MRS. CARTER'S REMARKS - AS DELIVERED

THANK YOU. IT IS WONDERFUL TO BE HERE WITH YOU. I BRING GREETINGS FROM THE PRESIDENT. HE IS IN WASHINGTON HANDLING THE RAPIDLY-CHANGING INTERNATIONAL CRISES. THESE CRISES HAVE BEEN A GREAT TEST AND TRIAL FOR OUR NATION.

I HAVE BEEN VERY PROUD OF THE SUPPORT AND RESTRAINT OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE DURING THIS DIFFICULT TIME, AND I AM PROUD OF THE WAY THE PRESIDENT HAS LED OUR NATION.

I HAVE BEEN CLOSE TO HIM THESE PAST MONTHS (AND FOR 33 YEARS) AND I CAN TELL YOU HE HAS SEARCHED HIS SOUL FOR THE RIGHT SOLUTIONS -- JUST AS HE HAS IN EVERY IMPORTANT DECISION IN THE PAST THREE YEARS.

THE EVENTS IN IRAN AND AFGHANISTAN REMIND US THAT THE BASIC PRINCIPLES OF PATRIOTISM, INDEPENDENCE, FREEDOM, HUMAN RIGHTS, AND JUSTICE MEAN AS MUCH TODAY AS AT ANY TIME IN OUR NATION'S HISTORY. AND WE THANK GOD FOR THAT.

JIMMY CARTER IS A MAN OF COMPASSION AND COURAGE -- WHO BELIEVES THAT ONE OF GOVERNMENT'S MOST BASIC OBLIGATIONS IS TO THE DISADVANTAGED, THE POOR, THE AFFLICTED, TO THE ELDERLY AND TO CHILDREN -- THAT GOVERNMENT MUST ENSURE FOR EVERYONE THE OPPORTUNITY FOR A DECENT LIFE AND A HOPEFUL FUTURE.

HE KNOWS WHAT IT MEANS TO WORK HARD FOR A LIVING. HE KNOWS THE NEED FOR THAT SATISFACTION THAT COMES FROM HAVING A JOB,

THE REWARD OF FEELING SELF-SUFFICIENT -- USEFUL TO FAMILY, COMMUNITY AND COUNTRY. SINCE HE HAS BEEN PRESIDENT, JIMMY CARTER HAS BEEN COMMITTED TO GIVING THIS CHANCE IN LIFE TO EVERY AMERICAN.

HE HAS WORKED TO CREATE NEW JOBS AND HAS BROUGHT THE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE DOWN -- NOT ENOUGH, BUT HE HAS BROUGHT IT DOWN -- AND HE IS DEEPLY TROUBLED ABOUT OUR YOUNG PEOPLE. SO MANY ARE UNEMPLOYED, OUT OF SCHOOL, GETTING IN TROUBLE, WITHOUT HOPE FOR THE FUTURE. THE ONE MAJOR NEW PIECE OF LEGISLATION THIS YEAR IS FOR YOUTH WORK AND EDUCATION PROGRAMS TO GIVE YOUNG PEOPLE A NEW BEGINNING -- A GOOD EDUCATION, TRAINING AND A JOB.

HE HAS APPOINTED MORE BLACKS TO HIGH POSITIONS IN GOVERNMENT THAN ALL OTHER PAST PRESIDENTS COMBINED:

SPECIAL ASST TO PRESIDENT -- LOUIS MARTIN -- I WORK CLOSELY WITH LOUIS, AND HE IS YOUR ADVOCATE IN THE WHITE HOUSE.

THESE APPOINTMENTS ARE IMPORTANT AND NECESSARY -- BECAUSE THEY CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN HOW GOVERNMENT WORKS AND HOW GOVERNMENT REACHES THOSE WHO NEED SERVICES.

ANOTHER IMPORTANT ACCOMPLISHMENT -- IN JUST THREE YEARS, JIMMY HAS APPOINTED 30 BLACK JUDGES -- NECESSARY IN ORDER TO HAVE JUSTICE IN A FEDERAL COURT.

