Last Day for Action

December 18, 2001 -- Tuesday

Funding for the agencies and accounts covered by the enrolled bill is currently provided under H.J. Res. 78, the seventh FY 2002 Continuing Resolution, which will expire at midnight on Friday, December 21st.

Purpose

Provides FY 2002 appropriations for the Department of Transportation, and several smaller agencies.

Discussion

Overall, the enrolled bill provides \$57.8 billion in FY 2002 discretionary budget resources, \$0.6 billion above your request and \$1.5 billion above the FY 2001 level. We will continue to work with the Congress to ensure the policy and program content of each of the thirteen appropriations bills is acceptable to you and that the bill totals are within the recently agreed upon aggregate funding level of \$686 billion.

The enrolled bill funds highway, transit, and aviation programs consistent with the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21) and the Aviation Investment and Reform Act for the 21st Century (AIR-21). It also funds a number of Administration initiatives and provides most of the funding you requested for the Coast Guard.

Through negotiations with the Congress, a compromise was reached on the Mexico-domiciled motor carriers issue that will permit cross-border trade in compliance with the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) while ensuring a high level of motor carrier safety. The compromise will require additional inspection and certification of Mexico-domiciled motor carriers prior to being granted operating authority within the United States.

The conference report on H.R. 2299 passed the House on November 30th and the Senate on December 4th by votes of 371 to 11 and 97 to 2, respectively.

Presidential Initiatives

The enrolled bill address your requests for several FY 2002 priority initiatives. The Congress provides \$140 million for the border trade and safety initiative, \$48 million above your request, to fund an expanded border inspection and certification program resulting from the successful compromise reached with the Congress on the Mexico-domiciled motor carriers issue. The Congress also fully funds the requested \$243 million for the Coast Guard to fulfill the authorization for capital investments and equipment enacted in the Western Hemisphere Drug Elimination Act.

The Congress did not provide the \$145 million you requested for the New Freedom Initiative. The Administration's proposal would have provided \$100 million for a matching grant program to promote access to alternative methods of transportation and \$45 million to carry out a pilot program that promotes innovative transportation solutions for people with disabilities.

Highways

The enrolled bill provides a total of \$32.8 billion for highway programs. The overall level of funding is \$0.5 billion above your request and \$1.2 billion above the FY 2001 enacted level and includes full funding for key highway infrastructure and safety programs. This funding provides more than \$335 million for motor carrier safety and operations, including funds devoted to commercial motor vehicle traffic facilities and operations on the U.S.-Mexico border, and \$223 million in grants for highway traffic safety programs.

Mass Transit

The enrolled bill provides an overall funding level of \$6.7 billion for mass transit programs, the same as your request and \$486 million above the FY 2001 enacted level. This funding supports \$3.5 billion in formula grants for public transit programs and \$2.9 billion in discretionary grants to build new rail systems, modernize existing systems, and purchase new buses.

Federal Aviation Administration (FAA)

The enrolled bill provides an overall funding level of \$12.9 billion for the FAA, \$21 million above your request and \$904 million above the FY 2001 enacted level. The bill includes \$6.9 billion for FAA operations, \$2.9 billion for capital modernization of the airspace system, \$3.3 billion for airport improvement grants, and \$195 million for research.

Transportation Security Administration (TSA)

The enrolled bill provides \$1.25 billion in appropriated fees to pay for starting a fully-federalized passenger and baggage screening function within this new agency. Activities to be funded include costs associated with hiring Federal passenger and baggage screeners, supervisors, armed guards, and for necessary overhead costs, activities authorized to be paid for by such fees under the Aviation and Transportation Security Act (P.L. 107-71).

Coast Guard

Coast Guard is funded at \$5.1 billion, \$123 million below your request and \$418 million above the FY 2001 enacted level. This funding provides \$3.3 billion for Coast Guard operations and \$636 million for acquisition, construction, and improvements.

Amtrak

The enrolled bill provides \$521 million for Amtrak's capital needs, consistent with the Federal commitment to fund Amtrak's "glidepath" to operational self-sufficiency by December 2002. The Amtrak Reform Council (ARC) has recently concluded that Amtrak will not reach self-sufficiency by December 2002 as required by the Amtrak reform bill enacted in 1997. Therefore, the ARC is presently drawing up a reorganization plan and Amtrak is drawing up a liquidation plan, to be submitted to Congress by February 7, 2002, as required by this law.

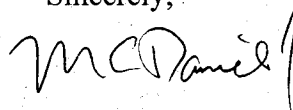
Congressional Designated Projects

The Secretary of Transportation is provided little discretion in project selection in several programs, including the Department's discretionary highway grant program and the job access and reverse commute programs, in which virtually all funding is earmarked. The Congress has earmarked almost all "non-formula" funding -- more than a thousand projects.

Recommendation

On balance, the enrolled bill provides adequate funding for your major initiatives and does not include any significant objectionable legislative provisions. The enrolled bill also abides by the agreed upon funding level for FY 2002 of \$686 billion. I join with the heads of the affected Departments and agencies in recommending that you sign H.R. 2299. A signing statement is attached for your consideration.
