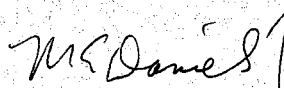

H.R. 988 designates the United States courthouse located at 40 Centre Street in New York, New York, as the "Thurgood Marshall United States Courthouse".

Thurgood Marshall was the first African American Supreme Court justice and a well known civil rights leader. His argument before the Supreme Court in Brown v. Board of Education was instrumental in persuading the court to unanimously declare segregation in public schools unconstitutional. Justice Marshall died in 1993 at the age of 84.

H.R. 988 passed the House and Senate by unanimous consent.

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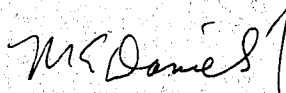

SECTION 1. DESIGNATION.

The United States courthouse located at 40 Centre Street in New York, New York, shall be known and designated as the "Thurgood Marshall United States Courthouse".

SEC. 2. REFERENCES.

Any reference in a law, map, regulation, document, paper, or other record of the United States to the United States courthouse referred to in section 1 shall be deemed to be a reference to the "Thurgood Marshall United States Courthouse".

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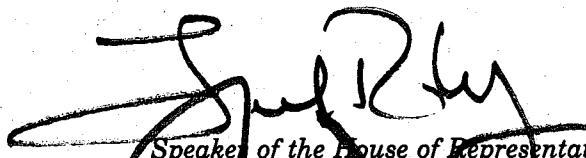
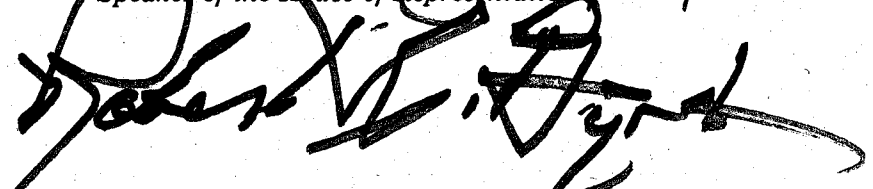
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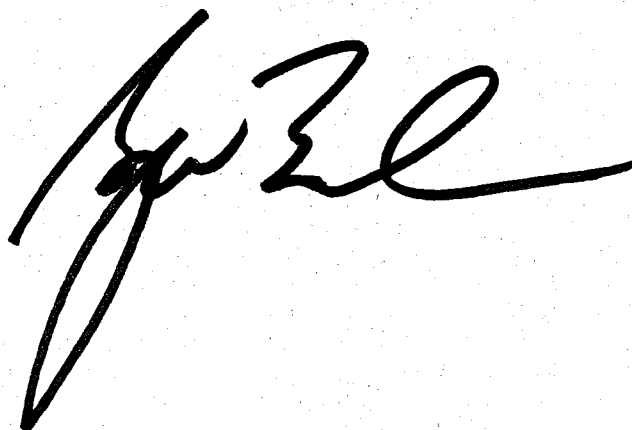