OTHER IMPORTANT THINGS HAVE BEEN DONE:

(HOUSING - RENEWAL INNER CITIES - TRANSPORTATION)

(AND DEVELOPMENT OF MINORITY BUSINESSES)
 - FOOD STAMP REFORM (INCLUDES 2.2 MILLION ADDITIONAL ELIGIBLE
LOW-INCOME AMERICANS)
 - INCREASED FUNDING AND STAFFING FOR ENFORCEMENT OF CIVIL
RIGHTS LAWS TO HIGHEST LEVELS IN HISTORY
 - NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN - ELDERLY, POOR, MOTHERS, BABIES
 - EDUCATION DEPARTMENT - LARGEST APPROPRIATION
- EVEN IN A TIME OF BUDGET RESTRAINTS, WE HAVE WORKED TO MAKE
SURE THAT THE POOR, ELDERLY, DISADVANTAGED, WEAK ARE NOT HURT.

I COULD GO ON, BECAUSE THE ACCOMPLISHMENTS ARE MANY. WE
KNOW THERE IS MUCH MORE THAT NEEDS TO BE DONE.

BUT I WANT YOU TO KNOW THAT JIMMY CARTER -- AND I -- ARE
WORKING EVERY DAY IN WASHINGTON WITH YOUR THOUGHTS AND CONCERNS

THESE ARE THE PRINCIPLES THAT GUIDE ALL OF YOU WHO ARE
GATHERED HERE -- AND THESE ARE THE THINGS THAT HAVE GUIDED
JIMMY CARTER SINCE HE HAS BEEN PRESIDENT.

I AM PROUD THAT WE ARE PARTNERS IN SUSTAINING THE VALUES
THAT ARE IMPORTANT TO US -- PARTNERS WITH A GREAT SENSITIVITY

JIMMY SENDS GREETINGS ... I AM GOING TO TALK ABOUT MY HUSBAND. GLAD TO BE BACK IN VERMONT -- HAVE BEEN TRAVELLING MUCH. HAVE ENJOYED CAMPAIGNING AGAIN, GOING BACK TO THOSE PLACES I WAS IN FOUR YEARS AGO -- SEEING FRIENDS I MADE THEN -- MAKING NEW FRIENDS. IT HAS BEEN FUN.

AND I LEARNED SOMETHING VERY IMPORTANT EARLY IN THE CAMPAIGN. THAT MADE A GREAT IMPRESSION ON ME AND HAS HELPED ME AS I HAVE WORKED. THAT IS THAT PEOPLE ALL OVER THIS COUNTRY ARE THE SAME. WE MAY HAVE DIFFERENT LIFE SYTTLES, MAKE A LIVING A DIFFERENT WAY, AND HAVE DIFFERENT INTERESTS. BUT THE SAME THINGS THAT ARE IMPORTANT TO ME WHETHER I AM IN PLAINS OR IN WASHINGTON ARE IMPORTANT TO YOU HERE IN VERMONT.

WE'VE BEEN IN WASHINGTON THREE YEARS, AND LIVING IN THE WHITE HOUSE HAS BEEN EXCITING AND ENJOYABLE FOR ALL OUR FAMILY. JIMMY, AMY, AND I -- ALL OUR FAMILY -- REALIZE THAT THESE ARE SPECIAL YEARS WITH WONDERFUL EXPERIENCES AND GREAT OPPORTUNITIES.

AS I WAS LEAVING THE WHITE HOUSE THIS MORNING, THE PRESIDENT TOLD ME TO CONVEY HIS GREETINGS AND BEST WISHES TO YOU AND HIS GRATITUDE FOR YOUR CONFIDENCE AND SUPPORT.

I'M GLAD TO BE HERE AT THE BEGINNING OF A NEW YEAR, THE YEAR OF THE MONKEY. (MOTHER - CALL ON MONDAYS ALL SUPPORT PRES.)

THE PRESIDENT IS IN WASHINGTON HANDLING THE RAPIDLY-CHANGING INTERNATIONAL CRISES. HE IS DOING EVERYTHING HUMANLY POSSIBLE TO SECURE THE SAFE RELEASE OF OUR AMERICAN CITIZENS WHO ARE BEING HELD HOSTAGE IN IRAN.

OVER THE PAST SEVERAL WEEKS, HIS EFFORTS AND OUR ACTIVITIES HAVE BECOME VERY DELICATE AND INTENSE. WE NOW HAVE SOME POSITIVE SIGNS, BUT WE KNOW FROM PAST EXPERIENCE THAT WE MUST GUARD AGAINST BEING OVERLY OPTIMISTIC.

AND HE IS DEALING WITH THE SOVIETS AND THE SITUATION IN AFGHANISTAN.

