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Winston Salem Warthogs vs. Frederick Keys

July 27, 2001

- The Frederick Keys are a high Single-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles.
- The Keys came into existence in 1989 and played their first year at Harry Grove Stadium in 1990.
- M.J. Grove donated money to the city in order to build the stadium and honored his father by naming the stadium after him.
- President George H.W. Bush visited Harry Grove Stadium on two occasions (6/8/91 & 8/14/92).
- Comcast-Spectacor (www.comcast-spectacor.com) is the Philadelphia based sports and entertainment firm which owns the Frederick Keys, along with the Philadelphia Flyers, the Philadelphia 76ers, the Philadelphia Phantoms, the Delmarva Shorebirds, the Bowie Baysox, the First Union Center, The First Union Spectrum, Flyers Skate Zone and Comcast SportsNet. Comcast-Spectacor is also the principal owner of Global Spectrum, a firm engaged in managing public assembly facilities and events worldwide.
- The Winston-Salem Warthogs are a high Single-A affiliate of the Chicago White Sox.
- The Keys and Warthogs play in the Carolina League, a league of 8 teams with teams ranging from Wilmington, DE to Myrtle Beach, SC.
- The Carolina League was featured in the movie *Bull Durham* as the Durham Bulls once played in the CL.
- Peter Luukko is the president of Comcast-Spectacor Ventures. Peter oversees both of Comcast Spectacor's Philadelphia facilities – the First Union Center and First Union Spectrum, as well as the advertising and sales departments for the Philadelphia Flyers, the Philadelphia 76ers, the Philadelphia Phantoms (AHL), Comcast SportsNet, the Bowie Baysox, the Delmarva Shorebirds, and the Frederick Keys.
- Frank Miceli is the Vice President of Minor League Operations for Comcast-Spectacor. Frank oversees all day-to-day operations, including fiscal management, sales, and public relations of the Bowie Baysox, Delmarva Shorebirds, and the Philadelphia Phantoms.
- Joe Pinto is the general manager of the Keys. Joe came to the Keys in December 1996 and is serving his 2nd year as the Keys GM.

- The Keys are managed by former major leaguer Dave Cash. Cash played in the major leagues for 12 years, bating .283 while spending time with the Pirates, Phillies, Expos and Padres.
- The Warthogs are managed by former major leaguer Wally Backman. Backman played in the big leagues for 14 years with the Mets, Pirates, Phillies, and Mariners.
- The Carolina League season is 140 games, split into two halves. The Keys finished in second place in the First Half with a 36-34 record in the Northern Division. The Warthogs finished in fourth place in the First Half with a 24-36 record in the Southern Division.
- The Keys are very active in the community. In 1997, the Keys in partnership with local boards of education began the Keys For Reading program. Each participating student receives an official Keys for Reading bookmark at the onset of the program. Students are required to read four books and have their parents sign the bookmark to complete the program. Over 67,000 students at more than 125 schools in six counties in Maryland, Virginia, and West Virginia.
- Keyote is the official mascot of the Keys. Keyote travels all over the region visiting schools, hospitals, festivals, and other charitable events.
- On Wednesday, July 25, members of the Keys will take part in our annual Charilty Golf Classic to benefit Joel's Kids, which was established through the Community Foundation of Frederick County. Stephens was former Orioles prospect died of colon cancer at the age of 22 in September 1998.
- The Keys have various promotions throughout the season including 18 fireworks nights, Retro Night, Country Night, a pre-game cow milking contest, and Bark in the Park day.

I. PURPOSE

To celebrate the opening of the 2001 Major League Baseball Season and to honor Baseball Hall of Fame players.

You also will have a mention in your remarks announcing your intention to host T-Ball games on the South Lawn of the White House to help revitalize America's pastime and create future Hall of Famers.

II. BACKGROUND

Major League Baseball is enjoying its 133rd year and in celebration of our "National Pastime," approximately 47 Hall of Fame Baseball players accepted an invitation to lunch with you and the First Lady.

Kirby Puckett, Dave Winfield, Hilton Smith and Bill Mazeroski are the newest inductees into the Hall of Fame.

The event with the Baseball Hall of Famers is a two-tier event. First, an open press photo-op in the East Room followed by a luncheon in the State Dining Room.

Major League Baseball will document the Rose Garden photo-op and the beginning portion of the lunch for archival purposes. They will keep a low profile. Tucker Esckew will escort the camera to both events.

T-Ball is the entry sport to baseball for young players, generally four to eight years old. T-ball develops primary baseball skills of hitting, running, fielding and throwing and gives children solid teamwork experience. T-ball is played in every state and territory and in 40 countries around the world. Participation is estimated at 2.2 million players -- 65% boys and 35% girls.

