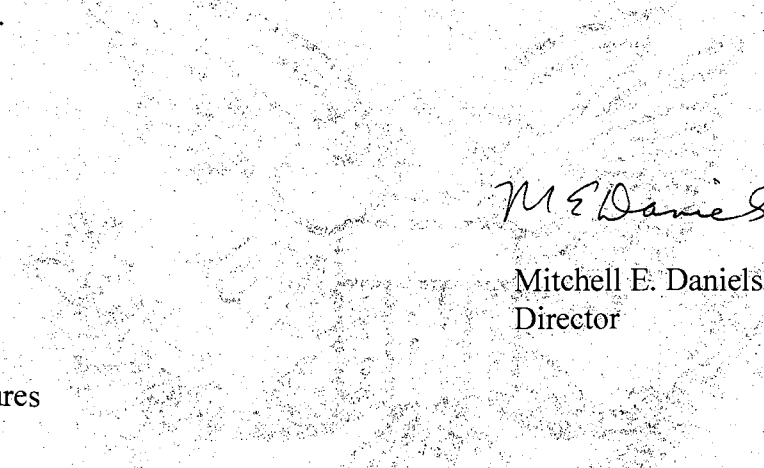
Discussion

The Federal Power Marketing Administrations (PMAs) are responsible for the operation and maintenance of critical national electricity infrastructure. In this regard, the Western Power Administration (WAPA), the Southwestern Power Administration (SWPA), and the Southeastern Power Administration (SEPA), operate approximately 18,000 miles of Federal transmission lines and 282 substations. H.R. 2924 would authorize WAPA, SWPA, and SEPA to carry out programs to reduce vandalism, theft, and destruction of property under their respective jurisdictions.

In carrying out property protection programs, WAPA, SWPA, and SEPA would be authorized by H.R. 2924 to provide rewards, including cash rewards, to individuals who provide information or evidence leading to the arrest and prosecution of individuals causing damage to, or loss of, Federal property. Cash awards paid to any individual may not exceed \$1,000. DOE has advised that the annual cost of a rewards program would not exceed \$100,000 per agency and would be absorbed within each Power Marketing Administration's existing budget.

#### Conclusion and Recommendations

In its views letter, DOE recommends approval, advising that "enactment of this legislation will enhance the security and reliability of Federal high-voltage transmission systems that are critical parts of the Nation's energy infrastructure." We join DOE in recommending the approval of H.R. 2924, which passed the House by a vote of 418-0 and the Senate by unanimous consent.

Dear Mr. Daniels:

This responds to your request for Department of Energy (DOE) views on H.R. 2924, an enrolled bill to provide authority to the Federal Power Marketing Administrations to reduce vandalism and destruction of property.

This bill gives the Southeastern Power Administration, the Southwestern Power Administration, and the Western Area Power Administration the authority to pay rewards for information or evidence leading to the arrest and prosecution of individuals causing damage to, or loss of, Federal property under their jurisdiction. The amount of any one reward is limited to \$1,000.

The Department believes that these three power marketing administrations (PMAs) need the authority to pay rewards for tips that solve, and potentially prevent, property crimes. The PMAs own thousands of miles of power transmission lines and hundreds of substations and communications sites. Many of these facilities are located in remote areas and most are unmanned. The PMAs have experienced increasing incidents of theft, vandalism, and malicious mischief at their facilities. Losses are estimated to cost the agencies and, hence, power customers of the PMAs hundreds of thousands of dollars annually.

The Bonneville Power Administration already has authority to pay rewards. Bonneville estimates it has saved almost \$4 million due to reduced vandalism (approximately \$700,000 per year) that is directly attributable to its Federal Crime Witness Program – nearly fourteen times the program's annual cost of \$50,000. The power generating agencies that operate the Federal dams from which the PMAs market power, the Department of the Interior's Bureau of Reclamation, and the Army Corps of Engineers, also have reward payment authority. This enrolled bill merely extends such authority to additional agencies of the Federal power program. The enactment of this legislation will enhance the security and reliability of Federal high-voltage transmission systems that are critical parts of the Nation's energy infrastructure.

For these reasons, the Department recommends that the President approve H.R. 2924.

An Act

To provide authority to the Federal Power Marketing Administrations to reduce vandalism and destruction of property, and for other purposes.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of  
the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

**SECTION 1. PROPERTY PROTECTION PROGRAM FOR POWER MARKETING ADMINISTRATIONS.**

The Administrators of the Western Area Power Administration, the Southwestern Power Administration, and the Southeastern Power Administration may each carry out programs to reduce vandalism, theft, and destruction of property that is under their jurisdiction.

**SEC. 2. PROVISION OF REWARDS.**

In carrying out a program under this Act, each Administrator referred to in section 1 is authorized to provide rewards (including cash rewards) to individuals who provide information or evidence leading to the arrest and prosecution of individuals causing damage to, or loss of, Federal property under their jurisdiction. The amount of any one such reward paid to any individual may not exceed a value of \$1,000.

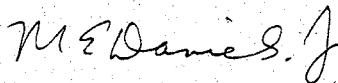
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#### Conclusion and Recommendations
