president of New Outlook Pioneers, a non-profit membership organization whose members contributed 977,344 hours toward service projects in communities across the country last year. As a volunteer, Pat manages the activities of members and their projects, such as refurbishing and donating used computers to pre-school children in New Jersey and assisting with the Whippany Doll and Toy Program. Pat is also a member of the Board of Directors for Community Coordinated Child Care and the Chamber of Commerce and serves as a trustee at Shiloh Baptist Church in Plainfield.

6. Other: Pat is not married. She has three daughters and three grandchildren.

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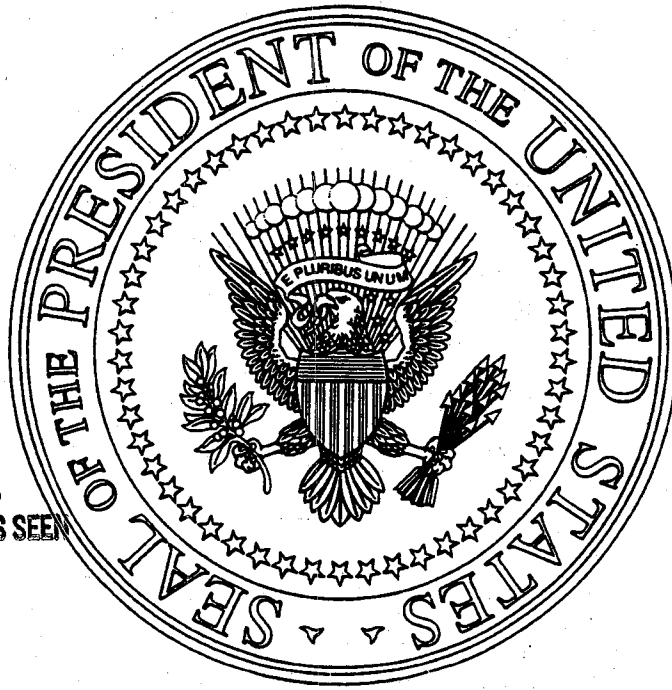
