Joint Resolution

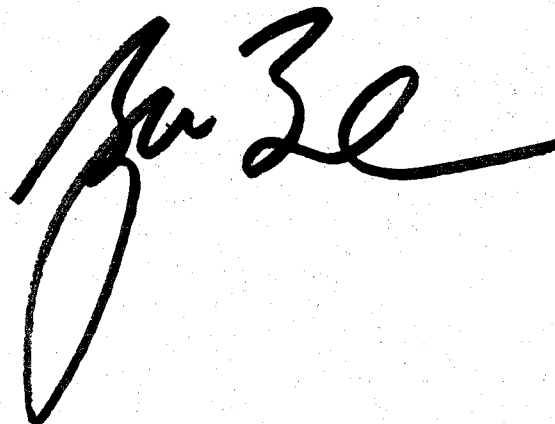
Making further continuing appropriations for the fiscal year 2002, and for other purposes.
