THANK YOU!

IF JIMMY WERE ABLE TO LEAVE WASHINGTON AND THE INTERNATIONAL CRISIS, HE WOULD BE HERE TODAY.

JIMMY CARTER HAS ALWAYS HAD A SPECIAL REGARD FOR EDUCATION -- AND FOR TEACHERS. OUTSIDE HIS FAMILY, THE MOST INFLUENTIAL PERSON IN HIS LIFE WAS A TEACHER -- MISS JULIE COLEMAN -- WHO CHALLENGED HIM AS A CHILD TO LEARN, TO READ, TO LOVE GOOD MUSIC AND ART, AND TO FIND OUT ALL HE COULD ABOUT THE WORLD.

IN THE STATE SENATE, AND AS GOVERNOR OF GEORGIA, HE CONTINUED THAT COMMITMENT.

WHEN JIMMY CAMPAIGNED IN 1976, HE MADE EDUCATION A MAJOR ISSUE. AT THAT TIME FEDERAL GOVERNMENT SUPPORT FOR EDUCATION WAS ACTUALLY DECLINING IN REAL DOLLARS. HE PLEDGED TO TURN AROUND THAT DECLINING SUPPORT.

THE NATIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATION ENDORSED HIM. THE TEACHERS OF THIS COUNTRY WORKED HARD TO ELECT HIM.

AND I HAVE BEEN PROUD OF HIS RECORD SINCE HE HAS BEEN PRESIDENT.

SINCE HE HAS BEEN PRESIDENT -- LARGEST APPROPRIATION FOR EDUCATION IN HISTORY....

JIMMY WAS COMMITTED TO THE IDEA THAT WE COULD NOT EXPECT TEACHERS TO RENEW THEIR SKILLS, TO REFRESH THEMSELVES, TO KEEP WITH ADVANCES IN METHODS WITHOUT MORE HELP.

THE NEA FOR YEARS HAS RUN LOCAL TEACHER CENTERS, AND, AT LONG LAST, THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IS HELPING.
