Every American feels anger at what is happening, and every American feels concern for the safety and pride for the great courage of those being held hostage.

We are using all diplomatic means to resolve this crisis and the President has acted firmly to protect our interests. He has made it clear that the Iranians will be held accountable for their actions -- and that the United States of America will not yield to terrorism or blackmail.

I am proud of Jimmy because he has had the courage to face the politically difficult, long-ignored realities of our energy needs. This is not the time for timid, half-steps. We might not understand how we got into this mess, but we do know we must get out of it. It is not a time for political expediency either.

It might be politically attractive to talk about policies of cheaper energy, cheaper heating oil, cheaper gasoline-- or to say that we need to study the situation for another few years or to say that slapping controls on oil prices is the answer.

The truth is that these are irresponsible measures that will lead to more waste, more demand for imported oil, more dependence on foreign countries, more inflation and more unemployment -- in short, a weaker America.

For three years, Jimmy Carter has talked sense to the American people. People have heard something that has long been lacking from our nation's leadership - the truth. This President believes that to succeed in the 1980's we need more, not less, of the hard truth. The times are gone when our country can put off till tomorrow what needs to be done today. The times are gone when our country can pursue

programs attuned to the 60's, instead of the 80's, The times are gone when we can spend ourselves out of every problem. We must continue to face up to the issues of the day.

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Remarks of Joan Mondale  
New Hampshire  
Thursday, November 29, 1979

I love coming to New Hampshire! The last time I was here I had an opportunity to see some of the extraordinary work of your artists and craftspeople. I feel fortunate to have several pieces on loan to the Vice President's House from the Currier Gallery in Manchester and the University Museum at Dartmouth. I hate to admit it -- but your New Hampshire artists rival those in Minnesota.

Actually, New Hampshire is a lot like my home state of Minnesota. Just like you, we have mountains to ski and lakes to fish...beautiful springs, magnificent summers and falls. And we both have long, tough winters. And the citizens of both of our states are serious, issue-oriented voters. These are some of the reasons it's a pleasure to be in New Hampshire today to campaign for President Carter and for my husband, Fritz Mondale.

But I did not come here today to give you my analysis of all the problems facing this country. You know I am not an expert on energy, or inflation, or foreign policy. I react to those problems just the way you do. I am angry about Iran, anxious about inflation, and afraid of our dependence on foreign sources for energy.

In the last three years, I have spent most of my time working on the arts and the humanities because that's what I know best.

But also in the last three years, my husband and I have spent a lot of time with some people named Jimmy and Rosalynn Carter. And it is that experience I want to tell you about.

When I look back over the past few years, I see a President who has taken on the whole unfinished agenda of our nation. Let's face it: all the toughest problems of a generation have come home to roost.

Our energy problems must certainly rank among the most complex questions of public policy that any people have ever faced. The crisis in Iran brings home a very important lesson: our dependence on foreign oil is a great danger to our national security -- and to our freedom.

We import half of our oil, and the cost of that oil has increased 10-fold in 7 years. It is the single most important cause of inflation.

Like you, we Minnesotans have long, cold winters and we worry about the cost of home heating oil. But price controls are not an answer.

The fact is they are a cheap ticket toward more energy waste, more demand for imported oil, more dependence on foreign suppliers like Iran, more inflation and more unemployment -- and, in short: a weaker America.

Anyone who says that we can continue price controls and cut imports is not doing you or me -- or future generations -- any favors.

H.L. Mencken once said: "for every complex problem, there is a simple solution, and it's usually wrong."

President Carter and my husband are facing the problems of energy and inflation head-on, without promising fast, easy, false solutions. I call that courage. The courage to exert leadership when problems are large, solutions distant, and the road ahead difficult.

And I am glad we have a President and a Vice President who have that courage.

MEMORANDUM TO THE FIRST LADY

From: Bob Rackleff

Subject: Talking Points for New Hampshire events

1. This has been one of the most trying months in our nation's history. Terrorists, supported by the Iranian government, hold some 50 Americans hostage. It is an outrage, totally outside the bounds of international law, for the whole world to see.

