H.R. 2876 passed the House by voice vote and the Senate by unanimous consent.

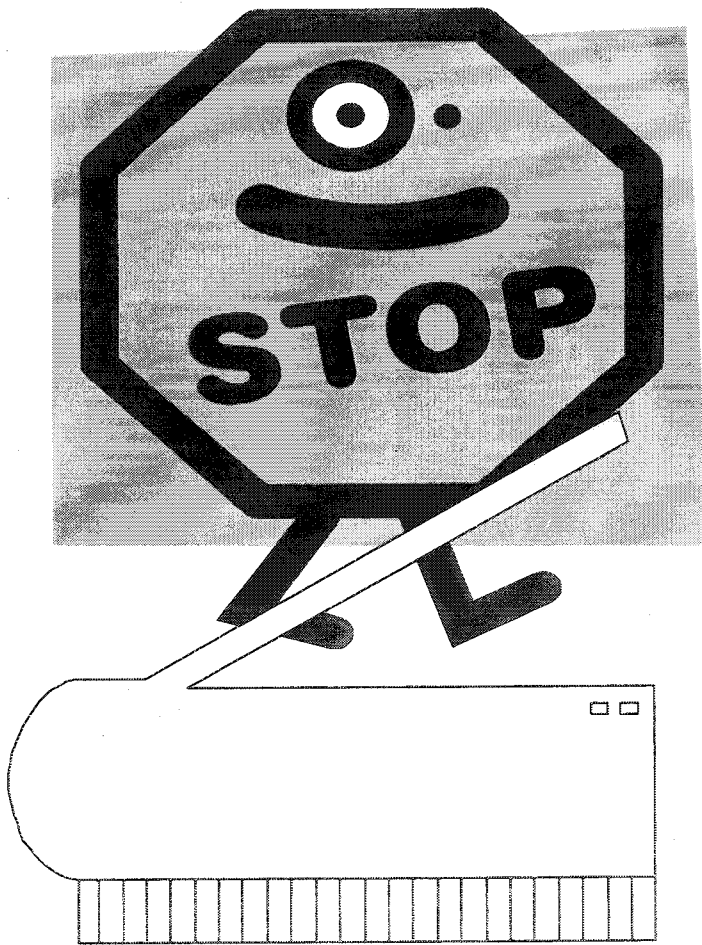

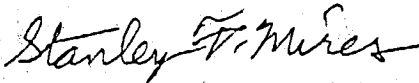
