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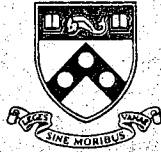

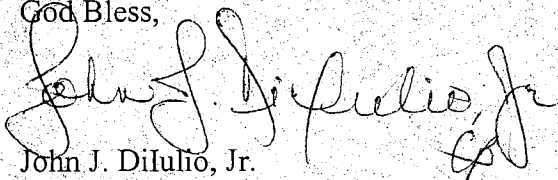

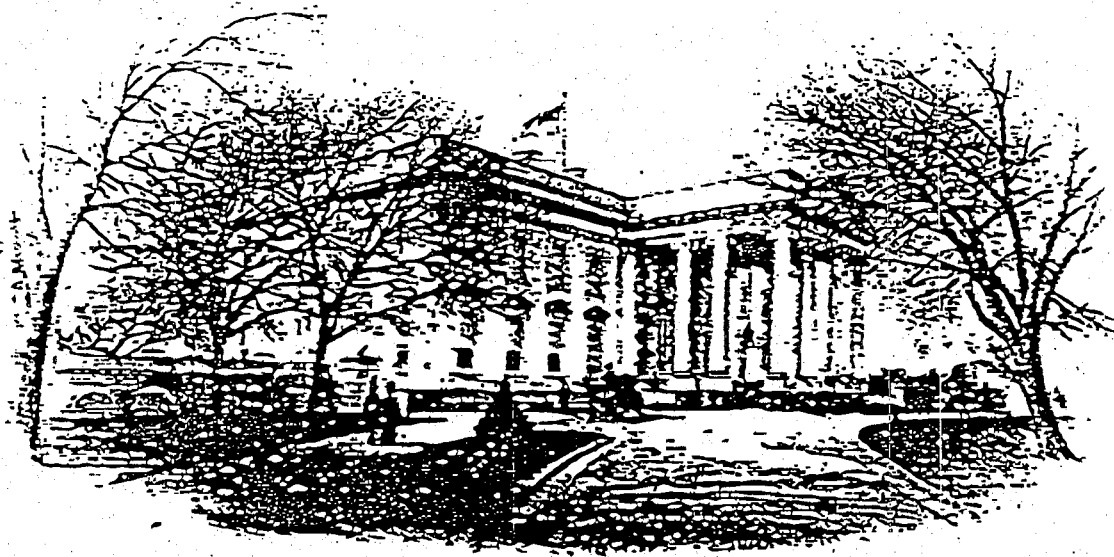

A Petition from American Hindus to President Bush

Subject: Why do you exclude Hindus from your prayers?

Dear Mr. President,

On Sunday, during the prayer for the victims of the horrific terrorist attacks, you included Christians, Jews, and Muslims. Many American Hindus lost their lives during these attacks. These citizens of Hindu faith were conspicuously omitted from your prayer services. Similarly, during your inauguration speech you urged Americans to "go to their churches, synagogues, and mosques to pray." We wondered back in January, and we wonder now, Why do you exclude Hindus from your prayers? Why didn't you ask a Pundit (Hindu priest) to join you, along with the Muslim cleric, the Priest, the Minister, and the Rabbi?

As our national leader, you have repeatedly urged respect for America's pluralistic and multi-cultural traditions. Yet, you have repeatedly excluded Hindu-Americans from your prayers and recognition. There are over 800 Hindu temples in North America, including every major city. All of them had organized prayers to mourn the loss of all those who perished or suffered in the World Trade Center and Pentagon attacks and plane crashes.

Hindus are very much a part of our nation. We are hard working people who contribute to the American society, economy, education and quality of life, in a proportion much larger to our numbers. Hindus are highly visible in this country: in schools, colleges, universities and research institutions; hospitals and healthcare industry; computer, info-tech and telecom industries; banks, law, accounting and investment firms; hotels, motels and restaurants; small businesses, ...and many other walks of life. And yet, we are omitted from your prayers. Our temples of worship are excluded from your references to the religious traditions practiced in this country. Such conspicuous exclusions can easily be interpreted as a hidden code by the forces of bigotry and extremism. It is unfortunate that some tele-evangelists who thrive on defaming our all-inclusive Hindu faith in their TV and radio broadcasts, have already started their "sly evokings" (as William Safire puts it) by blaming the 'pagans' as the cause of these terrorist acts. Please, Mr. President, there must be a Hindu Pundit beside a Protestant minister, a Catholic priest, a Rabbi and a Muslim cleric, when Americans are asked to pray for peace.

