Funding for the accounts covered by the enrolled bill is currently provided under H.J. Res. 123, the fourth FY 2003 Continuing Resolution, which will expire at midnight on Friday, November 22nd.

Provides FY 2003 appropriations for military construction, family housing, and base closure programs of the Department of Defense (DOD).

Summary

H.R. 5011 provides \$10.5 billion, \$1.0 billion above your request, in discretionary budget authority for FY 2003 and is largely in line with the Administration's defense priorities. Of the total provided, the enrolled bill includes \$6.3 billion for military construction and \$4.2 billion for family housing. While this enrolled bill exceeds your request (the Defense Appropriations bill is below your request by \$11.8 billion, including the War Reserve), our objective is to ensure that the total of the thirteen appropriations bills does not exceed the House-passed Budget Resolution level of \$759 billion. The bill largely supports your housing initiative, the protection of military installations against terrorism, the continuation of clean-up at prior base closure sites, and the construction of facilities to destroy chemical weapons at several locations.

Most of the \$1.0 billion increase is for unrequested military construction projects in various locations across the United States. The bill includes over 125 unrequested military construction projects. In addition, the bill excludes or reduces the scope of about 15 projects requested in the budget, totaling about \$0.1 billion.

At this time, the Defense authorization bill has not been enacted. Without authorizing legislation, DOD cannot begin many of the new major construction projects appropriated in H.R. 5011, and it is unclear when the Congress will pass the required authorizing language.

The conference report on H.R. 5011 passed the House by a vote of 419 to 0 on October 10th and passed the Senate by unanimous consent the same day.

Recommendation

On balance, H.R. 5011 provides acceptable levels of funding for military construction, family housing, and base closure activities. I join the Secretary of Defense and your National Security Advisor in recommending approval of the enrolled bill. A signing statement is attached for your consideration.

An Act

Making appropriations for military construction, family housing, and base realignment and closure for the Department of Defense for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2003, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the following sums are appropriated, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated for military construction, family housing, and base realignment and closure functions administered by the Department of Defense, for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2003, and for other purposes, namely:

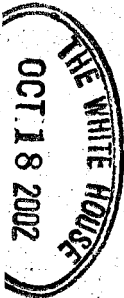

For acquisition, construction, installation, and equipment of temporary or permanent public works, military installations, facilities, and real property for the Army as currently authorized by law, including personnel in the Army Corps of Engineers and other personal services necessary for the purposes of this appropriation, and for construction and operation of facilities in support of the functions of the Commander in Chief, \$1,683,710,000, to remain available until September 30, 2007: *Provided*, That of this amount, not to exceed \$163,135,000 shall be available for study, planning, design, architect and engineer services, and host nation support, as authorized by law, unless the Secretary of Defense determines that additional obligations are necessary for such purposes and notifies the Committees on Appropriations of both Houses of Congress of his determination and the reasons therefor: *Provided further*, That of the funds appropriated for "Military Construction, Army" in previous Military Construction Appropriation Acts, \$49,376,000 are rescinded.

For acquisition, construction, installation, and equipment of temporary or permanent public works, naval installations, facilities, and real property for the Navy as currently authorized by law, including personnel in the Naval Facilities Engineering Command and other personal services necessary for the purposes of this appropriation, \$1,305,128,000, to remain available until September 30, 2007: *Provided*, That of this amount, not to exceed \$87,043,000 shall be available for study, planning, design, architect and engineer

