Shaila Dúrcal

Spanish vocalist Shaila Dúrcal is the daughter of well-known figures in Spanish music, Rocío Dúrcal and Antonio Morales, better known as "Júnior." She grew up listening to a wide variety of music and at an early age showed her talent and interest in singing. After her television debut at age 12, she studied voice in Madrid for several years. Then at her mother's side Shaila toured Latin America, the United States and Europe, learning her mother's repertoire and serving as one of her back-up singers. Shaila soon began performing as a solo artist, relocated to Mexico, and began working on her debut release *Recordando*. This album, dedicated to her mother, is a reworking of her father's popular repertoire and was released in February 2007.

Campanas de America

Campanas de America (Bells of America), founded in 1978 in San Antonio, Texas, uses a variety of instruments and combines traditional Mexican mariachi music with Latin and mainstream pop rhythms. This talented ensemble has entertained people around the world, earning national and international recognition along the way. One of Campanas' main focuses is promoting the importance of mariachi education programs in public schools. Several Campanas members are instructors of musical programs at schools in San Antonio. The group provides mariachi workshops, performs concerts in schools, and participates in "Grammy in the Schools," a program through the National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences (NARAS). Campanas is under the musical direction of Juan Ortiz.
