To improve the ability of the United States to prevent, prepare for, and respond to bioterrorism and other public health emergencies.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of

Dear Mr. Daniels:

This responds to your request for the views of the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) on H.R. 3448, an enrolled bill entitled the "Public Health Security and Bioterrorism Preparedness and Response Act of 2002".

The bill would provide the Government with new and enhanced powers to protect the public health from bioterrorism and other emergencies. A title-by-title summary is enclosed.

The bill provides a panoply of authorities to HHS and other agencies to respond to bioterrorist incidents and other public health emergencies. It includes many of the provisions proposed in the HHS bill, the "HHS Bioterrorism Prevention and Emergency Response Act of 2001", including the following provisions:

- increased authority to regulate possession, use, and transfer of biological agents and toxins, including civil as well as criminal penalties for violation of regulations;
- authority to waive certain Medicare, Medicaid, and SCHIP requirements to ensure that health care items and services are available in an emergency; and
- authority for the Food and Drug Administration to order detentions of food that threatens human or animal health.

The bill also includes other provisions that we believe will improve the nation's preparedness for possible incidents of bioterrorism or public health emergencies. In particular, we welcome the following provisions:

- clear authority and funding for the National Pharmaceutical Stockpile, including funding for stockpiling smallpox vaccine sufficient for the nation's health security needs;
- enhancement of the emergency capacity of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, including authority and funding to establish public health

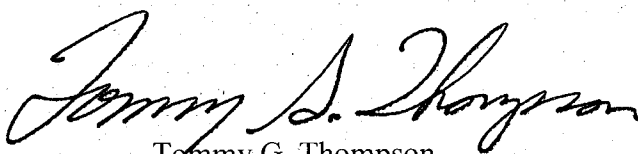
communication and surveillance networks related to bioterrorism and public health emergencies; and

- grant authority to improve state and local government preparedness for bioterrorist incidents and other public health emergencies.

Finally, the bill includes the "Prescription Drug User Fee Amendments of 2002", which extend the Prescription Drug User Fee Act and, we anticipate, will provide needed resources for the Food and Drug Administration's consideration of new drug applications.

We therefore recommend that the President approve the bill.

Title-by-Title Analysis

**TITLE I—NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS FOR BIOTERRORISM AND
OTHER PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCIES**

**Subtitle A—National Preparedness and Response Planning, Coordinating
and Reporting**

Subtitle A provides authorities relevant to preparedness for possible incidents of bioterrorism or other public health emergencies. It includes the following principal provisions:

- It creates within the Department of HHS a new Assistant Secretary for Public Health Emergency Preparedness.
- It gives statutory status to the National Disaster Medical Service (NDMS) within the Office of the new Assistant Secretary, and provides Federal Tort Claims Act and Federal Employee Compensation Act coverage for temporary employees of the NDMS.
- It authorizes construction and renovation of facilities of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) related to bioterrorism.
- It creates two new advisory committees, one on Children and Terrorism and one on Emergency Public Information and Communications, connected with bioterrorism or a public health emergency.
- It authorizes development of training materials and curricula regarding bioterrorism or a public health emergency.
- It authorizes HHS to provide assistance for training of categories of health professionals where there are shortages that should be alleviated in order to respond to bioterrorism or a public health emergency.
- It authorizes HHS to develop a system of advance registration of health professionals for purposes of verifying professionals' credentials of when they volunteer during a public health emergency.

Subtitle B—Strategic National Stockpile; Development of Priority Countermeasures

Subtitle B provides for HHS, in coordination with the Department of Veterans Affairs, to maintain one or more stockpiles, including drugs, vaccines, devices, and other supplies to provide for needs in the event of bioterrorism or a public health emergency. The stockpile is to include smallpox vaccine in an amount determined by the Secretary to be sufficient to meet the health security needs of the United States.

The subtitle would also authorize HHS to conduct and support research pertaining to potential bioterrorism agents, including epidemiology of such agents, vaccines and therapeutics against them, and diagnostic tests. It would allow HHS to designate a priority countermeasure as a fast-track product (if a drug) or as a priority-review device (if a device). It would also require HHS to evaluate new technologies designed to improve activities against bioterrorist attack or other public health emergency.

Subtitle C—Improving State, Local, and Hospital Preparedness for and Response to Bioterrorism and Other Public Health Emergencies

Subtitle C authorizes HHS assistance to state and local governments for a variety of purposes relating to preparedness for Bioterrorism and public health emergencies, including developing response plans; addressing deficiencies found in assessments of public health needs under section 319B of the PHS Act; procurement of equipment, training, and communication systems; and enhancing the preparedness of hospitals and primary care facilities for bioterrorism and public health emergencies.

It also authorizes HHS assistance to partnerships comprising one or more state or local governments and one or more hospitals or primary care facilities planning and training activities to improve preparedness for bioterrorism and public health emergencies.

Subtitle D—Emergency Authorities; Additional Provisions

Subtitle D makes several provisions for public health emergencies declared by HHS, of which the principal ones are to—

- allow HHS, in the event of a declared public health emergency, to extend statutory and regulatory deadlines for affected entities to submit data and reports;
- allow HHS to waive certain regulations of the Medicare, Medicaid, and SCHIP programs to ensure that health care items and services are available to beneficiaries and that providers can be reimbursed; and

- specify how a public health emergency, once declared, will terminate.

