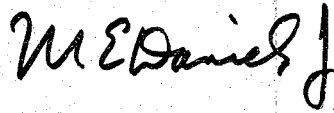

Discussion

H.R. 670 designates the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 7 Commercial Street in Newport, Rhode Island, as the "Bruce F. Cotta Post Office Building".

Mr. Cotta received the Distinguished Service Cross for his actions in Vietnam on May 19, 1968, while serving as an Army Specialist Four medic in combat operations. During exchange of fire, a grenade landed among his group. Specialist Cotta picked up the grenade and threw it back to the enemy position, wounding himself in the process. He ignored his wounds and continued to give aid to the other men even after being wounded a second time by another grenade. Mr. Cotta is 55 years old.

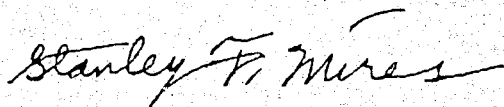
2. Position of the Postal Service. The Postal Service defers to Congress concerning the honorary designation of postal buildings for notable public figures.