2. But also for the world to see is this nation acting with restraint, with resolve, with courage, and with measured action. The American people stand as one in this crisis. We are using all diplomatic means to resolve this, and the President has acted firmly to protect our interests and ensure justice:

- o First, to head off potential violence, he has discouraged issuing permits for demonstrations on Federal property in Washington.
- o Second, the President has directed immigration authorities to review the visas of some 50,000 Iranian students in the U.S. We will protect legal rights, but those here illegally will be processed promptly for deportation.
- o Third, he ordered an immediate and total halt to any purchases or shipments of Iranian oil here. We will not trade our deeply-held principles for oil from any foreign country.
- o Fourth, to ensure that claims are settled properly, the President has frozen all official Iranian property and assets in this country.
- o Fifth, he has declared that, in accordance with the principle of inviolability of embassies, we hold the Iranian government and its leaders fully accountable for the safety and well-being of our representatives in Tehran.

- o Finally, the President has warned that Iran faces extremely grave consequences if any of the hostages are harmed. To back that up, U.S. naval units are in the area.

3. In short, the President has made it clear that the actions of Iranian leaders and the radicals who invaded the embassy are an outrage -- and that the United States of America will not yield to terrorism or blackmail.

4. I am proud of the President for his leadership. I am proud of the restraint and firmness of the American people. And I am especially proud of the quiet courage of the Embassy personnel undergoing this terrible ordeal.

5. *People are ready - unified approach*  
This crisis brings home a very important lesson: Our dependence on foreign oil is a clear and present danger to our national security. Our freedom is at stake. We import half of our oil, often from countries with unstable and unpredictable policies. The cost of oil imports has increased 10-fold in seven years. Next year, we expect to pay \$70 billion for imported oil; in 1973, it was about \$7 billion. It is the single most important cause for inflation.

6. If we are serious about our national security, our economic health, our freedom, we must immediately cut down oil imports. That means two things: Conserve energy in every conceivable way, and produce more energy in America.

7. Yet there is a possibility that Congress will adjourn next month without passing the energy legislation this country needs -- measures the President sent to Congress this summer. Congress passed two important measures. One gave the President authority for emergency gas rationing and for setting state-by-state conservation targets.

8. Another, which the President signed this week, provides \$1.3 billion to low-income people to pay fuel bills this winter. That is in addition to \$250 million in aid already on its way to the states. The President is determined that people with high heating costs not have to choose between heating their homes and putting food on the table. He saw to it that adequate supplies of home heating oil would be available, especially in New England, and he is seeing to it that people get help to pay the cost.

9. However, Congress has not yet acted on three critical proposals by the President:

- a) First, we must have an energy mobilization board to cut red tape and build necessary energy projects.

Second, we must have a massive new effort to conserve energy nationwide, to expand solar energy and other alternatives, and to build a synthetic fuels industry.

- o Third, and most important, this country needs a windfall profits tax to finance our transition toward energy security for America.

10. These three measures are close to passage in Congress. But special interests, and I mean the oil companies, are fighting to stop us. They can stop us. They can win -- unless you and the rest of the country support the President and make it absolutely clear where you stand -- for an energy future secure from the whims and threats of foreign governments.

11. Let me add this. Like you, I am concerned about the prices consumers must pay for energy. But do not think that price controls are an answer. In fact, they are a cheap ticket toward more energy waste, more demand for imported oil, more dependence on foreign suppliers, more inflation and unemployment -- in short, a weaker America. Someone who says that we can continue price controls and cut imports is not doing you, or future generations, any favors.

12. The plain fact is that we have a sound energy future within our reach. We need Congress to act before it adjourns. So I ask you to make your views known loud and clear. And with your your help, we can make that start, beginning today.

Suggested Idea for Airport Greeting:

I am happy to be here today in New Hampshire and I want to take the opportunity to introduce you to my traveling companions. Mrs. Mondale, "Miss" Lillian. Judy. Each of us will be taking off separately, in different directions, to visit with old friends, and to make new ones and to bring the people of New Hampshire an important message from the President of the United States.

