I. PURPOSE

To meet at the Winston-Salem Center for Community Safety with 15 local community leaders who have heeded – and will continue to heed – your call to actively engage their communities in “Citizen Corps Councils.”

II. BACKGROUND

USA Freedom Corps and Citizen Corps Councils

In your State of the Union Address, you announced the creation of the new USA Freedom Corps. Your visit to Winston-Salem will allow you to highlight the USA Freedom Corps broadly, while specifically highlighting the Citizen Corps.

The Citizen Corps will provide Americans with opportunities to volunteer to participate in preparedness efforts in their communities. Community volunteers will be organized by Citizens Corps Councils, which will include leaders from key community sectors. These Councils will coordinate Citizen Corps programs at the local level. Winston-Salem is a national model for preparedness, and it currently has many of the key elements of its Citizens Corps Council in place.

The Citizen Corps program contains several key elements, including a Medical Reserve Corps, a Volunteers in Police Service Program, a doubling of Neighborhood Watch, a new Terrorist Information and Prevention System, and a tripling of Community Emergency Response Team members. The Winston-Salem community has local programs that mirror several of these new Citizen Corps initiatives.

The Winston-Salem State University Center for Community Safety

The Winston-Salem State University Center for Community Safety is a center for decision-making on violence prevention that draws upon community partners addressing significant local public safety issues in Winston-Salem and Forsyth County. The Center builds on the successful partnerships through the Strategic Approaches to Community

Safety Initiative (SACSI), started by the U.S. Department of Justice in Winston- Salem and four other cities in 1998. The Center is also a major outreach arm of Winston-Salem State University, bringing the resources of faculty and students together, and it is envisioned as a permanent vehicle through which the community can come together to solve significant public safety problems.

The Center leverages local, state and national funding and to incubate and sustain strategic projects on a variety of community-wide issues. Examples of this are the SACSI analysis that led to the Safe Schools/Healthy Students grant of \$6 million, and a grant from the Police Foundation to develop crime-mapping software that will help schools and communities across the country analyze safety issues around school zones.