Subtitle E—Additional Provisions

Subtitle E contains several miscellaneous provisions pertaining to preparedness for bioterrorism and public health emergencies, of which the principal ones are committed to the responsibility of the Department of Energy, the Department of Veterans Affairs, or the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

It also extends the authorization for HHS grants to address trauma experienced by persons who have experienced violence-related stress.

Finally, it authorizes HHS grants to state, local, and tribal entities to develop cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and automated external defibrillation programs and demonstration projects for cardiac arrest victims.

TITLE II—ENHANCING CONTROLS ON DANGEROUS BIOLOGICAL AGENTS AND TOXINS

Subtitle A—Department of Health and Human Services

Subtitle A redesignates the portions of the Antiterrorism and Effective Death Penalty Act of 1996 delegated to HHS (authorizing regulation of transfers of agents potentially posing threats to public health and safety) as a new section 351A of the Public Health Service Act. It amends the language in several regards, of which the following are the principal effects:

- It gives HHS authority to regulate possession and use, as well as transfer of such biological agents and toxins (select agents).
- Regulations must require persons to register in order to possess, transfer, or use select agents.
- Regulations are to include security requirements. Registered persons must limit access to select agents to those individuals with a need to use them, and must submit the list of such individuals to HHS and to the Justice Department so that DOJ can determine whether they are "restricted persons" (as defined in the amendments made by the USA PATRIOT Act). Registered persons must deny access to those individuals determined to be restricted persons, and must limit or deny access to those identified as within certain other categories.
- Regulations must exempt clinical and diagnostic labs and others possessing agents for similar purposes, and may exempt certain other entities.

- Identities of registered persons and site-specific information will be exempt from disclosure under the Freedom of Information Act.
- There will be civil penalties for certain violations.

Subtitle B—Department of Agriculture

Subtitle B provides to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, with respect to agents that USDA determines have the potential to pose a severe threat to animal or plant health or to animal or plant products, very similar authority to that which subtitle A provides to HHS. For agents listed by both HHS and USDA ("overlap agents and toxins"), the standards for exemptions are as stringent as those set out in section 351A.

Subtitle C—Interagency Coordination Regarding Overlap Agents and Toxins

Subtitle C requires HHS and USDA to coordinate their administration of subtitles A and B. The departments are to enter into an agreement regarding overlap agents, a single registration system, identifications to the Justice Department of individuals with access to select agents, inspections and enforcement. Inspections and enforcement may be done by one agency for the other, with or without reimbursement.

Subtitle D—Criminal Penalties Regarding Certain Biological Agents and Toxins

Subtitle D amends the criminal penalties with respect to select agents. There will be criminal prohibitions on the knowing possession of a select agent without registering, and on transfer of a select agent to a person who one knows or has reason to believe is not registered.

TITLE III—PROTECTING SAFETY AND SECURITY OF FOOD AND DRUG SUPPLY

Subtitle A—Protection of Food Supply

Subtitle A provides authorities to help protect the nation's food supply. The principal provisions are the following:

- HHS is to give high priority to increasing food inspections at ports of entry, and to improving FDA information systems for food imports.
- HHS, in coordination with other agencies, is to provide for research on development of tests for food adulteration.

- HHS may order detention of a food article if there is evidence that food is in violation of the Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act and is a serious health threat to humans or animals. If there is evidence that imported food poses a serious health threat to humans or animals, but HHS cannot inspect the article, HHS may request that the Treasury Department hold the food at the port of entry for up to 24 hours to enable HHS to inspect it.
- HHS may debar a person from importing food if the person has been convicted of a food importation felony or has engaged in a pattern of importing adulterated food that presents a threat of serious adverse health consequences or death to humans or animals.
- HHS is to require registration of all food manufacturing, processing or handling facilities (excluding farms, restaurants, retailers, and certain other categories). Persons who manufacture, process, or receive food (other than restaurants and farms) are required to maintain records; if there is reason to believe food is adulterated and is a threat to human or animal health, the person is required to make relevant records available to HHS.
- HHS is to issue regulations requiring food importers to give prior notice of imported food shipments. When food is refused admission, HHS may require the owner or consignee of the food to affix a label stating that the food was refused entry.
- HHS may award grants to states, territories, and tribes for expenses for expenses of inspections of food, drugs, and cosmetics; it may award grants to states and tribes food safety grants to expand participation in networks to enhance Federal, State and local food safety efforts.

Subtitle B—Protection of Drug Supply

Subtitle B adds provisions to help protect the nation's drug supply. The principal one amends the requirement for registration of foreign drug and device manufacturers, to require electronic registration, and to require that registration include name of each importer and carrier of the drug or device.

Subtitle C—General Provisions Relating to Upgrade of Agricultural Security

[This subtitle is committed to the jurisdiction of the Department of Agriculture.]

TITLE IV—DRINKING WATER SECURITY AND SAFETY

[Principal responsibility for title IV is committed to the Environmental Protection Agency.]

