RE: JANUARY IOWA TRIPS/STOPS

The following is the proposed schedule for Mrs. Carter in Iowa the first 2 weeks of January. Parts of the schedule are awaiting Mrs. Carter's approval (which I have noted) and parts are confirmed. If Mrs. Carter does the entire schedule it will probably require 6 teams of advance people at least as far as my requirements are concerned. Let me know how you wish to handle the personnel on these stops. Thank you.

- * January 6 -- Travel to Iowa with POTUS. Mrs. Carter would accompany the President on his schedule. RON DES MOINES WITH POTUS
- * January 7 -- RSC stops (without POTUS) Note: We would fly to each of these cities: Dubuque, Mason City and rejoin POTUS in Des Moines for the Debate and Debate parties.
---RON DES MOINES--- (POTUS returns to Washington)
- * January 8 -- RSC stops (via airplane) in Sioux City, Council Bluffs and Ottumwa. Return to Washington for evening Green Door event at the Kennedy Center
- January 11 - Travel to Iowa with Mrs. Mondale. Fly to Waterloo for event. Drive to Iowa Falls, Marshalltown, Ames, Ankeny and Des Moines. RON DES MOINES (Note: Tentative event in Des Moines in the evening)
- January 12 - RSC stops in Des Moines, Adel, Boone and Fort Dodge. Fly out of Fort Dodge en route Andrews AFB

* = Tentative, awaiting RSC approval which I should have an answer on by Friday, December 28.

Underlined cities = Approved stops

I would send advance people out in the following manner:

1. 2-person team to Dubuque, Iowa, traveling on January 3rd for event on January 7th. This team would then proceed to Ames, Iowa after the Dubuque event and advance Ames (11th event), Boone (12th event) and Fort Dodge (12th event). They would stay in Ames.
2. 2-person team to Mason City, Iowa, traveling on January 3rd for event on January 7th. This team would then proceed to Waterloo, Iowa after the Mason City event and advance Waterloo, Iowa Falls and Marshalltown (all 11th events). They would stay in Waterloo.

If Vice President Mondale does not agree to go to Waterloo for the Blackhawk County Democratic Dinner and the Statewide Black meeting, Mrs. Carter has indicated that she will go. If that happens, we will have to alter the coffee schedule. It would not make sense that have Mrs. Carter in Waterloo for a coffee on the 11th and then again for 2 events on the 12th.

Introduction for First Lady's Speeches

I am glad to be back in Iowa. Jimmy sends you his love and wishes you a happy new year.

He wanted to be here today. Instead, he has had to turn all his efforts to international problems.

Events are changing rapidly, almost every hour. It is a time for courage, patience, and firm, measured action. The President and the country have risen to that occasion, and this has spoken loud and clear to the rest of the world.

We have said plainly that we will not rest until every American held in Tehran is free. We will not give into terrorism, whatever its form or wherever it is.

And we are acting firmly to counter the Soviet invasion

of Afghanistan. It is an intolerable act of aggression. And the President has not hesitated to respond.

I can tell you that Jimmy is angry -- all of us are angry. But we can be proud of how he and all Americans have acted in this crisis.

These events reminded us of many things: how dangerous and complex the world is, how America still stands for strength and compassion and justice.

But most of all, it reminds us how much we need a President who can make tough, courageous, honest decisions. Thank God that President is in the White House right now.
