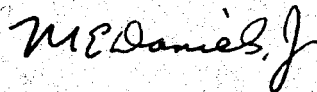
S.J.Res. 22 states that the Congress:

- (1) condemns the terrorists who planned and carried out the terrorist attacks of  
September 11th and those who sponsored them;
- (2) expresses condolences to the victims of the attacks and their families;
- (3) is certain that the American people will stand united;
- (4) commends the heroic actions of those who responded to the attacks;

- (5) declares that the attacks struck the people of America and its symbols and structures of economic and military strength, and that the United States is entitled to respond under international law;
- (6) thanks foreign leaders for their support and requests continued support in the war against international terrorism;
- (7) commits to supporting increased resources in the war to eradicate terrorism;
- (8) supports the determination of the President, in close consultation with Congress, to bring to justice and punish the perpetrators of the attacks and their sponsors; and
- (9) declares that September 12, 2001, shall be a National Day of Unity and Mourning.

#### Conclusion and Recommendations

We join the Departments of State and Defense in recommending approval of the joint resolution, which passed the Senate by a vote of 100-0 and the House by 408-0.

Your signature is recommended as soon as possible in order to provide the immediate resources necessary to respond to the terrorist attacks on the United States that occurred on September 11, 2001.

Purpose

Provides \$40 billion in emergency FY 2001 supplemental appropriations to provide assistance to the victims and to address other consequences of the attacks, including funding for: providing Federal, State, and local preparedness for mitigating and responding to the attacks; providing support to counter, investigate, or prosecute domestic or international terrorism; providing increased transportation security; repairing public facilities and transportation systems damaged by the attacks; and, supporting national security.

Summary

The enrolled bill provides \$40 billion in emergency discretionary budget authority to an Emergency Response Fund in the Executive Office of the President, to be transferred to any authorized Federal Government activity to meet the needs resulting from the disaster. Of this amount, \$20 billion will be used directly for disaster recovery activities and assistance related to the terrorist acts in New York, Virginia, and Pennsylvania.

The bill provides \$10 billion that will be available without any further congressional action. An additional \$10 billion would be available 15 days after the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) has submitted proposed allocations to the House and Senate Committees on Appropriations. Twenty billion dollars would be available for obligation following enactment of a subsequent emergency appropriations bill.

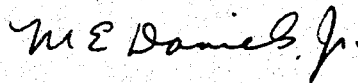
OMB will provide quarterly reports to the House and Senate Committees on Appropriations on the use of these funds, beginning no later than January 2, 2002. If additional resources are necessary beyond this request, I will prepare for your approval a request for additional funding.

H.R. 2888 passed the House by a vote of 422 to 0 and the Senate by 96 to 0.

Recommendation

I join the heads of the affected Departments and agencies in recommending approval of the enrolled bill.

I will be forwarding to you our recommendation for the required emergency designation of the funds provided by this Act.

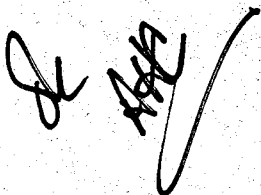

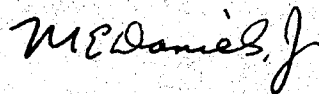

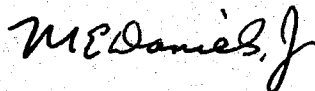

### **JOINT RESOLUTION**

Expressing the sense of the Senate and House of Representatives regarding the terrorist attacks launched against the United States on September 11, 2001.

Whereas on September 11, 2001, terrorists hijacked and destroyed four civilian aircraft, crashing two of them into the towers of the World Trade Center in New York City, and a third into the Pentagon outside Washington, D.C.;

Whereas thousands of innocent Americans were killed and injured as a result of these attacks, including the passengers and crew of the four aircraft, workers in the World Trade Center and in the Pentagon, rescue workers, and bystanders;

Whereas these attacks destroyed both towers of the World Trade Center, as well as adjacent buildings, and seriously damaged the Pentagon; and

Whereas these attacks were by far the deadliest terrorist attacks ever launched against the United States, and, by targeting symbols of American strength and success, clearly were intended to intimidate our Nation and weaken its resolve: Now, therefore, be it

