II. BACKGROUND

Women's National Basketball Association

In 1996, the Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) was created as a counterpart to the National Basketball Association (NBA). Eight teams were announced for the league's inaugural season. Since its inaugural season, the WNBA has expanded to 16 teams. Outside of athletics, the WNBA is also active in the community, focusing on three primary outreach initiatives: Read to Achieve, Jr. NBA and Jr. WNBA, and the Sears WNBA Breast Health Awareness program.

Note: You met with the WNBA Champions Houston Comets in 2001, Detroit Shock in 2004, and Sacramento Monarchs in 2006.

The Phoenix Mercury

In the 2007 WNBA season, the Phoenix Mercury posted the best record in franchise history at 23-11. In Game 5, Phoenix won by a score of 108-92, winning their first championship and becoming the first WNBA team to win a championship on the road.

The Phoenix Mercury are committed to year-round community outreach initiatives, including launching the first-ever Adopt-a-Team program, which will provide an underserved local girls' basketball team with mentoring, character and life-building experiences, new uniforms, equipment, and season tickets for one year.