The games that will be played in the White House will be coed. The Little League Association will select for participation already existing teams. Teams are scheduled to play next June 10-12 at Yankee Stadium in an interleague series. Now, the Diamondbacks get to see the Yankees sooner than expected.

New York Yankees

- ◆ New York was written off after losing first two games to Oakland, but won seven of eight against teams that combined for 218 wins in regular season.
- ◆ Became first team to win five-game series after losing Games 1 and 2 at home to Oakland, and ended Seattle's 116-win season 4-1 in the ALCS.
- ◆ Looking to become just third team to win four straight World Series titles, joining Yankees from 1949-53 and 1936-39.
- ◆ Weren't the best team during the regular season, but always play best in biggest situations. Lost 15 of 18 to end last season, but recovered to win third straight World Series.

Arizona Diamondbacks

- ◆ Reached World Series in fourth season, faster than any expansion team ever.
- ◆ Beat mark of 1997 Marlins, who made it in five years. The common link? Counsell, the only player on the team with a championship ring. He starred in Game 7 for Florida, then was MVP of NLCS for Arizona.
- ◆ Schilling tied for the major league lead in wins, then was even better in the postseason -- 3-0 with an 0.67 ERA and three complete games. Schilling beat St. Louis in deciding Game 5 of opening round, Johnson went 2-0 against Atlanta in NLCS and won clinching Game 5.
- ◆ Johnson could win his fourth Cy Young award. Led the majors in ERA and strikeouts.

I. PURPOSE

II. BACKGROUND

Winston Salem Warthogs vs. Frederick Keys -- July 27, 2001

- The Frederick Keys are a high Single-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles.
- The Keys came into existence in 1989 and played their first year at Harry Grove Stadium in 1990.
- M.J. Grove donated money to the city in order to build the stadium and honored his father by naming the stadium after him.
- President George H.W. Bush visited Harry Grove Stadium on two occasions (6/8/91 & 8/14/92).
- Comcast-Spectacor (www.comcast-spectacor.com) is the Philadelphia based sports and entertainment firm which owns the Frederick Keys, along with the Philadelphia Flyers, the Philadelphia 76ers, the Philadelphia Phantoms, the Delmarva Shorebirds, the Bowie Baysox, the First Union Center, The First Union Spectrum, Flyers Skate Zone and Comcast SportsNet. Comcast-Spectacor is also the principal owner of Global Spectrum, a firm engaged in managing public assembly facilities and events worldwide.
- The Winston-Salem Warthogs are a high Single-A affiliate of the Chicago White Sox.
- The Keys and Warthogs play in the Carolina League, a league of 8 teams with teams ranging from Wilmington, DE to Myrtle Beach, SC.
- The Carolina League was featured in the movie *Bull Durham* as the Durham Bulls once played in the CL.
- Peter Luukko is the president of Comcast-Spectacor Ventures. Peter oversees both of Comcast Spectacor's Philadelphia facilities – the First Union Center and First Union

Spectrum, as well as the advertising and sales departments for the Philadelphia Flyers, the Philadelphia 76ers, the Philadelphia Phantoms (AHL), Comcast SportsNet, the Bowie Baysox, the Delmarva Shorebirds, and the Frederick Keys.

- Frank Miceli is the Vice President of Minor League Operations for Comcast-Spectacor. Frank oversees all day-to-day operations, including fiscal management, sales, and public relations of the Bowie Baysox, Delmarva Shorebirds, and the Philadelphia Phantoms.
- Joe Pinto is the general manager of the Keys. Joe came to the Keys in December 1996 and is serving his 2nd year as the Keys GM.
- The Keys are managed by former major leaguer Dave Cash. Cash played in the major leagues for 12 years, bating .283 while spending time with the Pirates, Phillies, Expos and Padres.
- The Warthogs are managed by former major leaguer Wally Backman. Backman played in the big leagues for 14 years with the Mets, Pirates, Phillies, and Mariners.
- The Carolina League season is 140 games, split into two halves. The Keys finished in second place in the First Half with a 36-34 record in the Northern Division. The Warthogs finished in fourth place in the First Half with a 24-36 record in the Southern Division.
- The Keys are very active in the community. In 1997, the Keys in partnership with local boards of education began the Keys For Reading program. Each participating student receives an official Keys for Reading bookmark at the onset of the program. Students are required to read four books and have their parents sign the bookmark to complete the program. Over 67,000 students at more than 125 schools in six counties in Maryland, Virginia, and West Virginia.
- Keyote is the official mascot of the Keys. Keyote travels all over the region visiting schools, hospitals, festivals, and other charitable events.
- On Wednesday, July 25, members of the Keys will take part in our annual Charilty Golf Classic to benefit Joel's Kids, which was established through the Community Foundation of Frederick County. Stephens was former Orioles prospect died of colon cancer at the age of 22 in September 1998.