1       *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*  
2       *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3       That Congress—

4               (1) condemns in the strongest possible terms  
5       the terrorists who planned and carried out the Sep-  
6       tember 11, 2001, attacks against the United States,  
7       as well as their sponsors;

8               (2) extends its deepest condolences to the vic-  
9       tims of these heinous and cowardly attacks, as well  
10       as to their families, friends, and loved ones;

11              (3) is certain that the people of the United  
12       States will stand united as our Nation begins the  
13       process of recovering and rebuilding in the after-  
14       math of these tragic acts;

15              (4) commends the heroic actions of the rescue  
16       workers, volunteers, and State and local officials  
17       who responded to these tragic events with courage,  
18       determination, and skill;

19              (5) declares that these premeditated attacks  
20       struck not only at the people of America, but also  
21       at the symbols and structures of our economic and  
22       military strength, and that the United States is enti-

24              (6) thanks those foreign leaders and individuals

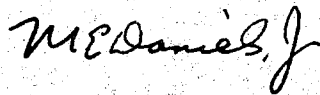

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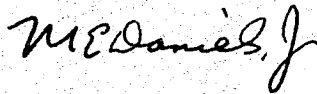
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- (2) expresses condolences to the victims of the attacks and their families;
- (3) is certain that the American people will stand united;
- (4) commends the heroic actions of those who responded to the attacks;

- (5) declares that the attacks struck the people of America and its symbols and structures of economic and military strength, and that the United States is entitled to respond under international law;
- (6) thanks foreign leaders for their support and requests continued support in the war against international terrorism;
- (7) commits to supporting increased resources in the war to eradicate terrorism;
- (8) supports the determination of the President, in close consultation with Congress, to bring to justice and punish the perpetrators of the attacks and their sponsors; and
- (9) declares that September 12, 2001, shall be a National Day of Unity and Mourning.

#### Conclusion and Recommendations

We join the Departments of State and Defense in recommending approval of the joint resolution, which passed the Senate by a vote of 100-0 and the House by 408-0.

# One Hundred Seventh Congress of the United States of America

## AT THE FIRST SESSION

*Begun and held at the City of Washington on Wednesday,  
the third day of January, two thousand and one*

### Joint Resolution

Expressing the sense of the Senate and House of Representatives regarding the terrorist attacks launched against the United States on September 11, 2001.

Whereas on September 11, 2001, terrorists hijacked and destroyed four civilian aircraft, crashing two of them into the towers of the World Trade Center in New York City, and a third into the Pentagon outside Washington, D.C.;

Whereas thousands of innocent Americans were killed and injured as a result of these attacks, including the passengers and crew of the four aircraft, workers in the World Trade Center and in the Pentagon, rescue workers, and bystanders;

Whereas these attacks destroyed both towers of the World Trade Center, as well as adjacent buildings, and seriously damaged the Pentagon; and

Whereas these attacks were by far the deadliest terrorist attacks ever launched against the United States, and, by targeting symbols of American strength and success, clearly were intended to intimidate our Nation and weaken its resolve: Now, therefore, be it

*Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That Congress—*

(1) condemns in the strongest possible terms the terrorists who planned and carried out the September 11, 2001, attacks against the United States, as well as their sponsors;

(2) extends its deepest condolences to the victims of these heinous and cowardly attacks, as well as to their families, friends, and loved ones;

(3) is certain that the people of the United States will stand united as our Nation begins the process of recovering and rebuilding in the aftermath of these tragic acts;

(4) commends the heroic actions of the rescue workers, volunteers, and State and local officials who responded to these tragic events with courage, determination, and skill;

(5) declares that these premeditated attacks struck not only at the people of America, but also at the symbols and structures of our economic and military strength, and that the United States is entitled to respond under international law;

