## THE PHILADELPHIA BOYS CHOIR & CHORALE

The 2000–2001 concert season marks the 32<sup>nd</sup> anniversary year of the Philadelphia Boys Choir and Chorale under the leadership of Dr. Robert Hamilton. Founder and Artistic Director, Dr. Hamilton and his Ambassadors of Song have continued to break through the most rigid, social, political and cultural barriers with their unique message of song, establishing the Philadelphia Boys Choir and Chorale as one of the world's premier organizations of its kind.

The Choir typically has over 40 performances each concert season. The Choir has performed premiers of works under the batons of Maestros Ormandy, Muti, Mehta, Tennstedt and Sawallisch in concert with the Philadelphia Orchestra. A seasonal favorite, "The Nutcracker", is performed annually by the Choir, hosted by the Pennsylvania Ballet. The Choir performs with the Opera Company of Philadelphia, and has won an Emmy for the award winning telecast production of "La Boheme" with Luciano Pavarotti.

Internationally, the Choir has maintained an unprecedented role as cultural ambassadors for the City of Philadelphia, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the Nation, providing foreign hosts with a fresh new approach to the image of American youth and appreciation for new American music. Its message has been heard at the White House by the President of Mexico, the late Anwar Sadat, Prince Rainier of Monaco, his Holiness Pope John Paul II at the Vatican, Emperor Akihito, the Royal Families of Sweden, Denmark, England, Thailand, and in over 40 countries around the world, including Australia, the People's Republic of China, the new democracies of Central Europe, Greece, Ghana, Kenya, Russia, South Africa and Switzerland. In 2000 the Choir was a featured performer at the Republican National Convention and toured Germany and Russia as well. In April 2001 the Choir traveled to Philadelphia's Sister Cities, Tianjin, China and Incheon, Korea.
