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3rd Day Meeting

T. in response to Jackson Amodeo,

"How would you like 10 million Chinese?"

"We have quite a few - 10" would not even be noticed."

Tang responds immediately and positively to questions posed about trade, civil aviation, student exchange, etc. journalists consider arrangements

T. "We have no worries about being influenced by your student's ideology or political beliefs."

P. "Would I like to have maximum exchange of journalists - I would like to send you 10,000."

"You may know that there is a democratic wall in China where all views are expressed."

Strong appeal from P. to T. to take more Vietnamese refugees - Tang doesn't seem very interested.

P. "You nuclear testing is the atmosphere badly on my people. When you are doing that testing, it would be much better to do it underground." I know you have the technology to do it underground."

Taiwan

Center asks that Teng repeat
Taiwan assurances

"I will. What I said was said
from my responsible position. But
I cannot tie my hands as to
future."

"urge Soyuz + USA to encourage
direct PRC-Taiwan negotiations!"

"please do not create position
where Chiang Ch. Kuo can thrust
his tail up in the sky because
he fears nothing".

"2 conditions would cause us to use
force — one is if they refuse to
negotiate. — if they do, what choice
do we have? If such a state
of affairs continues over a long
period of time, what choice will
we have? Second, if Soviet Union
goes to Taiwan, we would have to
do something together!"

Hill, we would be in bad shape.

He tells Teng that if he repeated
