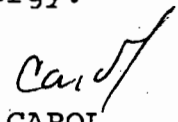

RUTH --

The Coal Extraction and Utilization Research Center is charged with coordinating coal research. It was founded in 1974 by then-Governor Dan Walker as the state's official coal research center and receives over \$3 million dollars a year from the federal and state government and from private sources.

The Center has 75 faculty research associates from 25 academic departments at SIU. It is entirely a research center--there is no power plant or coal gasification project associated with it.

They would like Mrs. Carter to tour some of their laboratory facilities. In particular, they are anxious to show her a highly advanced instrument they have to study sulfur content in coal--sulfur pollution being a major problem with coal as a source of energy.


CAROL

They are planning to show Mrs. Carter the Advanced Scientific Lab. It is a small room that will hold 30 people. It has a semi-circle consol of equipment -- scopes, screens and computers. Press can get pictures from all angles. This equipment is specifically used for researching the sulfur problem in coal. How it occurs. (Sulfur is the chemical that causes acid rain and acid draining problems in mines.) Once they establish what causes it, they can hopefully find solutions for the problem.

They would like Mrs. Carter to operate the run an automatic qualitative chemical analysis of a particle. It will demonstrate how the machine is programed and give a computer print-out analysis of the particle.

Overall, they are involved in all research coordination related to increasing utilization of coal in an environmentally sound manner in compliance with the administration's environmental goals.