TITLE V—ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS

Subtitle A—Prescription Drug User Fees

Subtitle A is the "Prescription Drug User Fee Amendments of 2002"; it extends the Prescription Drug User Fee Act and adjusts the provisions for user fees and for appropriations to HHS for the Food and Drug Administration's consideration of new drug applications.

Subtitle B—Funding Provisions Regarding Food and Drug Administration

Subtitle B provides that, from appropriations for the Food and Drug Administration, certain sums shall be reserved for the Office of Drug Safety; it also authorizes appropriations for two other FDA offices with responsibilities for drugs.

Subtitle C—Additional Provisions

Subtitle C comprises two provisions. One pertains to the Medicare+Choice program: it delays the deadline for plans to submit benefit and other information to HHS; delays the annual election period for Medicare enrollees; and delays the "lock-in" procedures for beneficiaries. The other provision pertains to digital television and is committed to the Federal Communications Commission.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) recommends that the President sign the enrolled bill, H.R. 3448, "Public Health Security and Bioterrorism Response Act."

This enrolled bill would direct the Secretary of Agriculture to utilize existing authorities to enhance and expand the capacity of the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, the Food Safety and Inspection Service, the Agricultural Research Service, and the Cooperative State Research, Education, and Extension Service programs to protect the food supply of the United States. In addition, USDA, in cooperation with the Department of Health and Human Services, would be required to enhance the control of dangerous biological agents and toxins that pose a severe threat to animal or plant health, or to animal and plant products.

We believe it is extremely critical that we remain vigilant and work together with our Federal and State partners, as well as the food and agriculture industry and consumers, to ensure the integrity of our food systems.

I am pleased to respond to the request of the Assistant Director for Legislative Reference for the views of the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) on the enrolled enactment of H.R. 3448, 107th Congress, the "Public Health Security and Bioterrorism Preparedness and Response Act of 2002."

Section 154 of the enrolled enactment would require VA to enhance its preparedness to respond to emergencies by mandating that VA:

- Enhance the readiness of VA medical centers generally, and by providing them with decontamination and personal protection equipment and training in the use of this equipment;
- Take appropriate actions to improve the security at VA medical centers and research facilities to protect staff and patients, taking into account the results of an evaluation to be conducted by VA on the security needs of these facilities;
- Develop and maintain a centralized system for tracking the current location and availability of pharmaceuticals, medical supplies, and medical equipment throughout VA's health care system;
- Ensure that VA medical centers, in consultation with medical school affiliates, develop and implement curricula to train resident physicians and health care personnel on biological, chemical, or radiological attacks;
- Establish and maintain a training program to facilitate the participation of VA medical center staff and their community partners in the National Disaster Medical System (NDMS), in consultation with the Secretaries of Defense, HHS, and FEMA; and
- Develop and maintain various strategies for providing mental health counseling and assistance, including for PTSD, to local community emergency response providers, veterans, active duty military personnel, and individuals seeking care at Department medical centers following a bioterrorist attack or other public health emergency.

Although this section would authorize amounts to be appropriated to carry out these activities, it does not actually appropriate any funds for VA. Without the authorized appropriations, VA could not undertake these activities without adversely impacting its primary mission of providing medical care, benefits services, and memorial services to veterans and their families.

Section 102 establishes an Assistant Secretary for Public Health Emergency Preparedness in the Department of Health and Human Services. This Assistant Secretary is designated the head of the NDMS, which is a coordinated effort by Federal agencies working with States and other appropriate entities. HHS would have authority to activate NDMS in response to public health emergencies. DoD currently has authority to activate NDMS to respond to military contingencies. This section provides that VA is a participating agency in the NDMS.

Section 108 amends the Public Health Service Act to establish a Working Group on Bioterrorism and Other Public Health Emergencies. The Group's primary purpose is consultation, assessing coordination, and making recommendations on topics related to preparedness for and in response to bioterrorism. HHS is to coordinate with VA and other Federal agencies in establishing this group.

Section 121 requires HHS, in coordination with VA, to maintain a stockpile of drugs, vaccines and other biological products, medical devices, and other supplies as appropriate, taking into account other available sources, to provide for the emergency health security of the United States.

Section 125 requires HHS to consider using the biomedical research and development capabilities of VA in conjunction with VA's affiliated health professions universities. When advantageous to the Government, HHS may enter into cooperative agreements with VA to conduct research, investigations, experiments, demonstrations, and studies on:

- Pathogens of potential use in a bioterrorist attack;
- DNA or other comparative analysis of priority pathogens;
- The development of priority countermeasures to bioterrorism agents; and
- Other relevant areas of research.

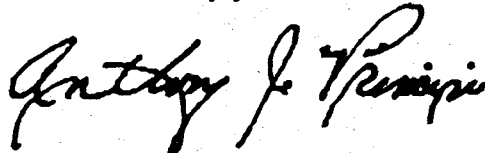

Finally, section 401 will require some VA water treatment systems to assess their vulnerability to disruption and develop emergency response plans.

VA approves of the enrolled bill's provisions, and recommends that the President sign it into law.