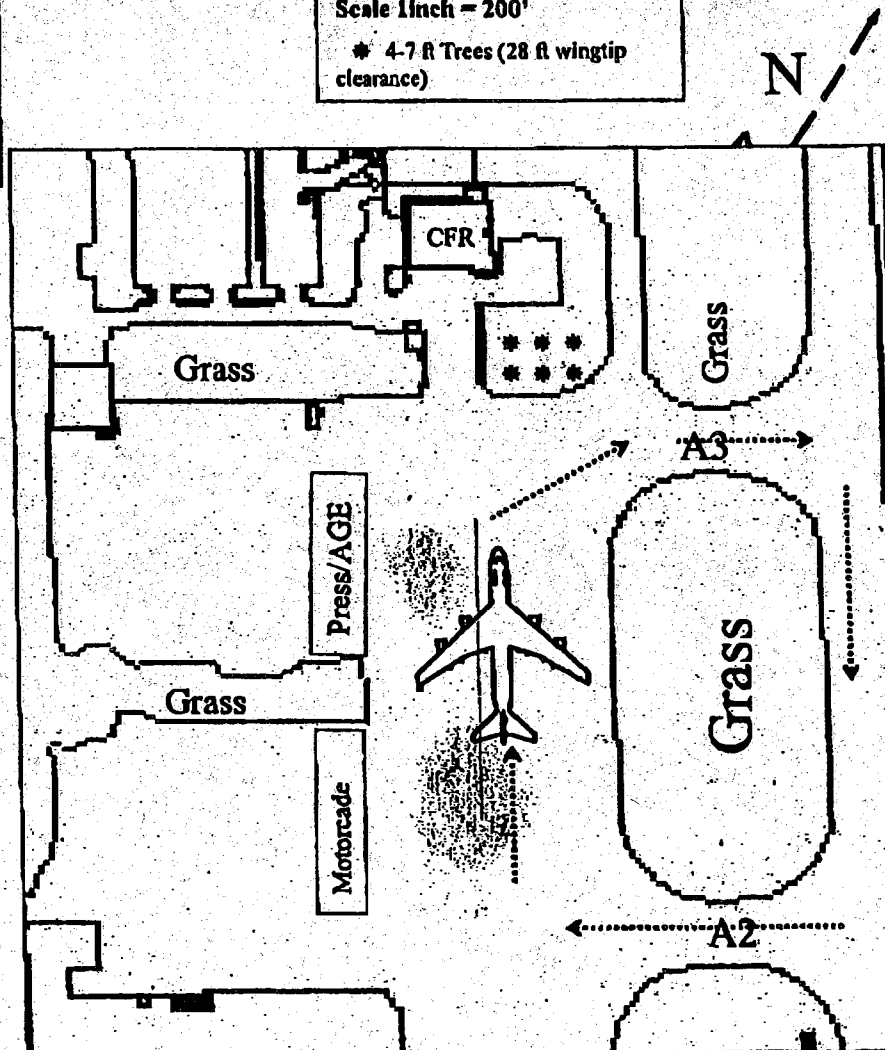

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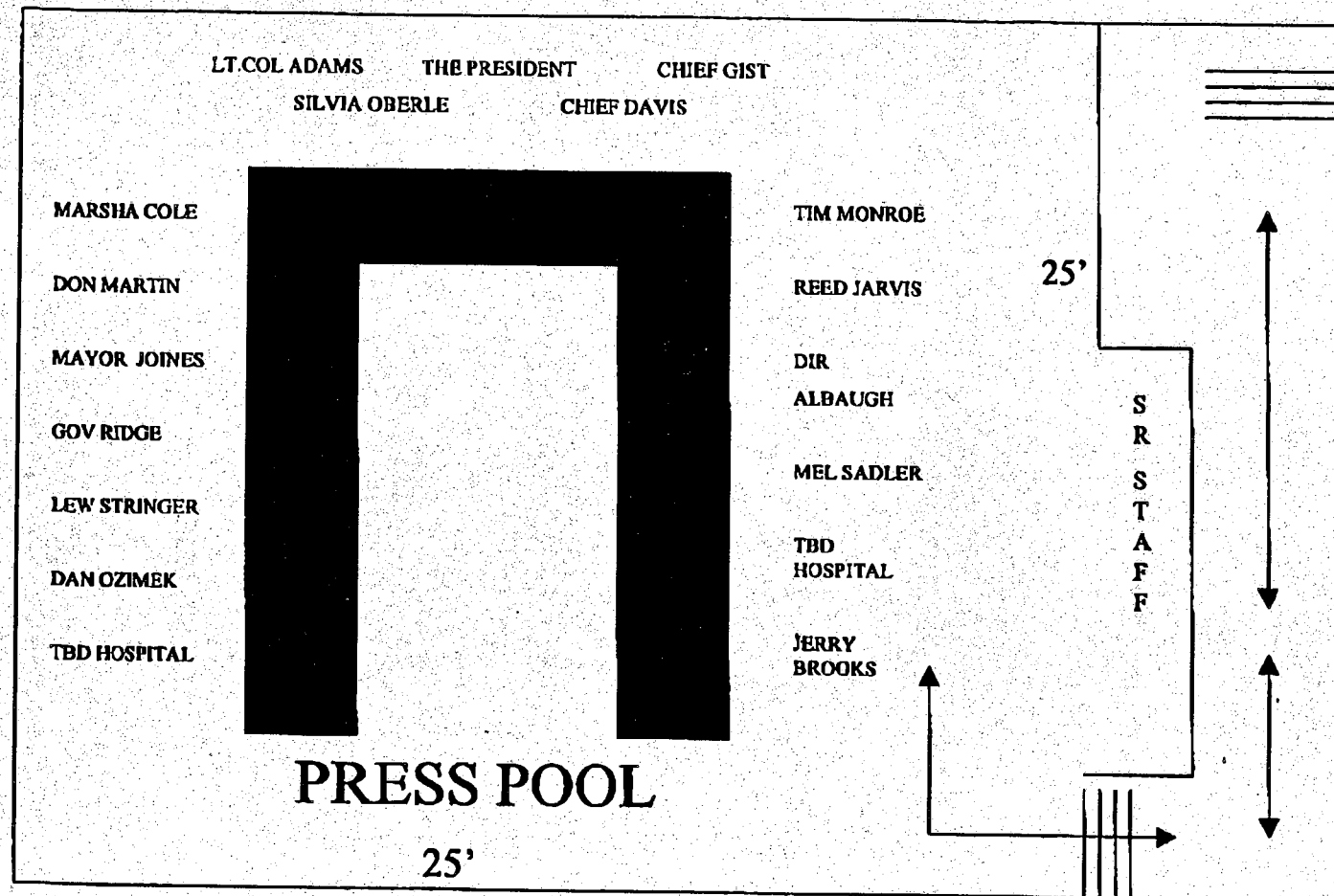

The Center for Community Safety is a community-based center for decision-making on violence prevention, using new approaches, and drawing upon new partners, in addressing significant local public safety issues in Winston-Salem and Forsyth County. The Center builds on the successful partnerships through the Strategic Approaches to

Community Safety Initiative (SACSI), started by the U.S. Department of Justice in Winston- Salem and four other cities in 1998. The Center is also a major outreach arm of Winston-Salem State University, bringing the resources of faculty and students together, and it is envisioned as a permanent vehicle through which the community can come together to solve significant public safety problems.

The Center leverages local, state and national funding and to incubate and sustain strategic projects on a variety of community-wide issues. Examples of this are the SACSI analysis that led to the Safe Schools/Healthy Students grant of \$6 million, and a grant from the Police Foundation to develop crime-mapping software that will help schools and communities across the country analyze safety issues around school zones.
