TALKING POINTS RE EPA-REPUBLIC STEEL ANNOUNCEMENT

1. We are here this morning to make an announcement which has great importance not only to a specific company or geographical area- which happens to be the Mahoning Valley of Ohio (commonly referred to as the Youngstown area). Nor is it only for the purpose of announcing that 6,000 or more jobs will be saved- although that is certainly very important.
2. This announcement which Doug Costle and Mr. Bill Delancey will describe, is real confirmation of the President's belief that government, the private sector, and the general "public interest" can all be served best when they cooperate quietly yet productively. President Carter believes strongly that we can have a strong steel industry, solid employment and meet our environmental standards.
3. As you all know, the steel industry has been a major topic of discussion during the last eighteen months. Last year, the President received a series of recommendations from the Solomon Task Force on the state of the industry and in response instituted several programs to assist this important sector and stabilize thousands of jobs.
4. At the same time, the Environmental Protection Agency, under Doug Costle's leadership was already taking a constructive approach to this industry and others. Contrary to some belief, EPA is not an agency only concerned with absolutes.
5. This openness and constructive approach which EPA has taken with Republic, and offers to any industry, has resulted in an historic agreement to modernize plants, retain jobs, and clean the air and water. I might add that Republic's role in this is also historic in terms of their willingness to enlist us as a true partner.

STATEMENT BY ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY ADMINISTRATOR
DOUGLAS M. COSTLE AT A WHITE HOUSE PRESS BRIEFING ON EPA'S
CLEANUP AGREEMENT WITH REPUBLIC STEEL, FRIDAY, OCTOBER 6, 1978.

I am pleased to join Mr. De Lancey, President of Republic Steel, in announcing this agreement to modernize the Company's steel plants at Warren and Youngstown, Ohio and stabilize employment in the area.

Republic has made a major commitment in this agreement to the economic and physical health of the citizens of the Mahoning Valley. In agreeing to improve these facilities, Republic is undertaking a modernization program with significant benefits for the people of Ohio and the Nation.

In the process of this modernization, Republic will be installing equipment that will bring the Warren and Youngstown plants into compliance with air and water pollution requirements by December 31, 1982. EPA applauds the farsighted and cooperative attitude of Republic Steel in working out the details of this agreement.

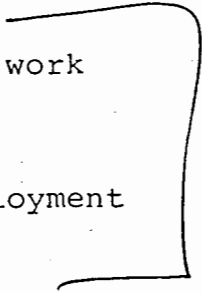
I met with Mr. De Lancey in March of this year to discuss Republic's modernization program. Following that, we were able to furnish information on environmental requirements that allowed the company to mesh its modernization plans with this substantial cleanup program.

The Steel industry accounts for 14 percent of the employment in the Mahoning Valley. We in EPA are extremely sensitive to the need for establishing environmental objectives that enhance employment opportunities. This agreement is in that category.

It makes a long term commitment to the vitality of the Mahoning Valley.

It will mean cleaner air and water for citizens in Ohio and neighboring states.

This is a significant example of our efforts to work out agreements with the steel industry for meeting pollution-control requirements that will enhance employment opportunities and long term economic growth.

REPUBLIC STEEL AGREES TO CLEANUP, NEW INVESTMENTS IN MAHONING VALLEY

The Environmental Protection Agency and Republic Steel today announced a new cleanup agreement that will modernize outdated facilities and insure continued employment for thousands of steelworkers in the Warren and Youngstown, Ohio, areas.

The agreement will mean compliance by 1982 with all present clean air and water standards.

"This agreement is a significant example of our efforts to work out agreements with the steel industry for meeting pollution-control requirements that will enhance employment opportunities and long term economic growth," said EPA Administrator Douglas M. Costle.

"Republic has made a major commitment in this agreement to the economic and physical health of the citizens of the Mahoning Valley," Costle said. "New jobs will be created and the air and water cleanup effort in Ohio will receive a significant boost."

Under the agreement, Republic will replace some steelmaking processes at the Warren and Youngstown plants as part of its modernization plan for the Mahoning Valley.