Mr. President, Hindus are a peace-loving people. We never threaten violence against our host country. There is no world-wide Hindu network of terrorists. There are almost a billion Hindus living on Earth. They practice the world's oldest religion (over 8,000 years old.) Non-violence, pluralism, and respect (not just tolerance) of other traditions of worship to the One Almighty God, are integral parts of its basic tenets. We are family oriented people, with very low divorce rates. We are frugal, save for our children's education, and support our elders and extended families. Because of these beliefs, Hindu-Americans are called ideal citizens. American Hindus are highly educated and skilled people, striving to make the US a better place to live for everyone. We deserve inclusion in your public prayers for the nation.

In the aftermath of the heinous terrorist attacks, Hindu-Americans and Hindu places of worship have become the target of xenophobic rage in some parts of North America. This is because many Americans do not know the difference between Hinduism and Islam; they lump them together as foreign religions. Your help in bringing the recognition to Hindus as a peace-loving people who are an integral part of our society, would go a long way in educating Americans about Hinduism. Please help Americans understand these issues by including Hindus in the fold of the President's well wishes and prayers.

In the U.S.A., there are two million people who identify themselves as Hindus, and another 20 million who practice Hindu traditions such as Yoga and Meditation. Lawmakers and officials in Washington do include Hindus when they pray. We urge you to henceforth include Hindus when you list the religiously pluralistic traditions of our country and include Hindu Temples to your list of places of worship in our great nation. God bless America!

If you donated online to the American Red Cross, the Tribute to Heroes telethon, or other organizations, have you received an e-mail thank-you or a follow-up message?

We gave to the telethon. Our donation was processed Oct. 18, but our first and only response of a thank-you e-mail arrived Dec. 7 - almost two months later! The telethon site (www.tributetoheroes.org) contains no information on how much the campaign raised or where it went, nor was there a link to <http://www.september11fund.org>, the detailed United Way of NYC. Our Red Cross donation did not prompt any messages from them, so we wonder whether the donation was even processed. We hope we re

among a few people who fell through the cracks. What was your experience?

Online donors should be relatively easy and inexpensive to communicate with, but the big groups don't seem to be making it happen - yet. While both established and ad-hoc charities were obviously overwhelmed in the first few weeks after 9/11, why has it taken some of them so long to thank the 1 or 2 million people who gave online? They're missing a key opportunity to thank and then cultivate these new donors for additional gifts. They may also be playing into the unprecedented criticism of charities, some of it accurate and some wrong-headed and bombastic. (We appeared on Fox TV's O'Reilly Factor, but the host is more interested in attacking than listening.)

If you gave online, please forward to us any e-mail acknowledgements and follow-up e-newsletters you've received from organizations raising money in relation to 9/11. We'll report back in the next Donordigital News. Send to: <mailto:911@donordigital.com>

ADMINISTRATIVE ALERT

Thrift Savings Plan Open Season -- November 15, 2001 through January 31 2002

The Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) is a retirement savings and investment plan, similar to a 401k, for Federal Employees. Contributions are voluntary and separate from the mandatory contributions to the Civil Service Retirement System (CSRS), the CSRS Offset, and the Federal Employees Retirement System (FERS).

During open season, employees covered by FERS may elect to contribute to the TSP up to 12% of the basic pay they earn each pay period; employees covered by CSRS may elect to contribute up to 7% of the basic pay they earn each pay period. The maximum contribution for 2002 is increased to \$11,000 from \$10,500 in 2001.

