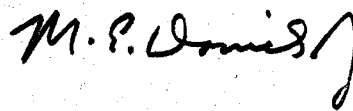

Discussion

H.R. 3348 designates the National Foreign Affairs Training Center, a Foreign Service training facility located in Arlington, Virginia, as the "George P. Shultz National Foreign Affairs Training Center". According to the House floor debate on H.R. 3348, Secretary Shultz was instrumental in obtaining the land and funding for the Center, which opened in 1993.

Dr. Shultz served as Secretary of State from 1982 to 1989. In addition, he served as Secretary of Labor from 1969 to 1970, Director of the Office of Management and Budget from 1970 to 1972, and Secretary of Treasury from 1972 to 1974. In 1989, he was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Dr. Shultz is 81 years old.

H.R. 3348 passed the House by a vote of 407-0 and the Senate by unanimous consent.

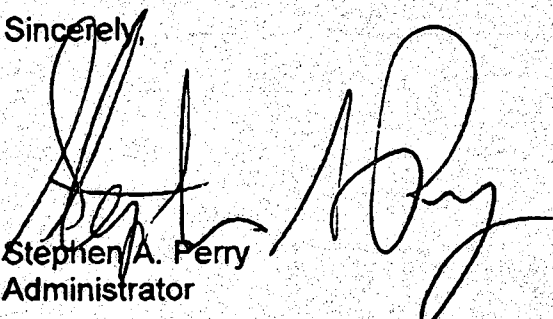

An Act

To designate the National Foreign Affairs Training Center as the George P. Shultz
National Foreign Affairs Training Center.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of
the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. DESIGNATION OF THE GEORGE P. SHULTZ NATIONAL FOR-
EIGN AFFAIRS TRAINING CENTER.

(a) Section 701(a) of the Foreign Service Act of 1980 (22 U.S.C. 4021(a)) is amended by adding at the end the following: "The institution shall be designated the 'George P. Shultz National Foreign Affairs Training Center'".

(b) Any reference in any provision of law to the National Foreign Affairs Training Center or the Foreign Service Institute shall be considered to be a reference to the "George P. Shultz National Foreign Affairs Training Center".

SEC. 2. CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.

(a) Section 53 of the State Department Basic Authorities Act of 1956 (22 U.S.C. 2725) is amended—

(1) in the section heading by inserting "GEORGE P. SHULTZ" after "THE"; and

(2) by inserting "George P. Shultz" after "use of the".

(b) Section 708(a) of the Foreign Service Act of 1980 (22 U.S.C. 4028(a)) is amended by inserting "George P. Shultz" after "director of the".

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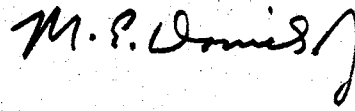

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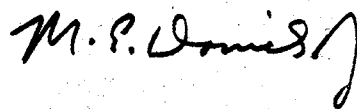
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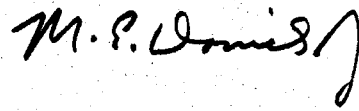