THE PRE-EMINENT RESPONSIBILITY OF A PRESIDENT IS TO KEEP OUR NATION SECURE AND AT PEACE -- AND THIS PRESIDENT HAS KEPT OUR NATION AT PEACE. WE HAVE NOT HAD ONE LIFE LOST IN COMBAT SINCE HE HAS BEEN PRESIDENT. THE PAST SIX PRESIDENTS COULD NOT MAKE THIS STATEMENT.

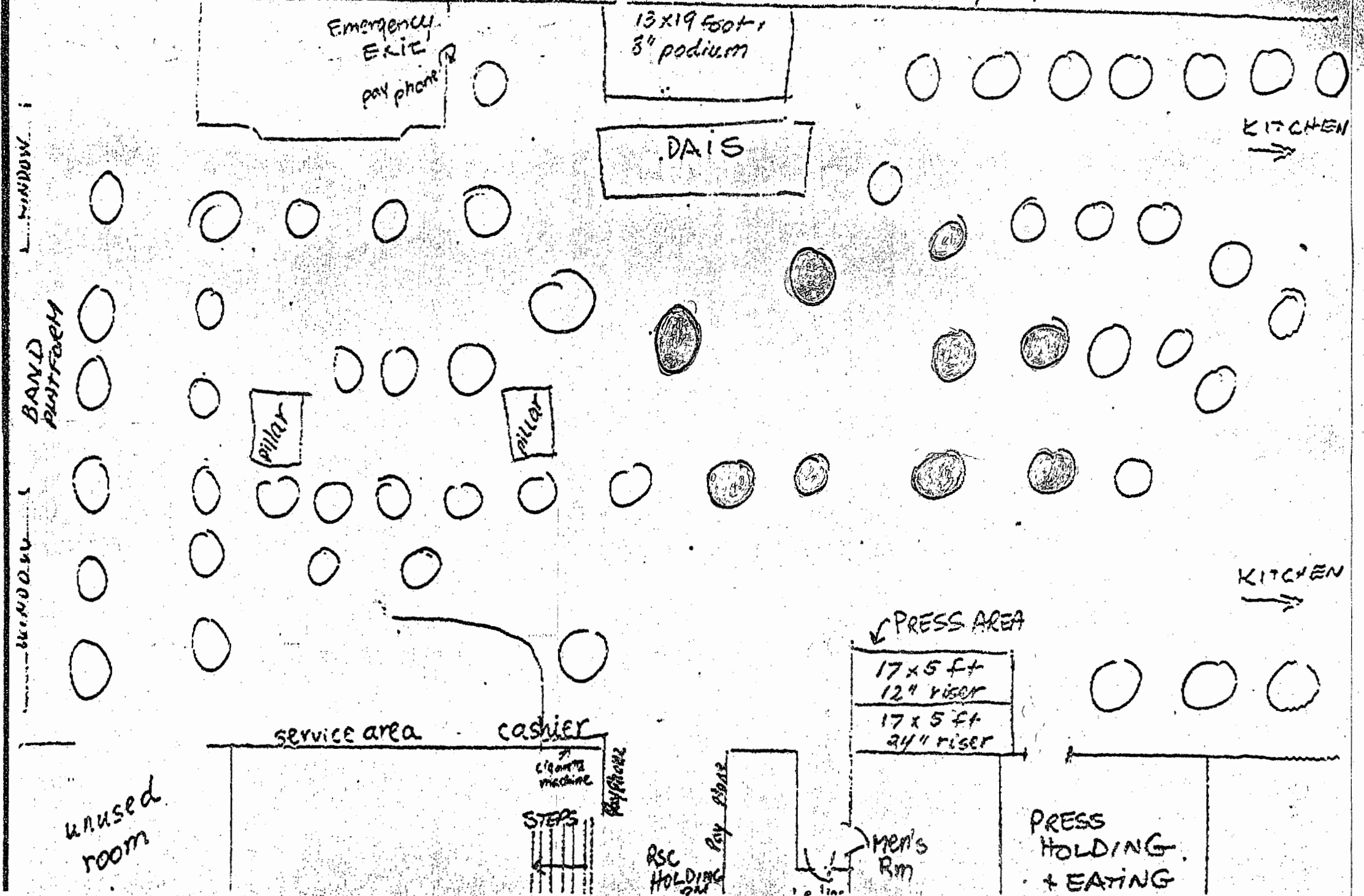