We are here today to talk about the critical necessity of passing the Carter Administration's energy bill immediately. The shocking situation in Iran has brought this whole problem of our dependence on foreign oil into sharp focus. And my husband feels that Congress must follow the lead of the American people--he believes that they are ready--and asking for--energy security and freedom.

We must extricate ourselves from our reliance on foreign oil. It weakens our nation. It weakens our economy.

We must extricate ourselves from the grip of the big oil companies. They are intimidating Congress and holding back progress for our people.

We must not be misled by thinking that putting price controls on oil will solve inflation, as has been suggested, when the problem lies with the skyrocketing prices of imports set by foreign countries--and inadequate supplies here at home.

Each of us here today will be looking forward to hearing New Hampshire views about this national problem. We think you know more about it than many people in the country, and we are proud of your sacrifice and your confidence in the future.

Mrs. Mondale and Miss Lillian and Judy and I will be answering as many questions as we can today while we are having coffee--and we will be taking back messages from New Hampshire to the President and the Vice President. We will be happy to answer your questions here now.

SUBJECT: Windfall Profits Tax Talking Points

Decisive debate on the Administration's proposal for a windfall profits tax on the oil companies will take place on the Senate floor next week.

As you know, the Senate Finance Committee has considerably weakened the tax and we will be fighting to remove many of the exemptions and credits which would cut revenues in half. We oppose these exemptions both as a matter of fairness and because of the amount of revenue that would be lost--revenue that is needed for alternative energy development, low income assistance and mass transit.

I hope you will take every opportunity to speak out on behalf of Senate efforts to amend the committee version of the tax and bring it back into line with what the President proposed.

## WINDFALL PROFITS TAX -- Talking Points

### Why are there windfall profits?

--The phased removal of price controls on domestically produced crude oil will mean a one trillion dollar increase in gross oil company revenues during the next ten years as the price of domestic oil rises to world prices.

--Increases in world oil prices will be determined by the actions of the foreign oil cartel, over which we have no control and whose decisions are unrelated to the cost of exploration and production in the U.S.

### What is the windfall profits tax?

--The windfall profits tax will recapture a portion of the unearned oil company profits, which will then be used for three major purposes the private sector could not be expected to undertake without government incentives or support: alternative energy development; low income assistance; and mass transit.

--The tax is applied to the difference between the controlled price of certain categories of domestic crude oil and the price the producer actually receives on the world market. It is a tax on the oil companies, not on the oil consumer.

--The version of the tax we support would return \$277 billion in tax revenues between now and 1990. The oil companies would retain over \$150 billion which they could invest in new production.

### The issues before the Senate

--The Senate Finance Committee has reported a bill which cuts the windfall profits tax revenues in half -- by \$138 billion over ten years. At the same time, the committee has accepted the basic premise of the tax, ie., that the oil companies should not be allowed to keep all of their windfall profits.

--The House-passed version of the tax is very close to the President's original proposal. We support Senate floor amendments to eliminate exemptions and credits added by the Senate Finance Committee.

## The Senate Finance Committee Bill

--Exempts newly discovered oil from the windfall profits tax, with a revenue loss of \$71 billion over ten years. This will be the hardest exception to eliminate, even though it is the most costly.

--Exempts "incremental tertiary recovery" oil -- oil produced by extra-ordinary means from wells that have yielded all the oil available from normal production methods - with a revenue loss of \$27 billion.

--Exempts certain "stripper well" production, with a revenue loss of \$16 billion. Stripper wells average no more than ten barrels per day of production.

--We oppose these exemptions. The loss of revenue is not justified by the marginal amount of increased oil production that will result from letting the oil companies keep these windfall profits. Calculated in terms of lost revenue, we estimate the cost of each new barrel produced as a result of these exemptions of range from \$59 to \$100. The exemptions would drastically reduce the funds available for alternative energy production, mass transit and low income assistance.

