H.R. 1366 designates the United States Post Office building located at 3101 West Sunflower Avenue in Santa Ana, California, as the "Hector G. Godinez Post Office Building".

Mr. Godinez was the first Mexican American postmaster in the United States and later became Southern California's district manager for the United States Post Office. He also received a Bronze Star for bravery and a Purple Heart for wounds received during World War II. Mr. Godinez died on May 16, 1999, at the age of 70.

H.R. 1366 passed the House by voice vote and the Senate by unanimous consent.

2. Position of the Postal Service. The Postal Service defers to Congress concerning the honorary designation of postal buildings for notable public figures.

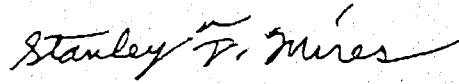
