Discussion

At this time, none of the regular thirteen FY 2002 appropriations bills have been signed into law. H.J. Res. 69 is a clean, short-term continuing resolution, one that is free of extraneous provisions. This continuing resolution responds to all of the Administration's concerns for continuing the operation of Federal programs under existing authorities. H.J. Res. 69 passed the House by unanimous consent on October 17th and passed the Senate by unanimous consent on the same day.

H.J. Res. 69 provides funding for continuing projects and activities based on the following terms:

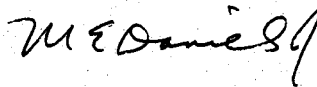
- The funding level is the current rate.
- FY 2001 terms and conditions will apply.
- The continuing resolution will run through October 31st.
- The continuing resolution includes provisions that were requested by the Administration to take care of a number of anomalies, such as authorizing FEMA flood insurance, international activities authorization waivers, and the continuation of payments under appropriated entitlement programs.

Under the continuing resolution, programs that normally have large, up-front obligations may not make such obligations if doing so would impinge on the Congress' final funding prerogatives.

Recommendation

H.J. Res. 69 is a clean continuing resolution that provides funding to the Federal Government until regular appropriations can be approved by the Congress. I recommend that you sign the enrolled bill. A signing statement is attached for your consideration.

Submitted for your consideration are requests to make available by transfer previously appropriated funds provided in P.L. 107-38, the Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act for Recovery from and Response to Terrorist Attacks on the United States, FY 2001. You have previously authorized the transfer of \$7.2 billion from the Emergency Response Fund (ERF).

Your approval of these additional requests would transfer a total of \$1.7 billion from the ERF to the Departments of Agriculture, Defense, State, and Transportation; International Assistance Programs; and the Broadcasting Board of Governors. The funding would address consequences of the attacks, including funding for: the use of National Guard personnel and additional sky marshals to provide increased airport security; food assistance programs in Afghanistan and Pakistan, as well as other neighboring countries; economic assistance to Pakistan; counterterrorism activities; and national security operations.

These requests represent the fourth round of transfers from the ERF to respond to urgent requirements arising from the September terrorist attacks. Pursuant to P.L. 107-38, \$1.6 billion of these funds will be made available to agencies 15 days after this designation is forwarded to Congress and \$71.4 million will be made available to the Department of Defense without further congressional review.

Following an extensive review of individual agency proposals, on October 17th, you asked the Congress to provide \$20.0 billion in emergency funding for additional immediate and near-term requirements. We will work with the Congress to ensure that these funds are enacted quickly so that recovery from the attacks can continue without interruption.

I have carefully reviewed these proposals and am satisfied that they are necessary at this time. Therefore, I join the heads of the affected Departments and agencies in recommending your approval of the transfers described in the enclosure.

Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with provisions of Public Law 107-38, the Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act for Recovery from and Response to Terrorist Attacks on the United States, FY 2001, today I have authorized transfers from the Emergency Response Fund totaling \$1.7 billion for emergency recovery and response and national security activities listed in the enclosed letter from the Director of the Office of Management and Budget. As provided in Public Law 107-38, \$1.6 billion of these funds will be made available to agencies 15 days from the date of this transmittal and \$71.4 million will be made available to the Department of Defense immediately.

These funds are in addition to the \$7.2 billion that I previously authorized for transfer and will allow our Government to continue to address the consequences -- both at home and abroad -- arising from the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001.

On October 17th, I asked the Congress to provide \$20 billion in emergency funding for both defense and domestic needs related to the September attacks. I urge the Congress to enact these crucial resources without delay.

The details of these actions are set forth in the enclosed letter from the Director of the Office of Management and Budget. I concur with his comments and observations.