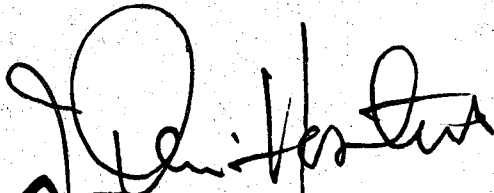


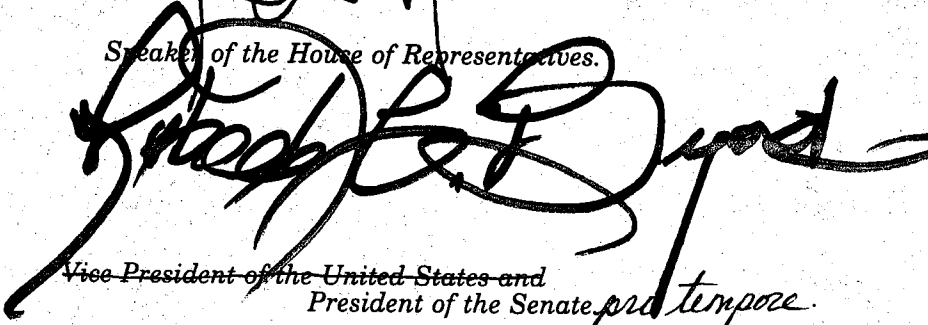

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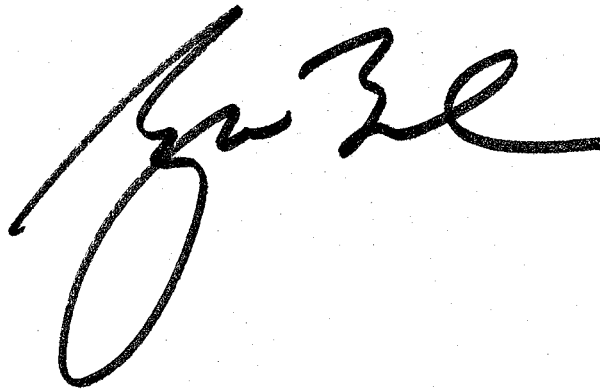
STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT

Today I have signed into law H.R. 5011, the "Military Construction Appropriations Act, 2003," which provides \$10.5 billion for Department of Defense military construction and family housing programs. The Act ensures the Nation's military construction priorities are met and provides the resources and infrastructure for our fighting forces at home and abroad. My Administration is committed to improving military housing and the quality of life of our uniformed defenders and their families, and this bill clearly reflects that commitment.

Sections 107, 110, and 113 of the Act provide for notice to the Congress of relocation of activities between military installations, initiation of a new installation abroad, or U.S. military exercises involving \$100,000 in construction costs. The U.S. Supreme Court has stated that the President's authority to classify and control access to information bearing on national security flows from the Constitution and does not depend upon a legislative grant of authority. Although the notice can be provided in most situations as a matter of comity, situations may arise, especially in wartime, in which the President must act promptly under his constitutional grants of executive power and authority as Commander in Chief while protecting sensitive national security information. The executive branch shall construe these sections in a manner consistent with the President's constitutional authority.

Section 119 provides for the Secretary of Defense to submit a report to the Congress with details of proposed actions to encourage certain cooperating nations to assume a greater share of the common defense burden. The executive branch shall construe this provision in a manner consistent with the President's constitutional authority to withhold information, the disclosure of which could impair foreign relations, the national security, the deliberative processes

of the Executive, or the performance of the Executive's constitutional duties. The Secretary of Defense will, of course, continue as a matter of comity to keep the Congress appropriately informed of the matters addressed by section 119.

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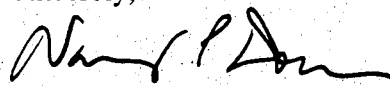

While this enrolled bill exceeds your request (the Defense Appropriations bill is below your request by \$11.8 billion, including the War Reserve), our objective is to ensure that the total of the thirteen appropriations bills does not exceed the House-passed Budget Resolution level of \$759 billion. The bill largely supports your housing initiative, the protection of military installations against terrorism, the continuation of clean-up at prior base closure sites, and the construction of facilities to destroy chemical weapons at several locations.

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At this time, the Defense authorization bill has not been enacted. Without authorizing legislation, DOD cannot begin many of the new major construction projects appropriated in H.R. 5011, and it is unclear when the Congress will pass the required authorizing language.

The conference report on H.R. 5011 passed the House by a vote of 419 to 0 on October 10th and passed the Senate by unanimous consent the same day.

Recommendation

On balance, H.R. 5011 provides acceptable levels of funding for military construction, family housing, and base closure activities. I join the Secretary of Defense and your National Security Advisor in recommending approval of the enrolled bill. A signing statement is attached for your consideration.
