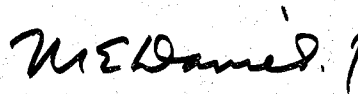
According to the report of the House Judiciary Committee on H.R. 2245, Anisha Goveas Foti, who was born in India, was a travel agent for World Travel Service in Bahrain assigned to the travel office at the American Embassy in Manama, Bahrain, in 1999. While working at the Embassy, she met her future husband, Seth Foti, an American citizen who was a diplomatic courier for the State Department. In June 2000, after fulfilling the waiting period required by the State Department for a marriage between a U.S. citizen in the foreign service and a foreign national, the couple was married. Mr. Foti then filed a petition and application on behalf of Anisha for her to become a permanent resident. The next step in the process – an interview for approval of her petition for conditional permanent residence – was never scheduled before Mr. Foti was killed in an airplane crash in August 2000, while on his first assignment as a courier.

Under Immigration and Nationality Act regulations, in the event of the untimely death of a sponsoring spouse, the surviving spouse may self petition for permanent residence, but only if the couple had been married for at least two years. Waivers to this provision are routinely given, but only if a petition for conditional permanent residence has been approved prior to the death.

The enrolled bill would allow Anisha Goveas Foti two years from the enactment of the bill to file an application, with appropriate fees, for an immigrant visa or for adjustment of status. Once Mrs. Foti is granted a visa or permanent residence, the number of immigrant visas made available to India, the place of Mrs. Foti's birth, would be reduced by one, either in that fiscal year or the following one.

Conclusion and Recommendations

We join Justice in recommending approval of H.R. 2245, which passed both the House and the Senate by unanimous consent.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of

SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENT STATUS FOR ANISHA GOVEAS FOTI.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding subsections (a) and (b) of section 201 of the Immigration and Nationality Act, Anisha Goveas Foti shall be eligible for issuance of an immigrant visa or for adjustment of status to that of an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence upon filing an application for issuance of an immigrant visa under section 204 of such Act or for adjustment of status to lawful permanent resident.

(b) ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS.—If Anisha Goveas Foti enters the United States before the filing deadline specified in subsection (c), she shall be considered to have entered and remained lawfully and shall, if otherwise eligible, be eligible for adjustment of status under section 245 of the Immigration and Nationality Act as of the date of the enactment of this Act.

(c) DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION AND PAYMENT OF FEES.—Subsections (a) and (b) shall apply only if the application for issuance of an immigrant visa or the application for adjustment of status is filed with appropriate fees within 2 years after the date of the enactment of this Act.

SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF IMMIGRANT VISA NUMBER.

Upon the granting of an immigrant visa or permanent residence to Anisha Goveas Foti, the Secretary of State shall instruct the proper officer to reduce by 1, during the current or next following fiscal year, the total number of immigrant visas that are made available to natives of the country of the alien's birth under section 203(a) of the Immigration and Nationality Act or, if applicable, the total number of immigrant visas that are made available to natives of the country of the alien's birth under section 202(e) of such Act.

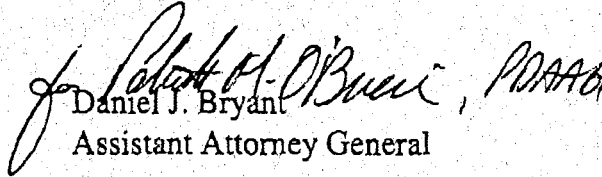
Dear Mr. Daniels:

This responds to your request for the views and recommendation of the Department of Justice on enrolled bill H.R. 2245, "[f]or the relief of Anisha Goveas Foti." H.R. 2245 would allow Anisha Goveas Foti to adjust her status to that of permanent resident. We have no objection to enactment of this enrolled bill and therefore recommend that the President approve it.

According to the report of the Committee on the Judiciary of the House of Representatives on H.R. 2245, Anisha Goveas Foti is from India. Seth Foti was a diplomatic courier for the State Department. Anisha was a travel agent for World Travel Service in Bahrain and was assigned to the travel office in the American Embassy in June 1999. Just after January 1, 2000, Mr. Foti asked (then) Ms. Goveas to marry him. They were married on June 3, 2000 -- one day after the waiting period required by the State Department's regulations concerning marriages between United States nationals in the Foreign Service and foreign nationals. Seth Foti subsequently filled out all the documents to adjust the status of Anisha to permanent resident. On August 23, 2000, Seth Foti was killed in an airplane crash. The regulations of the Immigration and Naturalization Service concerning the untimely death of a sponsoring spouse allow for a waiver of the otherwise applicable 2-year marriage requirement only if the individual's petition for conditional permanent residence had been approved prior to the death of the sponsoring spouse. The interview for approval of Mrs. Foti's petition for conditional permanent residence had not been scheduled before Mr. Foti was killed. Had the interview occurred, Mrs. Foti would have been eligible for a waiver of the two-year requirement.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on this matter. If we may be of additional assistance, we trust that you will not hesitate to call upon us.
