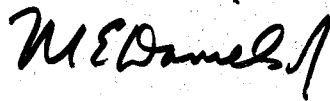

Federal retirement benefit payments would be based upon these estimates. H.R. 5205 would be effective retroactively as if it were enacted in P.L. 106-554, on December 21, 2000.

Conclusion and Recommendations

The Department of the Treasury advises that the enrolled bill will enable benefit payments to be made within eight weeks of enactment, in contrast to six months to a year under current requirements. Treasury estimates that the bill will result in administrative savings of \$336,000.

Dear Mr. Daniels:

This responds to your request for the views of this Department on enrolled bill H.R. 5205, a bill pertaining to the calculation of longevity pay for officers of the Metropolitan Police Department of the District of Columbia.

Existing law provides that police officers of the Metropolitan Police Department of the District of Columbia receive an enhancement to their basic salary while in active duty for years served. The salary enhancement is termed "longevity pay." District and Federal legislation enacted in 1999 and 2000, respectively, requires that starting with January 2001 retirement payments, longevity pay was to be included in retirement calculations for all police officers who have retired from the D.C. Police Department since August 29, 1972.

Implementation of existing law entails that the original annuity be recalculated, and adjusted for cost of living, equalization and benefit adjustments forward to the current date. An accurate calculation of the longevity benefit assumes the availability of data to recalculate the initial benefit of nearly 2,500 retired police officers; the availability of accurate historical data for the retired police officers dating back to 1972; the detailed knowledge of every plan provision at every retirement date; and the exact time and amount of every cost-of-living and equalization adjustment over the past 30 years. Unfortunately, these calculations have been made difficult because of missing or partial data which is needed for the calculations.

Enrolled bill H.R. 5205 will cure this problem by permitting the Secretary of the Treasury to use estimated amounts in determining the service longevity and to make Federal benefit payments based upon such estimates. Using tables and mathematical formulas which have been proposed by the Association of Retired Police Officers, the Treasury Department and the District of Columbia will be able to begin making longevity benefit payments as soon as eight weeks after enactment of H.R. 5205, in contrast to an extended period of implementation of six months to a year under current requirements. The methodology proposed by H.R. 5205 will also be significantly less expensive to implement, saving approximately \$336,000 compared to current requirements.

In view of the foregoing, the Department of the Treasury supports the enrolled bill and recommends that the President sign it into law.
