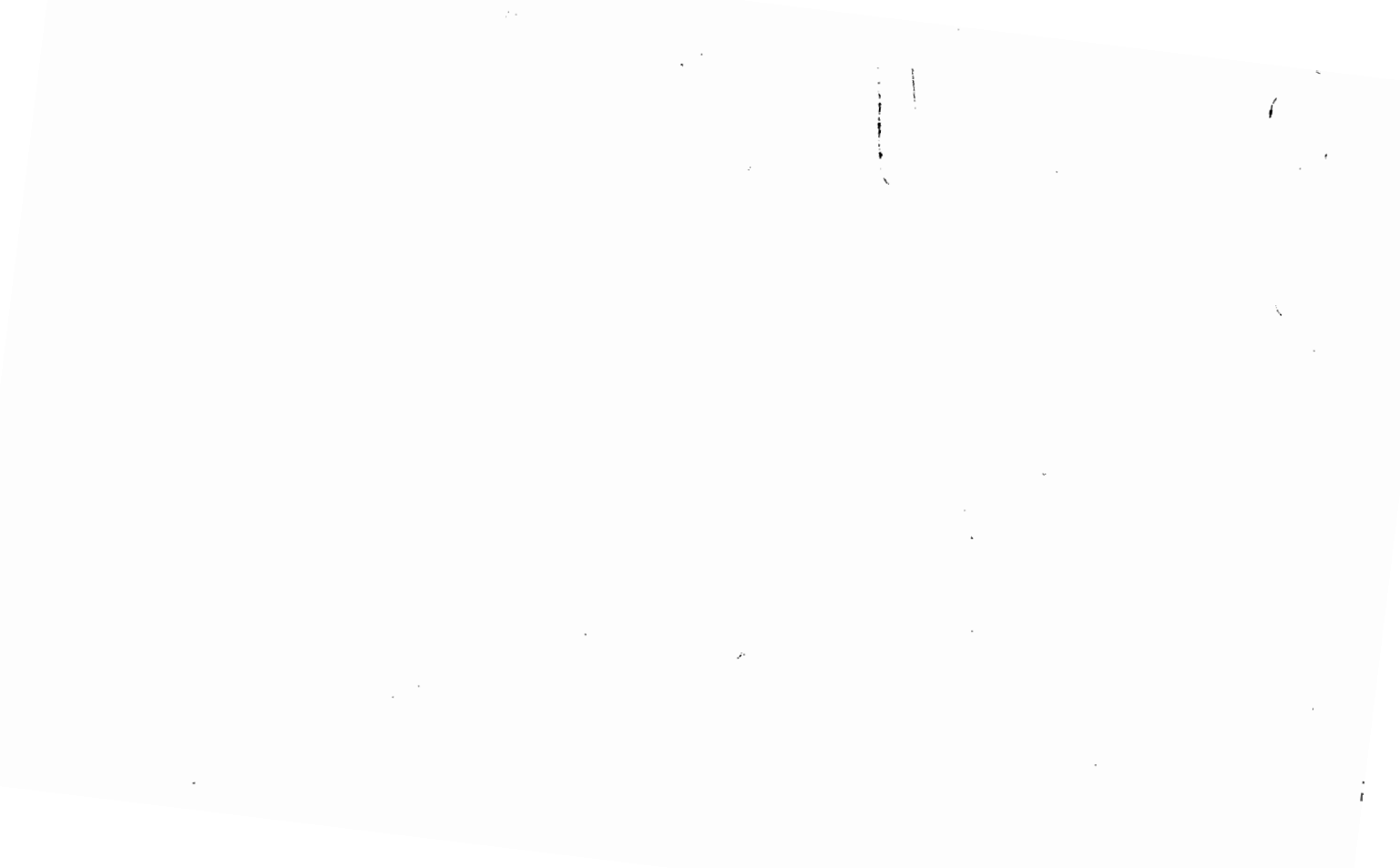

Woodburning Stoves

The acceptance of this stove is the culmination of a process that began with the President's speech in Iowa in May, 1979, in which he announced that he intended to install a modern woodburning stove in the White House.

"I grew up with woodburning stoves and open fireplaces, but the new designs of stoves are absolutely remarkable. They burn not only wood, but the gases from the wood. They are highly efficient, have automatic thermostats and two or three oak logs or hard wood logs will last for as long as 8 or 10 hours. By the way, I intend to install one quite soon, before the next winter, in the White House, and I will be using it next winter."

The stove being accepted today is one of six selected from over fifty that were offered. The six selected are all American made, all meet prescribed safety standards and represent a cross section of the types of wood stoves available and the geographic location of their manufacturers.

Over one million American homes currently use wood as a primary fuel, and several million more use wood for supplemental heat. By 1985, it is estimated that 10 to 15 million homes may use modern woodburning systems. Thus, woodburning stoves can make a significant contribution to alleviating our dependence on non-renewable fossil fuels.

The six stoves accepted will be installed in the White House and at Camp David within approximately a month.

The selection of the stoves in no way implies any endorsement of superiority of these particular models or suppliers. In fact, most of the stoves so generously offered were comparable and might have been accepted if more were to be installed.

Carpenter Center

The Carpenter Center, formally the Carpenter Hotel, was purchased by the Catholic Diocese of Manchester in June, 1977, and turned into a senior citizen home. Self-sufficient older adults now live in the Center and participate in a variety of educational, cultural and recreational programs. The center provides three meals a day for the residents and now serves as the central site for Manchester's "Meals on Wheels" program.