The major effect of this agreement will be considerable reduction in the amount of particulate pollution emitted by the Warren and Youngstown facilities. At present, these facilities emit approximately 2,700 tons per year of particulates. This agreement will cut these emissions by almost 50 percent to approximately 1,400 tons per year. Additional benefits relating to sulfur oxides control and water pollution control will also be achieved.

The company estimates that its modernization plan will cost about \$265.6 million over five years, through 1982.

"The cleanup investments, and other modernization expenditures, will maintain employment levels," Costle said. "This agreement affects more than 6,000 Republic steel workers and will significantly stabilize the area's economy. The steel industry directly accounts for about 14 percent of the Mahoning Valley's total employment."

Specifically, the company will build a new electric arc furnace shop, a new sinter plant, and a new hot metal desulfurization unit at Warren. It will also expand the blast furnace capacity there. A new coke battery is already under construction at Warren.

Republic will close the two existing coke batteries and the existing sinter plant at Warren and will close one coke battery and three blast furnaces at Youngstown. It will also stop the use of dirty water quenching at both plants.

Coke plant wastewater--previously used for quenching--will be treated at a new facility to be built at Warren by the end of 1981. Republic will also control the release of particulate matter into the air from its blast furnaces at Warren. This is significant because the area does not now meet health standards for particulates.

The agreement has to be approved by the States of Ohio and Pennsylvania, and the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Ohio.

Republic is the fourth largest steel producer in the United States with some 41,000 employees in 1977.

1.Q. What plants are covered by this agreement?

A. This agreement affects Republic Steel Corporation's facilities located in the neighboring communities of Warren and Youngstown, Ohio, which employ approximately 6000 - 6500 workers. Both are integrated steel mills, producing coke and pig iron, steel and some finished steel products. This agreement covers existing coke and sinter plants, basic oxygen furnaces, boilers, soaking pits, blast furnaces and coke quenching, as well as new facilities: a facility for the external desulfurization of iron, a coke battery, an electric arc furnace facility, and water treatment facilities.

2.Q. What are the key elements of the agreement?

A. Republic will proceed with its modernization plan for Mahoning Valley area. Republic will build a new electric arc shop, a new sinter plant, a new hot metal desulfurization unit, and expand the blast furnace capacity at Warren. The company will close the 2 existing sinter plants at Warren and will close one coke battery and 3 blast furnaces at Youngstown. Controls will be installed and replacements will occur such that both plants will be in full compliance with existing air pollution control requirements by December 31, 1982.

Of major environmental significance, Republic will stop the use of dirty water quenching at both plants and will treat coke plant wastewater (previously used for

quenching) at a new water treatment facility to be built at Warren by December 31, 1981. This treatment plant may be of conventional design or may use a new bio-disc concept under development at Republic. If the latter is used, EPA has tentatively agreed to provide about \$400,000 for performance evaluation work from R&D funds. Other sources of water pollution at these two plants are already on schedules to meet water quality standard requirements by July 1, 1983 and hence are not covered by this agreement.

3.Q. What is the present state of air quality in the Warren and Youngstown areas?

A. Both the Warren and Youngstown areas have ambient levels worse than the primary ambient air quality standards for TSP (75 micrograms per cubic meter annual average). The most recent readings show levels of 90 micrograms in Warren and 130 micrograms in Youngstown, substantially exceeding the health protective ambient standards. For sulfur oxides, the facilities do not appear to impact areas violating the ambient standards although the county in which they are located is designated as nonattainment.

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4.Q. What cleanup will this agreement produce?

A. The major effect of this agreement will be a considerable reduction in the amount of total suspended particulates (TSP) emitted by the Warren and Youngstown facilities. At present, these facilities emit approximately 2,700 tons per year of TSP. This agreement will cut these emissions by almost 50%, to approximately 1,400 tons per year. Additional benefits relating to sulfur oxides control and water pollution control will also be achieved.

5.Q. What is the cost of the program contemplated by this agreement?

A. The cost of the modernization program for the steel production facilities at the Youngstown and Warren plant sites is projected at \$266 million (capital cost over five years). This includes expenditures for pollution controls as well as for new production facilities. A rough estimate of the pollution control costs is \$70 - 80 million.

6.Q. What will be the impact of this program on workers in the Warren-Youngstown complex?