To begin contributing to TSP or to change the amount of current contribution, complete the Form TSP-1, Election Form, and send it to the Office of Administration, Human Resources Management Division, Room 4013 NEOB prior to January 31, 2002. If your election is received before January 12, 2002, it will become effective January 13, 2002. Your earnings and leave statement dated February 1, 2002 will reflect this election. If your election is received after January 12, 2002, it will become effective at the beginning of the first full pay period after receipt.

To allocate your contributions among the five investment funds, use the TSP Web site at www.tsp.gov, call the ThriftLine at 504-255-8777, or submit Form TSP-50, Investment Allocation, (available in OA/HRM, Room 4013 NEOB, agency administrative offices and Room 54 EEOB) to the TSP record keeper at the address on that form.

NOTE: If you are a new TSP participant, all contributions to your account will be invested

in the Government Securities Investment (G) Fund until you change your allocation directly with the TSP Service Office. You will receive in the mail a New Account Letter, which confirms that your account has been established and you are issued a TSP Personal Identification Number (PIN). Do not submit an allocation change until you have received this notice.

You can receive additional information by attending one of the briefings scheduled during the open season.

Dear Mitchell,

Thanks for inviting me to the prayer service at the National Cathedral. It was really a very moving experience. I keep President Bush and the whole White House staff in my prayers.

I want to inform you of severe problems the entire Sikh community is facing in wake of this terrible tragedy.

There have been over 40 cases of harassment and violence against the Sikh community. Sikh males wear turban and beard as part of their commitment to their faith. Most Muslims do not wear turbans in this country and almost all Sikhs do. So Sikhs are being seen as related to the perpetrators of this heinous crime or they are being seen as Arabs or from Middle East because of their outer appearance. This also resembles the picture of Osama bin Laden wearing white turban and beard. Sikhs stand out in the crowd and are becoming easy target by many ignorant individuals.

Many Sikhs have had garbage thrown or eggs thrown at them. Some had guns shown to them. Some have been shoved and pushed. Verbal attacks and abuse is increasing at a fast pace. An attempt was made to put a Sikh Gurdwara (Sikh place of worship) on fire in Cleveland, Ohio and a Sikh Gurdwara in West Sacramento has been vandalized.

Many religious workers who are fluent in English are holed up in Sikh centers and are not venturing out due to the fear of attacks.

A Sikh home was hit with graffiti in Colorado and in Centerville, Virginia. I have had people reporting many Sikhs taking off the expression of their faith under duress and fear.

So as you can see this is a very critical and specific problem faced by Sikhs due to their appearance.

Some thing needs to be done immediately. The lives of 500,000 Sikhs are in great danger.

Although President Bush and Attorney General has mentioned that Arab Americans or Asians or Indian should not be made target. But many in my community feel the Sikh problem is bit unique from other cases. So this needs to be tackled from a different angle. This does not mean that we do not feel the problems faced by Arab Americans or Muslims is any way less than ours. We pray for their safety as well.

I wish to propose that if we can meet with officials at the White House to apprise them of the situation. This meeting will send an important signal to our community that President Bush is sensitive to their plight and secondly it will create more understanding in the general public. And this needs to happen very soon. Secondly if we can also have Department of Justice folks meet with us.

Your help in these steps would be highly appreciated. I cannot overemphasize the urgency of the matter.

I will continue to pray for you and your family. You do so much hard work for the faith communities. God Bless you.

HERO GUESTS

Officer William Fischer, New York Police Department (Seat A-14)

Fischer, a 16-year NYPD veteran and a member of the elite Emergency Service Unit, was off-duty at the time of the attack. He immediately jumped in his car and responded to the scene, spending the next 17 hours working with fellow Emergency Service Unit officers and firemen trying to free victims from the rubble. He has been working at the scene every day since. 14 of the missing 23 NYPD officers are assigned to the Emergency Service Unit, and Officer Fischer has worked with and knows each one.

Battalion Chief John A. Jonas, Fire Department of New York (Seat A-12)

Battalion Chief Jonas, a 21-year veteran of the FDNY, captained Ladder Company 6 last Tuesday, among the first units to respond to the World Trade Center attack. Jonas and his men bravely helped evacuate hundreds of people from the North Tower. After the collapse, they were trapped in debris for more than three hours before escaping. Jonas has been cited for bravery five times during his career.

