First Lady Rosalynn Carter will travel to New England on Thursday, stopping in Massachusetts, New Hampshire and Connecticut, and returning to Washington Friday evening, February 15.

Mrs. Carter will fly from Washington to Boston on Thursday afternoon, and she will attend a Valentine Party with senior citizens in Revere, Mass. From there she will drive to Hudson, New Hampshire for a Carter-Mondale reception at the Presentation of Mary School. She will go from Hudson to Concord, where she will overnight.

The First Lady will visit Capital Plaza Towers in Concord on Friday morning for a senior citizens reception, and she will attend a Carter-Mondale reception in Laconia early Friday afternoon.

On Friday afternoon Mrs. Carter will travel from Concord to New Haven, Connecticut. Mrs. Carter will attend a Carter-Mondale fundraising reception that evening at the Bernard Center at the University of Bridgeport. Later Friday evening she will attend a Carter-Mondale fundraising dinner at the Harvey Hubbell Gymnasium also at the University of Bridgeport.

Following the dinner, the First Lady will return to Washington.