--The committee bill also phases out the tax after \$127.5 billion in net revenues have been collected. We believe that the tax is justified both to recapture a portion of unearned profits and to fund needed programs that will contribute to our energy security. It is impossible to predict when those needs will be met, so we oppose a cap.

--We also oppose allowing producers a percentage depletion on their windfall profits. The Senate Finance Committee bill would give the companies a double windfall: one from decontrol and excessive world oil price increases; and another from unearned increases in their depletion allowance.

--We will support amendments on the Senate floor to eliminate most of the committee exemptions and to toughen the tax on the oil companies. We don't believe Congress should throw away needed revenues when the result will be no significant gain in domestic production.

## The impact of Iran

--The Iranian situation makes it clear that we must produce domestic energy resources (supported by windfall profits tax revenues) which will protect us from political turmoil and the arbitrary actions of the foreign oil cartel.

--Most of the production incentives from decontrol will not be felt until the late 1980s, so the Committee exemptions would not increase production in a way that would help the present situation.

Remarks of the First Lady  
New Hampshire

It's wonderful to be back in New Hampshire. As some of you may know, I came here today with Joan Mondale, and Jimmy's mother and my daughter-in-law, Judy. We made up a map of our day -- and you should see how we are blitzing the state in six counties and 21 communities. On the way up we talked about visiting old friends, making new ones, and about a special message we are carrying from the President.

He sends his love. But he also sent us here to ask you for your support at this very critical time in our national history.

The past few weeks have been the most difficult of his Presidency. Indeed, they have been some of the most trying weeks in our nation's history. Terrorists, half a world away, are holding Americans hostage, supported by their government.

This action is an outrage, totally outside the bonds of international law -- and for the whole world to see. But also for the world to see is this nation and our President acting with calmness, with courage, and with measured action.

Every American feels anger at what is happening, and every American feels concern for the safety and pride for the great courage of those being held hostage.

We are using all diplomatic means to resolve this crisis and the President has acted firmly to protect our interests. He has made it clear that the Iranians will be held accountable for their actions -- and that the United States of America will not yield to terrorism or blackmail.

I am proud of the President for his leadership. I am proud of the restraint of the American people. And I am especially proud of the quiet courage of the embassy personnel undergoing this terrible ordeal.

This crisis has brought home a very important lesson: our dependence on foreign oil is a clear and present danger to our national security. And we must have a clear, comprehensive energy ~~policy~~ program for our country.

Jimmy has been working in a concentrated, persistent way ever since he has been President to develop a good energy program. Last year we made progress, and this year Congress has passed two important measures that the President has asked for --

— One gave emergency gas rationing authority and authority to set state by state conservation targets. Another, which the President signed this week provides funds to low-income people to help pay their fuel bills this winter. *1 study*

The President is determined that people with high heating costs not have to choose between heating their homes and putting food on the table. He saw to it that adequate supplies of home heating oil would be available, especially in New England, and he is seeing to it that people get help to pay the cost.

However, Congress has not acted on all the proposals. And Congress must not adjourn next month without passing key energy legislation this country needs.

One bill we must have is the Windfall Profits Tax. This tax will return to the public funds which would otherwise go to the oil companies. We will have increased funds for mass transit, for conservation, for solar and other alternative energy research and development. *med help - write Senators*

It is essential that a strong tax be passed so that the people will reap the benefits of the profits on oil rather than the oil companies. My husband has asked for a strong Windfall Profits Tax and the House passed a strong bill. The weakest version of the tax is the one that is now being proposed by the United States Senate. *strong windfall*

I urge you to write your Senators and those in your neighboring states and ask them to support the strong Windfall Profits Tax bill my husband has proposed -- for the good of the country. *When public aroused, that's when things happen.*

If we are serious about our national security, our economic health, our freedom, we must take steps necessary to reduce our dependence on foreign oil - and to reduce inflation. Imported oil is the single most important cause of inflation. We import 1/2 of all the oil we use from foreign countries -- and we have no control over the price of OPEC oil. It has increased 10-fold in the last 7 years. The price has increased 65% since last December, and if OPEC raises prices again, oil prices will go up again.