Officer Pdraig Carroll (pronounced "Patrig"), Port Authority Police (Seat B-2)

Officer Carroll, an 8-year Port Authority veteran, was stationed at World Trade Center 5 the day of the attack. He rushed to the scene to begin rescue operations and has been there everyday since. Officer Carroll's wife is expecting their first child early next year.

Petty Officer Cean Whitmarsh (pronounced "Shawn"), US Navy (Seat B-14)

Petty Officer Whitmarsh, 22, put out a fire on a Navy Lieutenant by using his own shirt, then pulled 10-42 people out of the wreckage. He then commandeered a motorized vehicle in the building to continue evacuating the injured for the next four hours. Whitmarsh is from Irving, Texas.

Specialist Terry Clausen (Specialist 4th Class), US Army (Seat C-8)

Specialist Clausen, a medic assigned to the Headquarters Company of the Old Guard at Ft. Myer, was on leave on September 11th at his off-post residence when he heard the plane hit the Pentagon. He grabbed his medic bag, ran to the Pentagon and immediately began treating the wounded. He called his platoon sergeant to alert the entire medic platoon and also briefed him on the situation. He treated at least 11 of the

injured. Clausen only claimed 11 on his sworn affidavit because, in his words, "I filled out the treatment records for 11 individuals." He treated more than 11. A "quiet hero."

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The President's Address to Congress

- America is a country awakened to danger and called to defend freedom. Our grief has turned to anger, and anger to resolution. **Whether we bring our enemies to justice, or bring justice to our enemies, justice will be done.**
- The President thanks Congress for its patriotic spirit of bipartisanship and efforts to deliver \$40 billion in relief to help rebuild America's communities and meet the needs of our military. The President also is grateful to many world leaders and nations who have joined the war against terrorism.
- On September 11 enemies of freedom committed an act of war against our country. Americans have known wars – but for the past 136 years, they have been wars on foreign soil, except for one Sunday in 1941.

Who attacked our country?

- The evidence we have gathered all points to a collection of loosely affiliated terrorist organizations known as al-Qaida. They are the same murderers indicted for bombing American embassies in Tanzania and Kenya, and responsible for the bombing of the *U.S.S. Cole*. **Al-Qaida is to terror what the mafia is to crime.** The leadership of al-Qaida has great influence in Afghanistan, and supports the Taliban regime in controlling most of that country.
- **The United States respects the people of Afghanistan but we condemn the Taliban regime.** By aiding and abetting murder, the Taliban regime is committing murder. **The United States of America makes the following demands on the Taliban:**
 - ✓ Deliver to United States authorities all the leaders of al-Qaida who hide in your land.
 - ✓ Release all foreign nationals – including American citizens – you have unjustly imprisoned, and protect foreign journalists, diplomats, and aid workers in your country.
 - ✓ Close immediately and permanently every terrorist training camp in Afghanistan and hand over every terrorist, and every person in their support structure, to appropriate authorities.
 - ✓ Give the United States full access to terrorist training camps, so we can make sure they are no longer operating.
- **These demands are not open to negotiation or discussion. The Taliban must act and act immediately. They will hand over the terrorists, or they will share in their fate.**
- Our war on terror begins with al-Qaida, but it does not end there. It will not end until every terrorist group of global reach has been found, stopped, and defeated.
- The President wants Muslims throughout the world to know that America respects their faith. It is practiced freely by many millions of Americans, and by millions more in countries that America counts as friends. Its teachings are good and peaceful, and those who commit evil in the name of Allah blaspheme the name of Allah.
- **These terrorists kill not merely to end lives, but to disrupt and end a way of life.** By sacrificing human life to serve their radical visions – by abandoning every value except the will to power – they follow in the path of fascism, and Nazism, and totalitarianism. **And they will follow that path all the way, to where it ends: in history's unmarked grave of discarded lies.**

How Will America Win this war?