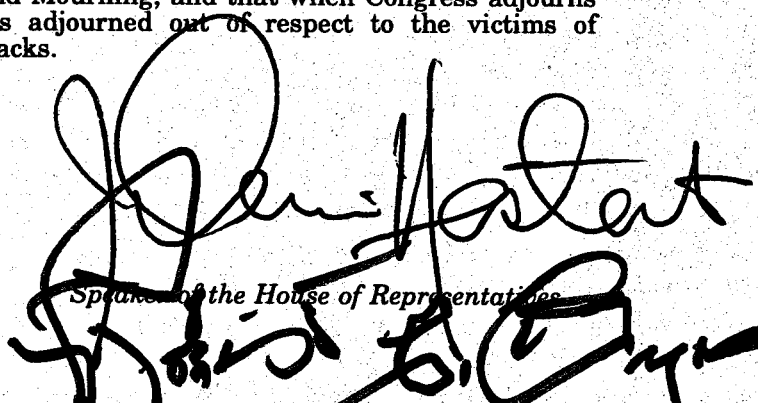
(6) thanks those foreign leaders and individuals who have expressed solidarity with the United States in the aftermath of the attacks, and asks them to continue to stand with the United States in the war against international terrorism;

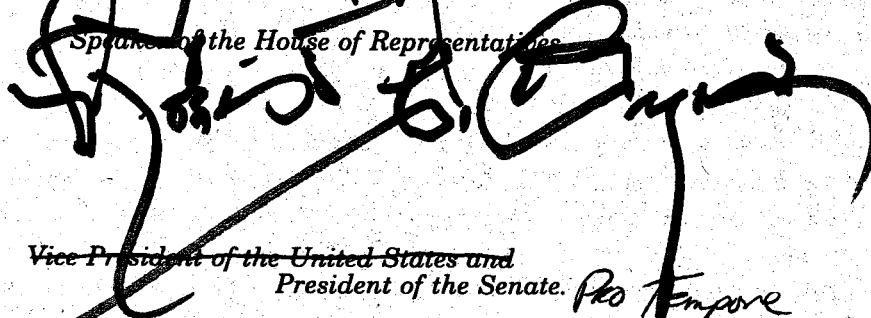
(7) commits to support increased resources in the war to eradicate terrorism;

(8) supports the determination of the President, in close consultation with Congress, to bring to justice and punish the perpetrators of these attacks as well as their sponsors; and

(9) declares that September 12, 2001, shall be a National Day of Unity and Mourning, and that when Congress adjourns today, it stands adjourned out of respect to the victims of the terrorist attacks.

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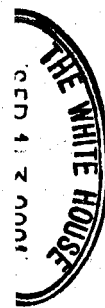
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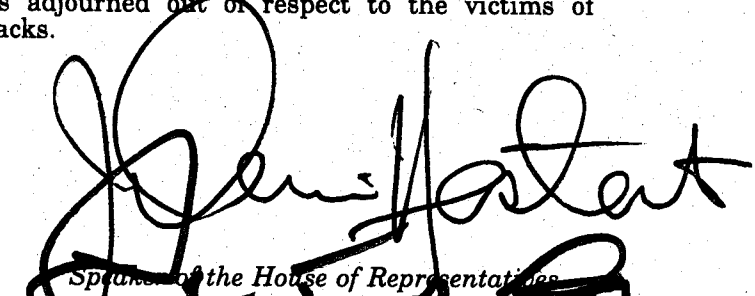
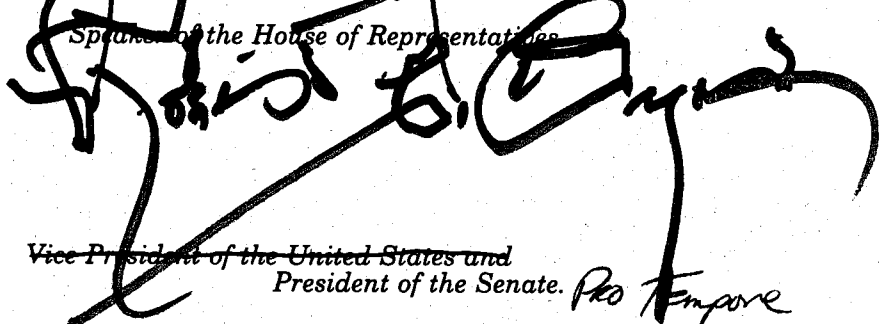
