THE INTERVIEW WITH MRS. JIMMY CARTER

(American Home Life as told by Mrs. Jimmy Carter)

Topics: The first lady's home management, home education, maintenance of family health, treatment of guests. Her views on the present life, the role to be played as a President's wife, etc.

On the occasion of the previous interview, we were deeply impressed by Mrs. Carter's frank attitude and we felt ourselves at home. We do hope to have the interview again in such a homely atmosphere.

Since the first issue was published in 1917, "SHUFUNOTOMO" has enjoyed the position of the leading women's magazine in Japan for the past 61 years. As a home journal it covers most aspects of our daily lives, including feature stories, fashion, cookery, housing and so on. The ages of the readers are between 23 and 35 and most of them are housewives of the middle class.

The print run of the January 1979 issue will be 1,700,000 copies and it will be published on December 14, 1978.

Kyoko Fukao, Interviewer

Born on December 6, 1929. Graduated from Tokyo Women's University in 1951. Entered Shufunotomo Co., Ltd. in 1954 after three years of experience in teaching. She is now the Assistant Editor of Shufunotomo.

For the past 20 years, she has been in charge of reportage, interviews, feature articles on our daily lives.

She accompanied the representatives of Mr. Shinich Suzuki's school to attend the U.S.-Japan joint concert held in April this year. She also attended the reception by Mrs. Carter.

She is a regular lecturer on a TV program regarding ceremonial occasions such as wedding and funeral.

N.B. Kyoko Fukao is a pen name. Her real name is Kyoko Tsuchiya.

After conversations with Sarah Shuptrine in the Governor's office, Lila Bradham, executive director of the South Carolina Mental Health Association, and Carol Garvin, a member of the Board of Directors who is acting as the coordinator for the visit, we have tentatively agreed on the following schedule:

11:00 AM Mrs. Carter departs Governor's Mansion
for grounds of South Carolina State Hospital.

11:10 AM Arrive state hospital

Mary has suggested we arrange a photo opp.
in suitable place that says "mental health"
for arrival

Mrs. Carter proceeds to William S. Hall Psychiatric
Institute on grounds of the State Hospital.

She is taken on a short tour of the Institute
and briefed along the way on the advantages of
having training and research center connected
with the State Hospital.

She will be accompanied by Dr. Hall, Commissioner
of Mental Health Services for the state as
well as a few representatives of the MHA.

11:25 AM Mrs. Carter proceeds to the Forum, (auditorium
in the Institute that holds about 200)
where a board meeting of the Mental Health
Association will be in progress.

Mrs. Carter will speak 5-7 minutes about the
status of the Mental Health Systems Act and
what it means to South Carolina.

The President of the MHA and the legislative
chairman will then tell her about

their priorities and activities in S.C.

Carol Garvin has suggested that the board members might like to ask Mrs. Carter a few questions and I need to discuss this with Mary.

11:45 AM

Mrs. Carter leaves the Institute. Mary has suggested we may want to arrange a brief press opportunity as she leaves the grounds of the Hospital so she can say a few words about what she has learned.

11:50 AM

Depart for luncheon

The contact for this event is Carol Garvin 803-648-1279. She does not live in Columbia, so our advance will have to check with her before they go down to see when is a convenient time for her to come to the city to go over the event.

The sponsor for the event is the Mental Health Association of South Carolina.

THANK YOU. IT IS A SPECIAL PLEASURE FOR ME TO BE HERE WITH YOU THIS MORNING. I AM A MEMBER OF THE MENTAL HEALTH ASSOCIATION AND HAVE BEEN FOR YEARS. I HAVE THE GREATEST RESPECT AND ADMIRATION FOR ALL YOU DO AT THE LOCAL LEVEL TO ADDRESS THE NEEDS OF THOSE WHO SUFFER FROM MENTAL AND EMOTIONAL DISORDERS,

AS YOU KNOW, FOR THE LAST SEVERAL YEARS I HAVE TRIED TO SERVE AS AN ADVOCATE FOR BETTER MENTAL HEALTH CARE WITHIN THE CARTER ADMINISTRATION, WITH CONGRESS AND WITH THE AMERICAN PEOPLE.