- We will direct every resource at our command – every means of diplomacy, every tool of intelligence, every instrument of law enforcement, every financial influence, and every necessary weapon of war – to the disruption and defeat of the global terror network.
- This war will not be like the war against Iraq a decade ago, with its decisive liberation of territory and its swift conclusion. It will not look like the air war above Kosovo two years ago, where no ground troops were used and not a single American was lost in combat. Americans should not expect one battle, but a lengthy campaign, unlike any other we have seen.
- We will pursue nations that provide aid or safe haven to terrorism. Every nation, in every region, now has a decision to make. From this day forward, any nation that continues to harbor or support terrorism will be regarded by the United States as a hostile regime.
- The President will create a Cabinet-level Office of Homeland Security. This office will oversee a national strategy to safeguard our country against terrorism, and respond to any attacks that may come.

What the President is asking from Americans:

- Uphold the values of America, and remember why so many have come here. We are in a fight for our principles, and our first responsibility is to live by them. No one should be singled out for unfair treatment or unkind words because of their ethnic background or religious faith.
- Continue to support the victims of this tragedy with your contributions. Those who want to give can go to a central source of information, libertyunites.org, to find the names of groups providing direct help in New York, Pennsylvania, and Virginia.
- Continue to be patient and have confidence in the American economy.

The President will work with Congress to:

- Improve air safety, to dramatically expand the number of air marshals on domestic flights, and take new measures to prevent hijacking. We will come together to promote stability and keep our airlines flying with direct assistance during this emergency.
- Give law enforcement the additional tools it needs to track down terror here at home. We will come together to strengthen our intelligence capabilities to know the plans of terrorists before they act, and find them before they strike.
- Show the world that we will rebuild New York City.

POTUS remarks to employees at the Department of the Treasury's Financial Crimes Enforcement Network (FINCEN) in Tysons Corner, Va.

News from the event: POTUS announces the United States has moved to block the assets of 62 people and groups associated with two financial networks linked to Osama bin Laden's terrorist network ? Al Barakaat and Al Taqwa.

Rest of pool report is color:

POTUS departs in motorcade at 1:03 p.m. The 22-minute ride was uneventful. Two small flags flapped from the front of the black limousine carrying POTUS, who was accompanied on the ride by OMB general counsel Jay Lefkowitz, deputy chief of staff Josh Bolton and deputy national security adviser Gary Edson.

POTUS pulled up at 1:25 p.m. to the six-story gray building where the Financial Crimes Enforcement Network is housed. FINCEN Director James F. Sloan escorted POTUS on a tour of the facility.

Secretary of State Colin L. Powell, Attorney General John D. Ashcroft and Treasury Secretary Paul H. O'Neill joined POTUS for the tour.

Your pool was led into a narrow room called the "Operations Center," which receives requests from law enforcement agencies for assistance on investigations of terrorism, money laundering and other criminal activity. The Operations Center also runs a hotline for banks to report suspicious activity. A FINCEN official said the center helped feed information to the Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control that led to the latest crackdown on suspected investors in the al Qaeda terror network.

The Operations Center was decorated with the seals of federal law enforcement agencies. A sign on the far wall showed an American flag with the words, "These Colors Won't Run!" Nine intelligence analysts with the network sat before computers in cubicles separated by a low partition, on which someone had placed a single American flag. A handful of additional FINCEN employees entered the room with POTUS.

Around 1:30 p.m., POTUS entered, wearing a blue suit, white shirt and orange patterned tie. POTUS visited for a few minutes, shaking hands and saying, "How are you?" and "Thank y'all." POTUS stood next to Sloan as the FINCEN director described the Operations Center's mission, saying: "We link from here to all of the financial institutions of the United States." Sloan added that the call center, which operates 24 hours a day, can "link in this room to all 50 states, to the law enforcement community in all 50 states and all of the federal agencies, so we try really to coordinate an effort."

POTUS replied: "Great."

POTUS stopped by the desk of (b)(3) a senior intelligence research specialist. "See you've got our most-wanted terrorist list up there," POTUS told her, looking at a print-out posted by her computer. "Yup, I do," she said.

