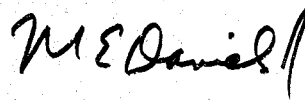

Discussion

H.R. 2261 designates the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 2853 Candler Road in Decatur, Georgia, as the "Earl T. Shinhoster Post Office".

Mr. Shinhoster was a prominent civil rights leader and Director of the NAACP's Voter Endowment Project, a national voter registration project. He served as acting Director and Chief Executive Officer of the NAACP from 1995 to 1996. Mr. Shinhoster died in June 2000 at the age of 49.

H.R. 2261 passed the House by voice vote and the Senate by unanimous consent.

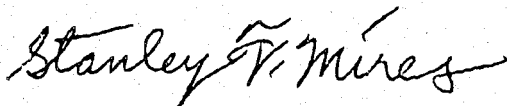
Dear Mr. Jukes:

This responds to the request for the views of the Postal Service on the following enrolled bills:

- H.R. 1766, to designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 4270 John Marr Drive in Annandale, Virginia, as the "Stan Parris Post Office Building";
- H.R. 2261, to designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 2853 Candler Road in Decatur, Georgia, as the "Earl T. Shinhoster Post Office";
- H.R. 2454, to designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 5472 Crenshaw Boulevard in Los Angeles, California, as the "Congressman Julian C. Dixon Post Office".

1. Purpose of Legislation. These bills would honor certain persons through the honorary designation of local postal facilities.
2. Position of the Postal Service. The Postal Service defers to Congress concerning the honorary designation of postal buildings for notable public figures.
3. Timing. No recommendation.
4. Cost or Savings. No information.
5. Recommendation Concerning Presidential Action. The Postal Service does not object to approval of these bills by the President.

An Act

To designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 2853 Candler Road in Decatur, Georgia, as the "Earl T. Shinhoster Post Office".

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of
the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

SECTION 1. DESIGNATION.

The facility of the United States Postal Service located at 2853 Candler Road in Decatur, Georgia, shall be known and designated as the "Earl T. Shinhoster Post Office".

SEC. 2. REFERENCES.

Any reference in a law, map, regulation, document, paper, or other record of the United States to the facility referred to in section 1 shall be deemed to be a reference to the "Earl T. Shinhoster Post Office".
