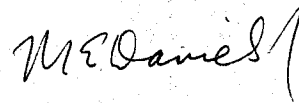

H.R. 558 designates the Federal building and United States courthouse located at 504 West Hamilton Street in Allentown, Pennsylvania, as the "Edward N. Cahn Federal Building and United States Courthouse".

Judge Cahn served on the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania from 1975 until his retirement in December 1998. At the time of his retirement, Judge Cahn had served as the court's chief judge for five years. He is 68 years old.

H.R. 558 passed the Senate by unanimous consent and the House by vote of 412-0.

An Act

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of
the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

SECTION 1. DESIGNATION.

The Federal building and United States courthouse located at 504 West Hamilton Street in Allentown, Pennsylvania, shall be known and designated as the "Edward N. Cahn Federal Building and United States Courthouse".

SEC. 2. REFERENCES.

Any reference in a law, map, regulation, document, paper, or other record of the United States to the Federal building and United States courthouse referred to in section 1 shall be deemed to be a reference to the "Edward N. Cahn Federal Building and United States Courthouse".
