H.R. 1432 designates the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 3698 Inner Perimeter Road in Valdosta, Georgia, as the "Major Lyn McIntosh Post Office Building".

Major McIntosh, an Air Force pilot, volunteered for a rescue mission to recover 66 American hostages seized at the U.S. Embassy in Tehran, Iran, in 1979. He died in an on-the-ground aircraft collision during the failed mission on April 25, 1980, at the age of 32.

H.R. 1432 passed the House by voice vote and the Senate by unanimous consent.

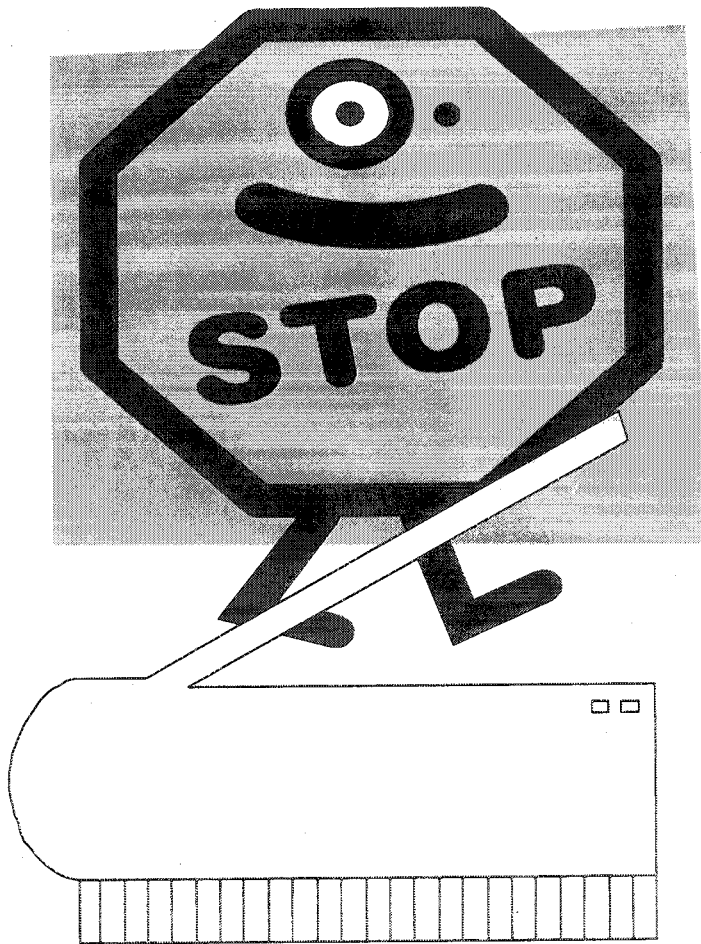

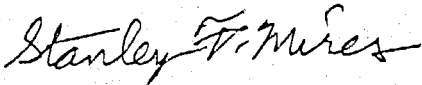
