S. 1270 designates the United States courthouse to be constructed at 8th Avenue and Mill Street in Eugene, Oregon, as the "Wayne Lyman Morse United States Courthouse".

Senator Morse served in the U.S. Senate from 1945 until 1969. He was elected twice as a Republican and twice as a Democrat; he also served as an Independent. Mr. Morse died at the age of 73 in 1974.

S. 1270 passed the Senate by unanimous consent and the House by voice vote.

Any reference in a law, map, regulation, document, paper, or other record of the United States to the United States courthouse referred to in section 1 shall be deemed to be a reference to the Wayne Lyman Morse United States Courthouse.

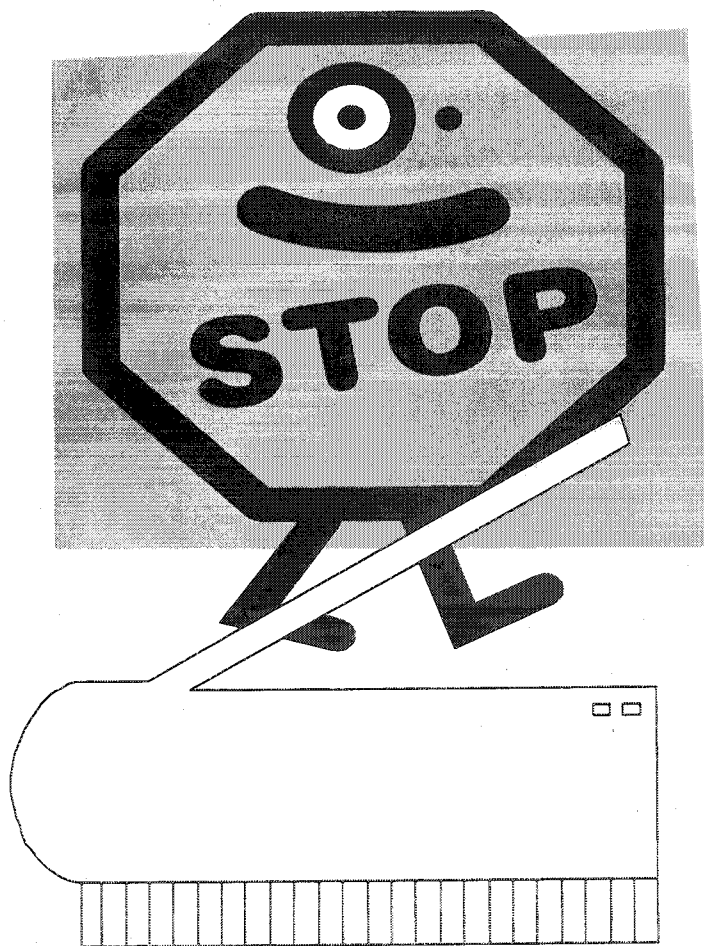

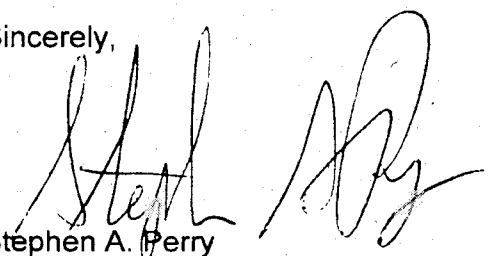
