HE IS DOING EVERYTHING HUMANLY POSSIBLE TO SECURE THE SAFE RELEASE OF THE HOSTAGES IN IRAN. JIMMY IS ALSO DEALING WITH THE SOVIET INVASION OF AFGHANISTAN. HE'S TAKEN FIRM ACTION TO IMPOSE PUNISHMENT ON THE SOVIET UNION. HE'S MADE SOME DIFFICULT DECISIONS -- THE GRAIN EMBARGO, THE OLYMPIC BOYCOTT, THE REGISTRATION -- DIFFICULT DECISIONS TO MAKE -- AND HE MADE THEM BECAUSE HE BELIEVES THESE ACTIONS ARE ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY. THEY LET THE SOVIET UNION KNOW THAT THEY MUST PAY THE CONSEQUENCES OF THIS BRUTAL ACT OF INVASION. THEY ARE ALSO NECESSARY TO AVOID MILITARY ACTION AND TO KEEP OUR COUNTRY AT PEACE -- THAT IS THE IMPORTANT THING.

WE HAVE BEEN IN WASHINGTON FOR THREE YEARS, AND IT'S BEEN AN EXCITING AND CHALLENGING TIME FOR ME. I HAVE A LOT OF ACTIVITIES I AM INVOLVED IN WHICH ARE IMPORTANT TO ME. ONE OF OUR MOST IMPORTANT CONCERNS ARE THE PROBLEMS OF THE ELDERLY. JIMMY AND I BOTH KNOW THE PROBLEMS OF THE ELDERLY FIRST HAND BECAUSE MY MOTHER IS 75. MY FATHER DIED WHEN I WAS 13 YEARS OLD, AND MY MOTHER RAISED FOUR CHILDREN BY CLERKING IN A GROCERY STORE, WORKING IN A SCHOOL LUNCHROOM, AND FINALLY SHE WENT TO WORK IN THE POST OFFICE. SHE RAISED US ALL AND NOW IS RETIRED FROM THE POST OFFICE. IT WAS VERY DIFFICULT FOR HER TO RETIRE, BUT WE PUT HER TO WORK CAMPAIGNING, AND I THINK SHE IS HAPPY AND ENJOYING HER RETIREMENT NOW.

AND JIMMY'S MOTHER, AS YOU PROBABLY KNOW, IS 81 YEARS OLD -- SHE JOINED THE PEACE CORPS WHEN SHE WAS 68 YEARS OLD AND WENT TO INDIA.

IN THE LAST CAMPAIGN IN ALMOST EVERY COMMUNITY WE WENT INTO A CONVALESCENCE HOME, A NURSING HOME, A GOLDEN AGE CLUB -- SOME PLACE WHERE THERE WERE ELDERLY CITIZENS. I TALKED WITH THEM AND SPENT TIME WITH THEM LEARNING ABOUT THEIR PROBLEMS. I KNOW THAT IF JIMMY WERE ELECTED PRESIDENT -- AND I FELT SURE AT THAT TIME HE WAS GOING TO BE -- I WOULD HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO WORK WITH THE NEEDS AND PROBLEMS OF OUR SENIOR CITIZENS.

BABIES AND THE POOR. WE WILL BE WORKING ON THAT, AND WE NEED YOUR HELP WITH CONGRESS IN GETTING THAT PASSED. ONE OF THE

ONE OF THE GREATEST BURDENS FOR THE ELDERLY CITIZENS OF OUR COUNTRY TODAY IS TRYING TO PAY THE HIGH COST OF UTILITIES AND HEATING FUEL. I AM PROUD THAT THE PRESIDENT HAS BEEN A LEADER FOR THE ELDERLY; IN FACT, I AM PROUD OF THE JOB THAT HE HAS BEEN DOING LEADING OUR COUNTRY. HE HAS -- IN JUST THREE YEARS -- A SOLID RECORD OF ACHIEVEMENT. THERE HAVE BEEN TWO INDEPENDENT STUDIES LATELY -- NOT GOVERNMENTAL -- INDEPENDENT ... THE CONGRESSIONAL QUARTERLY AND THE NATIONAL JOURNAL. THEY SHOW THAT JIMMY CARTER -- WORKING WITH CONGRESS -- HAS PASSED 80% OF ALL THE LEGISLATION HE PUT FORWARD AND WORKED FOR. THAT'S ALMOST A RECORD, AND PEOPLE DON'T KNOW IT, SO I'M GLAD OUR CAMPAIGN HAS COME ALONG SO I CAN GET OUT AND TELL PEOPLE ABOUT IT.