AND, I THINK I HAVE MET WITH SOME SUCCESS, LARGELY BECAUSE PRIVATE CITIZENS, DEDICATED INDIVIDUALS LIKE YOU, HAVE BEEN WILLING TO HELP ME,

THEN, IN MARCH I INVITED MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE SUBCOMMITTEE ON HEALTH AND THE ENVIRONMENT TO THE WHITE HOUSE TO BRIEF THEM. THEY WERE VERY ENTHUSIASTIC, TOO.

OVER THE LAST YEAR I HAVE MET REGULARLY WITH OFFICIALS FROM THE OFFICE OF MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET, THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, EDUCATION AND WELFARE AND THE DOMESTIC POLICY STAFF TO SEE THAT THE ADMINISTRATION IS DOING EVERYTHING POSSIBLE TO IMPLEMENT OUR RECOMMENDATIONS. JUST LAST WEEK I DISCUSSED OUR GOALS WITH SECRETARY HARRIS.

I AM VERY PLEASED BY WHAT WE HAVE ACCOMPLISHED AND ESPECIALLY PROUD OF NEW LEGISLATION NOW BEFORE CONGRESS WHICH WILL BRING ABOUT CRUCIAL CHANGES IN FEDERAL MENTAL HEALTH POLICY -- THE MENTAL HEALTH SYSTEMS ACT.

Sioux Falls, South Dakota

Governor Harvey Wollman - Harvey Wollman was sworn in as South Dakota's 26th Governor on July 24, 1978. Wollman, previously the Lt. Governor, became Governor after the resignation of Richard Kneip. Kneip was sworn in as the U.S. Ambassador to Singapore at the end of July.

Prior to becoming Governor, Wollman served in the South Dakota Senate and was elected the Senate Majority Leader in 1972. Governor Wollman lost his primary bid in June to Roger McKellips.

Roger McKellips, Candidate for Governor - State Senator and Candidate for Governor McKellips is a lifelong resident of Alcester, South Dakota. McKellips was elected to the state senate in 1976. In 1977 he received the Outstanding Legislator Award. McKellips has been active in community betterment projects for many years.

Don Barnett, Candidate for the U.S. Senate - Don Barnett was Mayor of Rapid City from 1971 - 1975. He declined to run a third term and worked in private industry after leaving city government. A former Professor of American Government at the University of Nebraska, Barnett is the Democratic Candidate for the U.S. Senate.

Tom Daschle, Candidate for Congress, First District - Daschle is a former Legislative Director for Senator James Abourezk. In 1976, he became Senator Abourezk's Eastern South Dakota Staff Director. He and his wife Laurie have two children.

Bob Samuelson, Candidate for Congress, Second District - Bob Samuelson operates, in partnership with his brother, a ranch in eastern Montana. A native of South Dakota, he is the former Vice Chairman of the Meat Promoters of South Dakota.

Topeka, Kansas

John Carlin, Candidate for Governor - John Carlin, former Speaker of the Kansas House of Representatives, was the first Democrat elected to serve as Speaker in 64 years. Elected to the Kansas House in 1970, he has served on The Agriculture and Livestock Committee and Chairman of the Water Resources Board. He is a fourth generation farmer still residing on a farm which was homesteaded by his mother's family.

Tallahassee, Florida

Bob Graham, Candidate for Governor - Graham, a member of the Florida State Senate is a native of Coral Gables, Florida. He served in the Florida House of Representatives from 1966 - 1970 and was elected to the Senate in 1970. Bob Graham is a Phi Beta Kappa from Harvard Law School.

Wayne Mixson, Candidate for Lt. Governor - State Representative Mixson is a farmer, businessman and a legislative leader from the Florida panhandle town of Marianna. A legislator since 1967, Mixson has built a respected reputation as an advocate for a strong agricultural economy.

Orlando, Florida

David Best, Candidate for Congress - At 39, David Best is adding a new dimension to a career which has taken him from school teacher to a successful law practice in Orlando. After graduating from Florida State University, he worked as a math teacher in the Orlando school system. He served on the staff of the National Security Agency in Washington until January, 1969.

Atlanta, Georgia

Virginia Shapard, Candidate for Congress - State Senator Shapard was elected to the Georgia State Senate in 1974. She is Chairwoman of the Joint Study Committee on Services for the Aging and is a member of the Committee on Services for the Aging. In 1976, Senator Shapard was appointed to the White House Conference on the Handicapped.

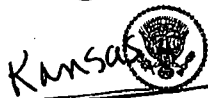
