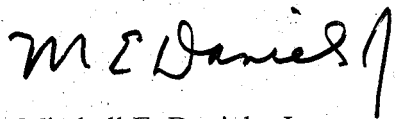
Discussion

At this time, none of the regular thirteen FY 2003 appropriations bills have been signed into law. H.J. Res. 112 is a clean, short-term continuing resolution (CR), that continues the terms and conditions of H.J. Res. 111 (P.L. 107-229) that you signed into law on September 30, 2002. That CR responded to all of the Administration's concerns for continuing the operation of Federal programs under existing authorities. H.J. Res. 112 passed the House by a vote of 404 -7 and the Senate by voice vote on October 3rd.

Recommendation

H.J. Res. 112 is a clean CR that provides funding to the Federal Government until regular appropriations can be approved by the Congress. I recommend that you sign the enrolled bill.