50 USC 403(g)

"Got a big announcement today," POTUS told the group, while O'Neill, Powell, Ashcroft and Edson looked on from the back of the room. The Cabinet members did not speak.

Sloan led POTUS to a chart posted on a wall showing links between financial networks and suspects in the Sept. 11 attacks. POTUS took out his glasses and studied the chart for a moment.

As he left the room, POTUS called out to the group, "Thank you, all. Thank you. Go get 'em!"

INSIDE THE CONFERENCE ROOM FOR BUSH'S REMARKS ON FREEZING TERRORIST ASSETS:

POTUS and his guests continued on a private tour while your pool was led into a gray-walled conference room, where about 70 FINCEN employees were sitting at wooden tables. On one wall hung a map of the world marked with the locations of other government agencies investigating financial crimes around the world. Outside the room, a sign read, "Welcome! Mr. President."

At 1:50 p.m., POTUS entered, standing in front of 11 flags ? including three American flags ? and speaking for approximately eight minutes about the administration's actions against the suspected terrorist cash outlets. (See transcript).

POTUS stood at a lectern with the presidential seal and read from notes, while a couple audience members took pictures. As POTUS delivered his remarks, Sloan and Ashcroft stood to his right. To the left of POTUS stood O'Neill, Powell and Richard Newcomb, director of the Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control. After POTUS finished speaking, he stood next to the lectern with his hands folded in front of him, a stern expression on his face.

The audience applauded when POTUS concluded his remarks, and did the same for remarks by O'Neill, Powell and Ashcroft. O'Neill, who wore a gray pinstriped suit, a white shirt and a burgundy tie, spoke for approximately two minutes. Powell, dressed in a navy blue suit, light blue shirt and blue

tie, spoke for approximately four minutes. Ashcroft, dressed in a gray suit, blue shirt and red tie, spoke for approximately two minutes. POTUS and the three Cabinet members all wore American flag pins on their lapels.

When the event concluded at 2:06 p.m., POTUS shook hands with some people in the audience while your pool was led out of the room.

Motorcade departed at 2:13 p.m., for an uneventful, 20-minute ride back to the White House. After POTUS entered the White House, presidential dogs Spot and Barney were seen romping on the South Lawn grass. Barney bit the furry cover of a sound technician's fish-pole microphone at least twice.

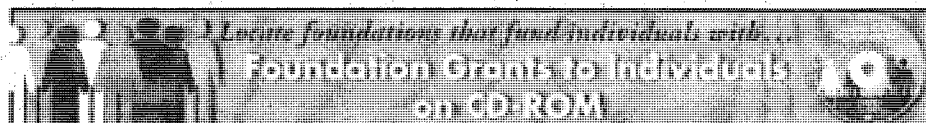

voluntary work, the biggest influence was family and friends. Their influence is more powerful than clubs, the media or the charities themselves.

Among children, family and friends remain important, but the most powerful influence is the school. 50% of those children who do voluntary work first became involved through the school. The church introduced 14% of both adults and child volunteers to their first involvement.

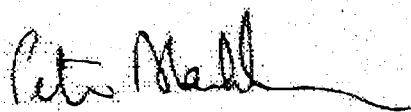
Introduction

This latest issue of the Nestlé Family Monitor is devoted to 'Charitable Giving and Volunteering'. The two topics have, of course, been well-researched already but, with our colleagues at MORI, we have tried to bring forward some fresh perspectives looking, in particular, at the role that family dynamics play in the decisions to give to charity or to volunteer.

There is, too, a topicality to this report. As we approach Christmas, thoughts naturally turn to the concept of helping others and I must draw your attention to one of the findings of this study — the proportion of adults in Britain who give of their money and time to charity.

The other significant development, in relation to this issue of the Nestlé Family Monitor, is the launch recently by Treasury Minister Stephen Timms of a new campaign, backed by £1 million investment, to boost charitable giving. The campaign is being led jointly by the National Council for Voluntary Organisations and the Charities Aid Foundation.

I am sure you will all join me in wishing the campaign every success. Judging from the findings of this research, the initiative will fall on fertile ground.

Who Gives to Charity?

