"THE PRESIDENT'S OWN" UNITED STATES MARINE BAND

Established by an Act of Congress in 1798, "The President's Own" United States Marine Band is America's oldest professional musical organization. Its primary mission is unique—to provide music for the President of the United States and the Commandant of the Marine Corps. The Marine Band's omnipresent role in events of national importance has made it part of the fabric of American life. This year, the band celebrates 200 years of performances at the White House. President John Adams invited the band to make its White House debut in the unfinished Executive Mansion on New Year's Day 1801. Thomas Jefferson, recognizing the unique relationship between the band and the Chief Executive, named the band "The President's Own." Marine Band musicians perform at the White House more than 300 times a year. Whether in White House performances, public concerts, or national tours, the music of the Marine Band is the music of America.

GERALD MCRANEY

Gerald McRaney is an accomplished actor whose career spans more than three decades. His professional honors include a 1999 International Gold Angel-Lifetime Achievement Award and a 1999 PRISM Award—the latter for recognition of his on-screen efforts of depicting the ills of substance abuse on the CBS television series, "Promised Land." McRaney is best known for his starring role in "Simon and Simon" on CBS, and later "Major Dad" and "Promised Land" all on CBS. Most recently, McRaney guest-starred as Sergeant Major Krohn in a two-part segment of the CBS series "JAG."

LARRY GATLIN

Larry Gatlin is a seasoned country and gospel-inspired singer and songwriter, who has garnered numerous music awards during his more than 30-year career, for such well-known hits as the Grammy Award-winning "Broken Lady," "Houston (Means I'm One Day Closer To You)," and "All the Gold In California." Raised in Texas, he and his brothers formed "The Gatlin Brothers" band and recorded several #1 songs in the late 1970s. Since then, Gatlin has performed in the Tony Award-winning musical "The Will Rogers Follies," and roles in his own musicals, "Alive and Well" and "Texas Flyer."

NELL CARTER

Nell Carter's multi-talented career encompasses theater, television, movies and recordings. She is best known for her Tony Award-winning performance in the Fats Waller musical, "Ain't Misbehavin'" and the NBC series "Gimme A Break," which earned her two Emmy Award nominations. Carter is currently in "South Pacific" with the Pittsburgh CLO. This fall she will be seen in a recurring role in "Reba," the new Reba McEntire comedy series for the WB Network.

TOBY KEITH

Since the 1993 release of his self-titled debut album, singer-songwriter Toby Keith has rapidly climbed the music charts and is known among fans for his "roughneck" style. He has released new albums almost every year, and in 2000, Keith was named 'Top Male Vocalist' and received the 'Album of the Year' award for *How Do You Like Me Now?!* from the Academy of Country Music. With 16 'Top 10' hits, and all gold and platinum albums under his cowboy belt, Keith is currently preparing to release his next album, *Pull My Chain*, on August 28, 2001.
