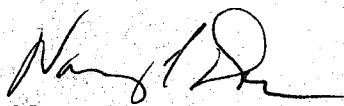

Any reference in a law, map, regulation, document, paper,
or other record of the United States to the chapel referred to
in section 1 shall be deemed to be a reference to the "Bob Hope
Veterans Chapel".