As women aged over 34 are more likely than the average citizen to give money to charity. Similarly, volunteers are not only more likely to donate money to charity than the average member of the British public, but they also donate more.

Findings indicate that the profile of the charitable giver is of a woman, aged over the age of 34, in social class AB. This person is more likely to give on a regular basis and to give in a number of different ways. The likelihood of charitable giving increases further if the woman is married and retired.

Similarly, those who themselves regularly conduct voluntary work, are more likely to donate money to charity – almost all (97%) respondents who claim to have volunteered during the past twelve months have contributed money to charity compared to nine in ten (90%) of those who have not done any voluntary work.

The vast majority of those who have donated money to charity say they have donated less than £100 over the last year. Nevertheless, the presence of a number of substantial donors (2% say they have donated £1,000 or more) draws the overall average up to £165. Those with more money to spare donate the most – ABs on average donate £366 and C1s £176. This compares with a DE average of around £46. It should be borne in mind though that the public tends to over-estimate the amount they have donated when asked questions such as this.

Not only are volunteers more likely to give money to charity, but they give more – the average volunteer donated over £250 to charity over the past year, compared to an average donation of under £90 for those who do not volunteer.

Methods of Charitable Giving

The vast majority of the British public have contributed financially to a charity in the past twelve months. Donations have primarily taken the form of contributing to in-the-street and door-to-door collections.

The vast majority of adults say they have supported a charity financially in some way over the last 12 months (92%). Furthermore, two-thirds have undertaken at least three types of charitable donation (67%). A separate multi-country study conducted in 1996/1997 by MORI on behalf of UNFPA found that the British public are more likely to donate money to charity than their European counterparts. Four in five (80%) people living in Great Britain said specifically that they had made a donation to charity over the last 2-3 years. This compares to a European average of 59%. It is also interesting to note the perception of giving in Britain compared to Europe, which is shown on page 14.

The support shown in the current study mostly took the form of in-the-street donations, door-to-door collections, sponsorship and envelope collections. Purchases from charity shops, charity catalogues and of the 'Big Issue' also play an important role.

Although considerably fewer than these top answers, substantial minorities have committed themselves deeply to charitable giving. Around one in five have undertaken to give money on a regular basis and a similar proportion have been a paid up member of a charity (this may have started longer than a year ago). One in twenty have pledged money in their will (even if longer than a year ago) and one in twenty-five have taken part in a 'Give As You Earn Scheme'.

