Dear Mr. Jukes:

This responds to the request for the views of the Postal Service on the following enrolled bills:

- S. 737, to designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 811 South Main Street in Yerington, Nevada, as the "Joseph E. Dini, Jr. Post Office";
- S. 970, to designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 39 Tremont Street, Paris Hill, Maine, as the "Horatio King Post Office Building";
- S. 1026, to designate the United States Post Office located at 60 Third Avenue in Long Branch, New Jersey, as the "Pat King Post Office Building";

1. Purpose of Legislation. These bills would honor numerous persons, including a former Postmaster General during the Buchanan administration, through the honorary designation of local postal facilities.
2. Position of the Postal Service. The Postal Service defers to Congress concerning the honorary designation of postal buildings for notable public figures.
3. Timing. No recommendation.
4. Cost or Savings. No information.
5. Recommendation Concerning Presidential Action. The Postal Service does not object to approval of these bills by the President.

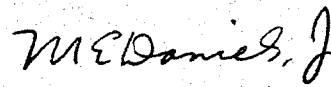

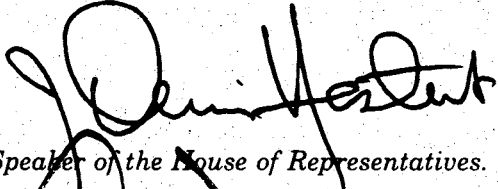

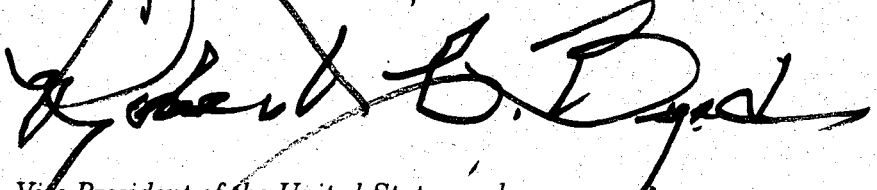
SECTION 1. DESIGNATION OF PAT KING POST OFFICE BUILDING.

SEC. 2. REFERENCES.

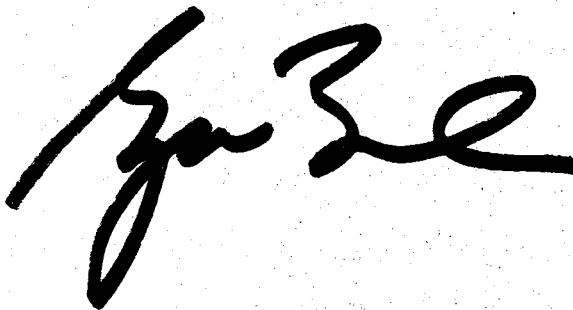
