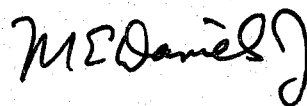

H.R. 3282 designates the Federal building and United States courthouse located at 400 North Main Street in Butte, Montana, as the "Mike Mansfield Federal Building and United States Courthouse".

Ambassador Mansfield served as U.S. Ambassador to Japan from 1977 to 1988. Previously he served, as a Democrat, in the U.S. House of Representatives from 1943 until 1953 and the U.S. Senate from 1953 until 1977. Ambassador Mansfield was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom on January 19, 1989. He died on October 5, 2001, at the age of 98.

H.R. 3282 passed the House by vote of 401-0 and the Senate by unanimous consent.