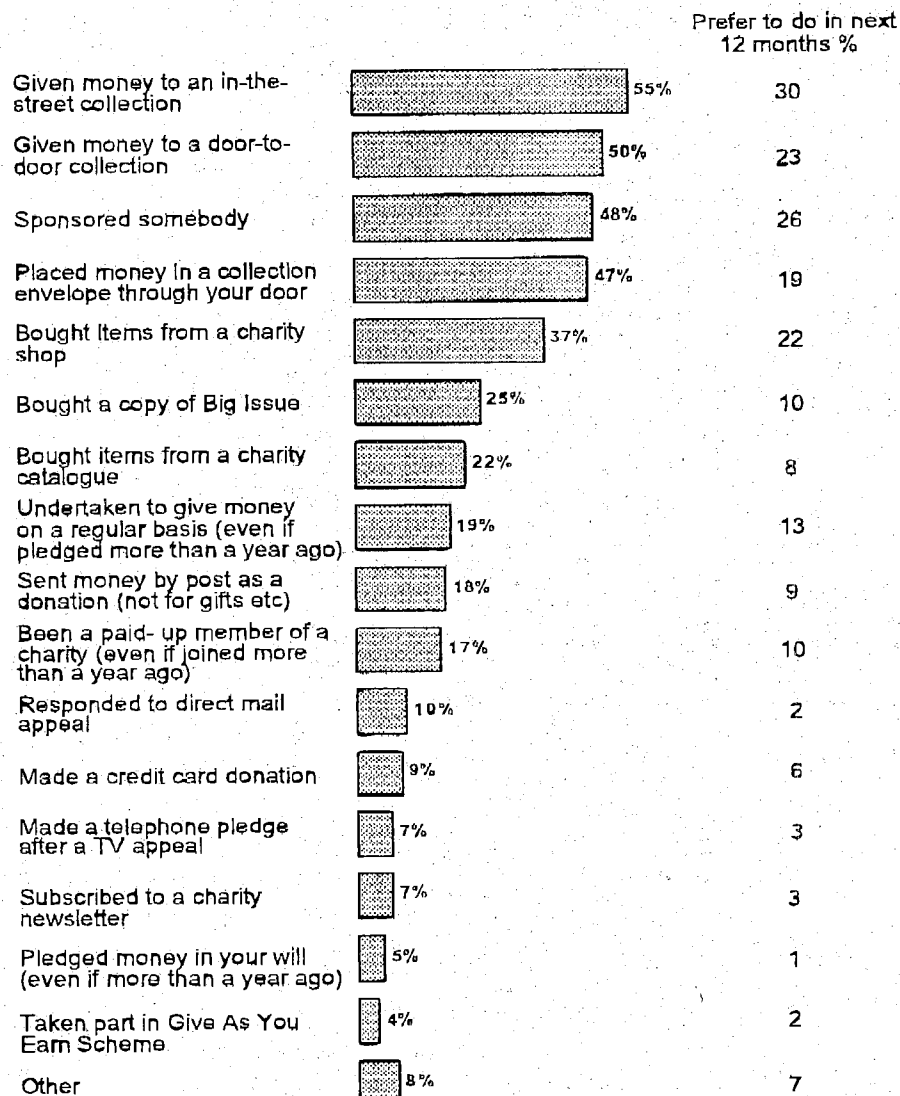
The most popular means of supporting charity in the next 12 months are giving to in-the-street collections, sponsorship, door-to-door collections, purchases from a charity shop and placing money in collection envelopes.

Around one in ten express a preference for two of the more committed forms of giving: 13% would prefer to undertake to give money on a regular basis and 10% would prefer to be a paid-up member of a charity. Again, age, social class and gender are important variables.

Types of Charity Selected

Children's charities and medical research charities are by far the most popular types of charity for charitable giving. This is an encouraging finding for these types of charity given that the average British citizen gave £165 to charity over the previous year.

By some margin, the two most popular types of charity are those for children and medical research – reflecting a long-standing trend in MORI's charity research. Parents are significantly more likely to support both types of charity (72% versus 47% of those without children, and 59% versus 49% respectively). Also relatively well supported are animal charities, homeless people's charities, medical care and old people's charities. Women are strong supporters of animal charities (36% versus 26% men). They are also more likely to support medical care charities than are men (30% versus 22%). Homeless people's charities are well supported by younger people (36% of 16-24 year olds versus 18% of the over 55s), while the over 55s are more likely to support old people's charities (28% of over 55s compared with 14% of 16-24 year olds).

Relatively fewer have donated to public service charities (eg St John's Ambulance), social welfare charities (eg Meals on Wheels) and organisations preserving Britain's heritage (eg National Trust)¹.

The pattern is very similar for preferred future donations – with most pledging support for children's and medical research charities. Animal charities and medical care would also be well supported by future donations.

- The terrorists never expected that America would emerge stronger, with a renewed spirit of pride and patriotism. Americans have responded with courage and caring.
- This new enemy seeks to destroy freedom and impose its views. We value life, the terrorists wantonly destroy it. We value education – the terrorists do not believe women should be educated, or should have health care, or should leave their homes. We value the right to speak our minds – for the terrorists, free expression can be grounds for execution. Facts of the Day

- During the past two days, USAID flights have delivered 22,000 wool blankets to Turkmenistan from Pisa, Italy. Those blankets will be distributed throughout northern Afghanistan.
- On November 6 and 7, USAID shipped more than 6,000 cases of BP-5 High Energy Biscuits to Turkmenistan to be distributed to the people of northern Afghanistan.
- This week, USAID will ship more than \$750,000 in aid to Turkmenistan for distribution in northern Afghanistan. That money is in addition to the \$320 million in aid announced by President Bush.
