Amendment to Presidential Waiver in section 11 of S.2600 as passed by the Senate (Terrorism Risk Act of 2002):

- Delete subsection (b).
- Renumber the following subsections.
- Add a new subsection (d), to read as follows:

"(d) PRESIDENTIAL WAIVER - The President may waive subsections (a) and (b) in connection with property subject to the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations or the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations, property which the Secretary of the Treasury determines is subject to claims of ownership interests by third parties, and property that is at issue in claims against the United States before an international tribunal, upon a determination that such a waiver:

(1) is in the national security interest of the United States;

(2) is consistent with international law, including international agreements, and contractual obligations, entered into by the United States; and

(3) would not undermine the United States' anti-terrorism efforts."