A. Republic has stated that employees whose jobs are affected by the Youngstown closures will be transferred to the nearby Warren facilities. No jobs should be lost.

7.Q. How do Republic's facilities compare to other steel facilities in the Mahoning Valley?

A. Of the steel facilities in the Valley, all facilities except one (Copperweld) appear to be significant violators of air pollution regulations.

With regard to water pollution, only one plant (Copperweld) is in violation of requirements. The remaining plants in the Valley, including Republic, were granted a measure of relief from national water standards in 1976, provided that Pennsylvania's water quality standards are met at the State line by July 1, 1983, and that future BAT requirements are met on time as well. Republic's plants, as well as the other plants affected by the 1976 Mahoning agreement, are now in compliance with present NPDES requirements and with the terms of the 1976 agreement.

8.Q. How are the other Republic facilities, outside the Mahoning, doing environmentally?

A. Republic, the fourth largest producer of steel in the U.S. (and tenth in the world) has major air and water pollution steel facilities in three states besides Ohio (Alabama, New York and Illinois). All these facilities are in violation of some air pollution requirements. although given the compliance record of the steel industry as a whole (only about 8% of the major air pollution steel processes are in final compliance and

another 12% are on enforceable schedules), this figure is neither surprising nor atypical. On the water pollution side, Republic's overall compliance record is 56% - slightly higher than average for the industry (about 54% in compliance).

9.Q. Why is Republic Steel willing to agree to this decree in light of the general reluctance of the steel industry to agree to compliance plans?

A. Republic would like to proceed with a substantial modernization of its steel production facilities at the Warren-Youngstown complex. This agreement provides some assurance to both the company and the Agency that this modernization will be carried out in a manner fully consistent with the requirements of presently applicable environmental laws.

10.Q. How does the agreement affect wastewater discharges from the company's plants?

A. Overall, wastewater discharges to the Mahoning will decrease. This is largely due to closures of blast furnaces as part of the company's modernization program, although a new discharge to the Mahoning will result when the company switches from "dirty water quenching" at its coke batteries to "clean water quenching".

11.Q. Will this new discharge be treated?

A. Yes. The company and EPA have agreed to limitations on the discharge which will allow the company to choose between several different treatment systems.

12.Q. What sort of water pollutants will be removed?

A. Principally cyanide, phenolic compounds, ammonia, oil and grease, and suspended solids. Other as yet unmeasured toxic pollutants will be removed as well.

13.Q. How does the agreement fit together with the "Mahoning Agreement" of 1976 which provided a measure of relief for steel plants in the Mahoning Valley, and which was subsequently remanded by the Third Circuit?

A. The Third Circuit did not remand the Mahoning decision itself, but rather the way in which it was implemented. The agreement with Republic is consistent with the "Mahoning Agreement" in that the modernization program and the treatment system at the coke plant will result in the achievement of Pennsylvania's Water Quality standards at the State line by July 1, 1983. In fact, the company will install water pollution controls at the coke plant by December 31, 1981, even earlier than otherwise would have been required.

14.Q. What about future BAT requirements for toxics or any adjustments which may be necessary in the future to protect water quality?

A. Future requirements are not affected by the agreement, and the parties explicitly recognize that future NPDES permits may contain new requirements required by the law.

15.Q. What's the inflationary impact of this agreement?

A. The overall effect of the modernization and clean-up program will be more efficient production of steel. The result should be an economic benefit.

16.Q. Has there been White House or Bob Strauss pressure to reach this agreement?

A. None whatsoever. The negotiations were conducted entirely by EPA staff. I have talked frequently with Mr. DeLancy. The entire process was carried out in the same manner as any other industry negotiation.

17.Q. Was this agreement influenced by the Solomon Task Force report?

A. No. The agreement is consistent with the recommendations of the Task Force Report in that it provides environmental cleanup while modernizing and improving steel production facilities. But the Report did not influence this case. and no members of the Task Force were involved in producing the agreement.

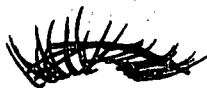

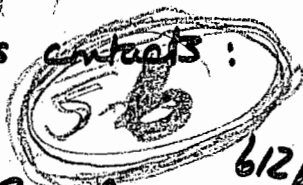
