SUBJECT: Analysis of Senate and House Votes on Key Issues

INTRODUCTION

We have completed our second analysis of votes in the House and have done our first analysis of the Senate.

In determining levels of support for the Administration's programs in the Senate, we have identified, and used as the basis for our analysis, 27 key votes (see Appendix A). In the House, we have used 34 key votes (see Appendix B). I believe the votes used cover a sufficiently broad range of issues so that the analysis is not exaggerated in either a "conservative" or "liberal" direction.

SENATE

Using the Democratic National Committee's delineation of regions, levels of support for the Administration's program in the Senate are as follows (see Appendix C for states by regions):

Of particular interest here is that, insofar as the U. S. Senate is concerned, the Administration fares much better among Senators from the "Frostbelt" than it does among those representing the "Sunbelt".

Also, of no minor significance is the fact that Republicans in the Senate from the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic have been

as supportive of our programs as have Democrats from the Southeast and Southwest.

Among all Senate Democrats, the Administration has enjoyed a level of support of 72.9%. Among Republicans the equivalent figure is 44.2%.

Of interest here is the fact that most of those Senators who have scored at 80% or better, are among those most often characterized as "liberal."

No Republicans reached the 80% level, and only two surpassed 70% (Mathias: 75% and Hatfield: 72.7%).

At the opposite end of the spectrum, lowest levels of support have been forthcoming from Republicans, with John Tower "scoring" the least number of favorable votes -- four out of 24, or 16.7%. The Democrat with the lowest percentage of votes in support of the Administration is Robert Morgan, North Carolina, at 41.7%. Other Democrats with relatively low percentages are:

Finally, Majority Leader Robert Byrd has voted in support of the Administration's position 20 out of 26 times; his level of support is 76.9%.

As in the Senate, we find that House Democrats from the industrial Northeast and Midwest are generally more supportive of the Administration than are so-called "Sunbelt" Democrats. However, Democrats in the Far West have exhibited a slightly higher degree of support than have their counterparts in the Senate. We also find that House Republicans from the Northeast are more supportive of our efforts than are Democrats from the Southwest.

However, House Democrats have not been as supportive of our positions as have been Senate Democrats (Senate Democrats = 72.9%; House Democrats = 68.2%); and Senate Republicans have been less negative than House Republicans (Senate Republicans = 44.2%; House Republicans = 27.1%).

Viewing the House in terms of seniority or class (with "class" defined as a group entering the House in a particular year) shows some interesting differences.

The Democratic class that has voted most consistently in accord with the Administration are those of the 84th Congress, who first served in 1955. The average among this group is 80.8%. The individual percentages follow:

The Democratic class that swept into the House on Lyndon Johnson's coattails in 1964 (the 89th Congress) shows a slightly higher than average level of support at 69.0%. By way of contrast, the so-called "Watergate babies" of the 94th Congress have demonstrated a relatively high degree of support at 72.3%. Democrats first elected in 1976 are at 66.1%. Democratic Representatives who have shown the highest degree of support on the 34 key votes are:

CONCLUSIONS

Generally speaking, the Administration receives its strongest support -- in both the House and Senate -- from Democrats in the industrial Midwest to northeast areas of the country; in addition, Democrats from the Far West are also supportive.

Our weakest areas among Democrats are the Southeast and Southwest, with the latter being a particularly severe situation (62.8% in the Senate and only 39.3% in the House). Republicans from the Northeast have been more supportive than have their Democratic colleagues from the Southwest. Admittedly, the concentration on energy legislation this session has adversely affected our standing among Southwesterners but opposition from that delegation has cut across virtually every important issue during the first session of the 95th Congress.

Contrary to earlier speculation, the Administration has enjoyed considerable support from individual Senators and Congresspersons usually regarded as "liberal".

And, while the Senate has been less than enthusiastic about the Administration's energy posture during the past few weeks, negative feelings have not been as apparent on other issues. Senate Democrats and Republicans have cast a higher percentage of favorable votes than have their respective counterparts in the House.

As we develop strategy on key issues during the second session of the 95th, we should be ever mindful of where our natural strength seems to reside as well as where we need to develop increased support.
