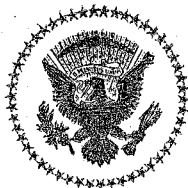

Now that the mock mark-up has occurred, the formal process of moving a bill through the Senate shifts into high gear. Once legislative language is sent to the Hill, the clock starts ticking on an expedited time frame for consideration of the legislation.