THESE HAVE NOT JUST BEEN THE EASY THINGS ... HE HAS BEEN COURAGEOUS IN ATTACKING THE DIFFICULT ISSUES -- ENERGY FOR INSTANCE. IF EVERY SITUATION WERE EASY TO SOLVE, THE ENERGY PROBLEM WOULD HAVE BEEN SOLVED A LONG TIME AGO. HE HAS BEEN PERSISTENT AND VERY SOON WE ARE GOING TO HAVE THE FIRST COMPREHENSIVE ENERGY PROGRAM IN THE HISTORY OF OUR COUNTRY.

THAT'S JUST ONE OF THE DIFFICULT THINGS HE HAS FACED. HE HAS FACED EVERY ISSUE -- HE HAS NOT DUCKED A ONE REGARDLESS OF POLITICAL CONSEQUENCES. AND I AM VERY PROUD THAT HE HAS

CONSISTENTLY TOLD THE AMERICAN PEOPLE THE TRUTH -- EVEN WHEN YOU DIDN'T WANT TO HEAR IT -- SOMETIMES ABOUT ENERGY, ABOUT INFLATION.

JIMMY CARTER IS A VERY STRONG PERSON. HE IS COURAGEOUS, CALM STEAD AND PERSISTENT. WE NEED HIS CONTINUED LEADERSHIP AND HIS EXPERIENCE -- THE DEPTH OF HIS EXPERIENCE. WE NEED TO GIVE THEM TIME TO WORK. YOU CAN BE HELPFUL TO US AND SEE THAT WE HAVE CONTINUITY IN THOSE PROGRAMS -- YOU CAN GO TO THE CAUCUSES AND VOTE FOR JIMMY CARTER AND FRITZ MONDALE.

I WOULD LIKE TO CLOSE BY SAYING THAT THESE ARE DIFFICULT BUT EXCITING AND CHALLENGING TIMES. OKLAHOMA CITY, OKLAHOMA

I am glad to be here today. As you know, the crisis in Iran and Afghanistan are great tests and trials for our nation, and the President must stay in Washington.

I have been very proud of the support and restraint of the American people during the crisis, and I am proud of the way the President has lead our nation.

I have been close to him this past month -- in fact, for 33 years -- and I can tell you that he has searched his soul for the right solutions - just as he has in every important decision in the past three years.

The events in Iran remind us that the basic principles of patriotism, independence, freedom, human rights, justice mean as much today as at any time in our nation's history, and we thank God for that.

Jimmy Carter is a man of compassion and courage - who believes that one of government's most basic obligations is to the disadvantaged, the poor, the afflicted, to the elderly, and to children - that government must ensure for everyone the opportunity for a decent life and a hopeful future.

And one way to assure that is by having representatives at the highest level of government in policy making positions - people who know first hand the problems and concerns and dreams of those who need services.

When Jimmy was elected President, he didn't just thank the black people of our country for their support. He put them in those policy-making positions. That can make a difference in how government works.

And in just three years, he has appointed more black judges than all other President's combined. It is so necessary to have justice in the federal court.

One of the most important things in life is the right to have a job -- to be self-sufficient - to be useful to family, community, and country. The President has worked, and will continue to work, to give that chance to every American.

He is concerned about our young people. So many are unemployed, out of school, getting in trouble, without hope for the future. The one major new piece of legislation this year is for youth employment and training to give young people a new beginning - a good education, training and a job.

Underlying all of this is my husband's belief in morality and justice and his deep religious conviction. This belief is the chief influence on his life.

I am grateful to be here with you today because I know this is the chief influence on your life, too.

I have seen from my earliest days in the South the courage of the black leaders in churches. I have seen your courageous stand for spiritual progress - for an end to the disgrace of racism, and end to poverty, and an end to hunger.

I have seen the courageous stand for equal rights and equal opportunity for all Americans.

These are the principles that guide all of you gathered here this evening - and these are the principles that have guided Jimmy Carter since he has been President.

I am proud that we are partners in sustaining values that are important to us -- that we are partners with a great sensitivity and love and concern for those who yearn for a better life.

You are my brothers and sisters, and I am very proud of that. For we all know that the ultimate test of our lives is not fame or wealth, but how we served God and -- through that - our fellow human beings in the cause of freedom.

For the President of the United States, let me thank you for your loyalty and support. Thank you for what you mean to my family personally -- and for what you mean as active, caring, compassionate leaders to our country.