I felt today that I had to talk with you about energy, because there have been so many mis-representations of my husband's record -- and the facts concerning energy.

There are other facts I would like to point out.

- 1) My husband did not decontrol home heating oil. Former President Ford decontrolled home heating oil, and the Senator from Massachusetts voted for it. (*appl. laezy*)
- 2) Jimmy has had the executives of major oil companies to the White House to ask them to provide adequate home heating oil for the New England states and to hold prices down. I am proud of Jimmy because he has had the courage to face the politically difficult, long-ignored realities of our energy needs. This is not the time for timid, half-steps. We might not understand how we got into this mess, but we do know we must get out of it. It is not a time for political expediency either.

It might be politically attractive to talk about policies of cheaper energy, cheaper heating oil, cheaper gasoline-- or to say that we need to study the situation for another few years -- or to say that slapping controls on oil prices is the answer.

The truth is that these are irresponsible measures that will lead to more waste, more demand for imported oil, more dependence on foreign countries, more inflation and more unemployment -- in short, a weaker America.

- o Finally, the President has warned that Iran faces extremely grave consequences if any of the hostages are harmed. To back that up, U.S. naval units are in the area.

3. In short, the President has made it clear that the actions of Iranian leaders and the radicals who invaded the embassy are an outrage -- and that the United States of America will not yield to terrorism or blackmail.

4. I am proud of the President for his leadership. I am proud of the restraint and firmness of the American people. And I am especially proud of the quiet courage of the Embassy personnel undergoing this terrible ordeal.

5. This crisis brings home a very important lesson: Our dependence on foreign oil is a clear and present danger to our national security. Our freedom is at stake. We import half of our oil, often from countries with unstable and unpredictable policies. The cost of oil imports has increased 10-fold in seven years. Next year, we expect to pay \$70 billion for imported oil; in 1973, it was about \$7 billion. It is the single most important cause for inflation.

6. If we are serious about our national security, our economic health, our freedom, we must immediately cut down oil imports. That means two things: Conserve energy in every conceivable way, and produce more energy in America.

7. Yet there is a possibility that Congress will adjourn next month without passing the energy legislation this country needs -- measures the President sent to Congress this summer. Congress passed two important measures. One gave the President authority for emergency gas rationing and for setting state-by-state conservation targets.

8. Another, which the President signed this week, provides \$1.3 billion to low-income people to pay fuel bills this winter. That is in addition to \$250 million in aid already on its way to the states. The President is determined that people with high heating costs not have to choose between heating their homes and putting food on the table. He saw to it that adequate supplies of home heating oil would be available, especially in New England, and he is seeing to it that people get help to pay the cost.

9. However, Congress has not yet acted on three critical proposals by the President:

- o First, we must have an energy mobilization board to cut red tape and build necessary energy projects.

- o Second, we must have a massive new effort to conserve energy nationwide, to expand solar energy and other alternatives, and to build a synthetic fuels industry.
- o Third, and most important, this country needs a windfall profits tax to finance our transition toward energy security for America.

10. These three measures are close to passage in Congress. But special interests, and I mean the oil companies, are fighting to stop us. They can stop us. They can win -- unless you and the rest of the country support the President and make it absolutely clear where you stand -- for an energy future secure from the whims and threats of foreign governments.

11. Let me add this. Like you, I am concerned about the prices consumers must pay for energy. But do not think that price controls are an answer. In fact, they are a cheap ticket toward more energy waste, more demand for imported oil, more dependence on foreign suppliers, more inflation and unemployment -- in short, a weaker America. Someone who says that we can continue price controls and cut imports is not doing you, or future generations, any favors.

12. The plain fact is that we have a sound energy future within our reach. We need Congress to act before it adjourns. So I ask you to make your views known loud and clear. And with your your help, we can make that start, beginning today.
