Mr. Arlene, a Democrat, served as Pennsylvania's first African-American State Senator from 1967 until 1980. Previously he served in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives from 1956 until 1966. Mr. Arlene died in 1989 at the age of 75.

H.R. 3738 passed the House by voice vote and the Senate by unanimous consent.

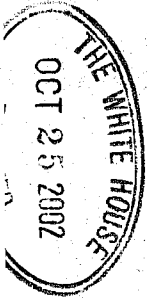

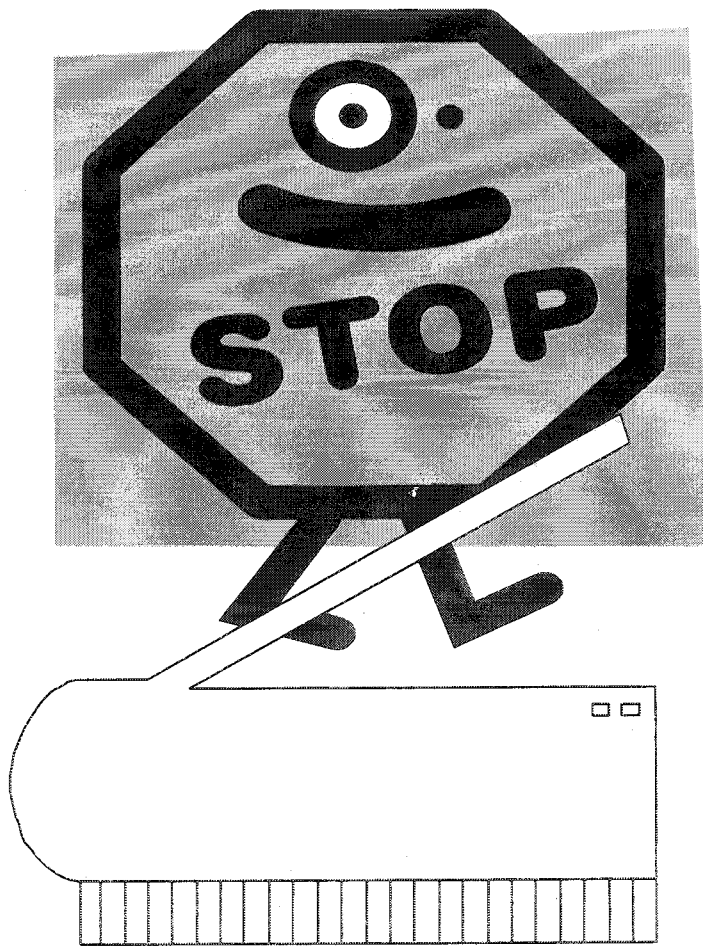

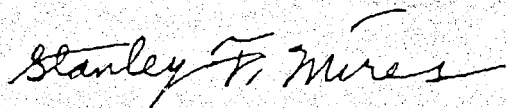
2. Position of the Postal Service. The Postal Service defers to Congress concerning the honorary designation of postal buildings for notable public figures.