Usually, 150 senior citizens from the Center and the surrounding community arrive each deal for the noon meal. The program is directed by Sister Eileen Otting, Executive Director, St. Joseph's Hospital, Community Relations Program.

PRESENTATION IN NASHUA, NEW HAMPSHIRE

The following is supplemental to the Fact Sheet provided, but is not for dissemination.

- Both Congressman D'Armours and the Abundant Life Company (Dr. Bruce Brown, President) are co-donors of the stove. They both give the other credit for the donation.
- We have eliminated reference to the Abundant Life Company's name from the Fact Sheet to avoid offending the other five companies and individuals whose stoves are also being accepted, as well as the more than 45 others whose offers are being turned down. (All will have been notified.)

Also, we are particularly trying to avoid any implication of commercial endorsement of any one firm or stove, which mention of individual company names could imply.

- Since 4 of the 6 stoves being accepted are scheduled to be installed at Camp David and only two at the White House, we have been trying to avoid stating explicitly that the stoves are going to be used "in the White House", or saying where any particular one will be used.

(The one being accepted in ~~Nashua~~ is scheduled to go to Camp David.)

- We have noted a tendency of the National Press to treat the subject of woodburning stoves with some flippancy, sometimes treating it as a gimmick.

Whenever possible it would be helpful to emphasize that modern woodburning stoves are serious heating systems and can make a significant contribution to the energy needs of the country.

WOODBURNING STOVES

On Wednesday morning, September 12, 1979, the First Lady will accept a woodburning stove which has been offered to the President and the White House through Congressman Norman D'Armours (Democratic, New Hampshire).

The presentation will take place at ~~approximately 11:55 A.M.~~ at the Federal Building in Nashua, New Hampshire.

Persons present will include Congressman D'Armours; Dr. Bruce Brown, President of the company manufacturing and donating the stove, and Mr. Kristopher Kessler, Sales Manager of the company.

The acceptance of this stove is the culmination of a process that began with the President's speech in Iowa in May, 1979, in which he announced that he intended to install a modern woodburning stove in the White House (an excerpt of that speech is attached).

The stove being accepted is one of six selected from over fifty that were offered. The six selected are all American made, all meet prescribed safety standards and represent a cross section of the types of wood stoves available and the geographic location of their manufacturers.

The selection of these six stoves in no way implies any endorsement or superiority of these particular models or suppliers. In fact, most of the stoves so generously offered were comparable and might have been accepted if more were to be installed.

The six stoves accepted will be installed in Camp David and the White House within approximately a month.

The reason for installing these stoves is to draw national attention to the fact that for millions of Americans, modern woodburning stoves are or could be more economical than conventional heating systems. In addition, wood is a fuel which can be regenerated here in this country in a matter of years, and is not susceptible to any external influences on its cost or availability.

Over one million American homes currently use wood as a primary fuel, and several millions more use wood for supplemental heat. By 1985, it is estimated that 10 to 15 million homes may use modern woodburning systems. Thus, woodburning stoves can make a significant contribution to alleviating our dependence on non-renewable fossil fuels.

Woodburning Stove Installation

Today the President announced that he has accepted several woodburning stoves for use at the White House and Camp David. The stoves were selected as a representative sample of woodburning appliances offered by over fifty constituents from across the nation in response to the President's commitment to the development and utilization of renewable energy resources.

Presidential speech, Iowa, May 4, 1979:

"I grew up with woodburning stoves and open fireplaces, but the new designs of stoves are absolutely remarkable. They burn not only the wood, but the gases from the wood. They are highly efficient, have automatic thermostats and two or three oak logs or hard wood logs will last for as long as 8 or 10 hours. By the way, I intend to install one quite soon, before next winter, in the White House, and I will be using it next winter".

The growing interest in woodburning stoves reflects the increased efficiencies of airtight seams and secondary combustion baffling of the new models. Burn rates can be controlled through thermostats or manual dampers to a far greater degree than in the past.

Wood heat can be economical for many families throughout the country. In a recent study, there were families in New England who would be better off heating with wood at \$80 per cord than with oil at \$.53 per gallon or better off heating wood at \$111 per cord than with liquified petroleum gas at \$.55 per gallon, or better off heating wood at an incredible \$364 per cord than with electricity at \$.09 per kilowatt hour. A family must determine the kind of woodburner they propose to use, the type of wood available, the cost of the current heating fuels, and the comparative efficiencies of heating devices in order to determine the existence or extent of savings. Wood must cost less than the fossil fuel it replaces in order to save money. As fossil fuel prices rise sharply, the price edge of wood becomes more significant.

For instance, 750,000 Americans bought wood stoves last year, a very good move in the right direction. THE PRESIDENT: I didn't say I was going to buy it. (Laughter) One of the stove manufacturers -- (Laughter) -- sent a letter to one of the United States Senators and said they had a stove that they would like to contribute to the American people to be used in the White House or at Camp David. And I have asked for further information about it. And I intend to install it, depending on its configuration and so forth, either in one of the rooms where we live or perhaps in my private office in the West Wing. But this is a contribution to the American people and I might hasten to add that when I leave the White House, the stove will stay there. (Laughter)
