TALKING POINTS FOR MR. CARTER

Women's Event on Friday, March 21, 1980

But sent from NYC - This should not be "women's" speech - but you might want to add some class

- There are no simple answers to the complex problems confronting our nation today! This is true whether we are talking about inflation, or the woman's place in our society.
- Those who seek votes by promising easy solutions are not attracting support because the American people know better. They know that Jimmy Carter has tackled some of the most difficult problems - foreign and domestic - that this country has ever faced; and more and more as I travel this the people are seeing a solid record of achievement. A record of "steady progress": (theme)
- This steady progress is evident in many issues of particular concern to you here today.

Women's Issues

- In the area of women's rights, Jimmy Carter's record has shown real substantial achievement. The President's commitment to equal rights for women extends throughout the government in every program, in every agency. And, not just in the unassailable record on appointments to powerful federal positions or his and my effort on behalf of ERA.
- A key area is women's equality in our economic system. This takes steady, continuous pressure through federal effort to protect against discrimination in and provide increased resources to women-owned businesses. Jimmy created a special unit in the Justice Department to enforce the Equal Credit Opportunity Act, and consolidated equal employment opportunity enforcement under Eleanor Holmes Norton with a 40% increase in resources.
- As to economic resources, the President established the first government-wide policy to aid women business owners. Not only are we providing more training, counseling and business loans to women, but we are more than doubling - to \$300 million - federal procurement to women-owned businesses. This will really provide women with their so-called "share of the action."
- In the areas of social equality the President's actions have moved to eliminate sex discrimination in federal labor programs, vocational education assistance and in housing programs. The Carter Administration has added significant resources to day care programs and efforts against domestic violence. Most importantly he proposed and obtained changes in the Social Security Act to eliminate the "widow penalty" which allows a widow to remarry with out reduction in benefits. The President also signed legislation that raised the mandatory retirement age - so important to elderly women.

~~These achievements for women are not easy; I will not tell you we have achieved true equality in 3 years. What it takes is day-in and day-out efforts throughout the federal government. Much of this work does not make the news; much of it might not be terribly exciting to some of you. What is needed is steady progress along many fronts. The results might not show in a single flash, but rather in such things as future employm~~

Talking Points for Mrs. Carter - con't

- But, this record of progress is also evident in an issue perhaps more in the news today - the national economy and our fight against inflation - important to you as community, business, political and family leaders.
 - There are no single answers to inflation. Many of its causes are beyond the direct control of the President and even of Congress. We have achieved a record level of jobs for our people - 9 million new jobs in 3 years - with many of these going to women. We are holding unemployment steady. We are beginning to turn around the dire predictions for our cities that was evident three years ago through the President's urban policy.
 - But the answer to the terrible spiral of inflation does not lie in programs which sound good but don't really work. The President will not engage in election year economic gimmicks as Nixon did in 1972 when he implemented controls only long enough to get re-elected.
 - Last Friday the President called for discipline from every segment of society: individuals, business and governments. We need discipline in the federal budget, and therefore working with Congress will balance the 81 budget. We need discipline over growth of credit and therefore he has authorized the Federal Reserve to impose new restraints on consumer credit (except for homes, automobiles and durable goods). The President will place more discipline on the monitoring of wages and price guidelines with selective prenotification. Finally, the President is imposing discipline in our use of energy through an oil import fee and stricter gasoline conservation targets to reduce consumption by 6%.
- These actions will be unpleasant. But anyone, I mean anyone - who offers you easy cure-alls; who proposes remedies they know cannot be enacted into law or work in the long term is trying to fool the American people. I am telling you that the people will not buy that. They are supporting Jimmy because he is working hard at tackling very complex problems. The people know Jimmy Carter is honest and decent and he will not resort to election year slogans which will not help the country. It is more important to make progress on these efforts than to get re-elected.

HE DID THESE THINGS REGARDLESS BECAUSE OF HIS DEEP COMMITMENT TO
THE SECURITY OF ISRAEL AND PEACE WITH HER NEIGHBORS.

HE HAS ALWAYS SAID THAT THIS WAS MORE IMPORTANT -- PEACE FOR
ISRAEL -- THAN HIS OWN PERSONAL PRESTIGE OR HIS OWN POLITICAL
FORTUNES.

THIS PAST WEEK AN AIRPLANE FLEW FROM CAIRO TO TEL AVIV -- THE
WEEK BEFORE EGYPT AND ISRAEL EXCHANGED AMBASSADORS.

THESE WERE POSSIBLE, WITH OTHER THINGS, BECAUSE OF THE PEACE TREATY. WE CANNOT AFFORD TO LET THIS ALL SLIP AWAY.

THE UN VOTE WAS UNFORTUNATE BECAUSE IT WAS CONTRARY TO U.S. POLICY AND BECAUSE OF ITS POTENTIAL TO JEOPARDIZE THE ONGOING PEACE NEGOTIATIONS.

THE PRESIDENT MOVED IMMEDIATELY, AS SOON AS HE REALIZED WHAT HAD HAPPENED TO CORRECT THE MISTAKE -- POLITICAL CONSEQUENCES ASIDE AGAIN.

JIMMY CARTER MAKES THE FOREIGN POLICIES FOR OUR NATION AND WILL CONTINUE TO MAKE THE DECISIONS REGARDING ISRAEL. HE -- AND ONLY HE -- MAKES THE DECISIONS AND NOT THE STATE DEPARTMENT. AND HIS COMMITMENT TO PRIME MINISTER BEGIN AND PRESIDENT SADAT IS THAT THE DISMANTLING OF EXISTING SETTLEMENTS AND QUESTIONS CONCERNING JERUSALEM WILL BE NEGOTIATED BETWEEN THE TWO PARTIES -- ISRAEL AND EGYPT. (THEY ALL AGREE THAT JERUSALEM NEVER BE DIVIDED AND THAT THERE BE ACCESS BY ALL TO THE HOLY PLACES.) THAT COMMITMENT HAS NOT CHANGED AND WILL NOT CHANGE.

I AM PROUD OF HIS HONESTY AND COURAGE IN REACTING TO THIS UNFORTUNATE INCIDENT IMMEDIATELY AND FORTHRIGHTLY.

I AM PLEASED TODAY THAT I AM GOING TO HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO SEE A FILM THAT WILL TAKE ME BACK TO ONE OF THE MOST SIGNIFICANT WEEKS IN MY LIFE -- BECAUSE IT WAS THAT WEEK IN ISRAEL WHEN THE PRESIDENT AND PRIME MINISTER BEGIN -- AND THE OTHER COURAGEOUS LEADERS OF ISRAEL -- WORKED OUT THE FINAL PORTIONS OF THE MID-EAST PEACE TREATY. -- TENSE TIME -- DIFFICULT DECISIONS, BUT TERMS WERE WORKED OUT.

WE WENT FROM ISRAEL TO EGYPT -- SADAT AGREED TO ACCEPT THE ISRAELI TERMS. IT WAS AN HISTORIC WEEK.

I ALSO REMEMBER THAT THIS WAS DURING PURIM, AND JIMMY AND I READ THE BIBLE EVERY NIGHT AND JUST BY COINCIDENCE WE WERE READING THE BOOK OF ESTHER.

DO YOU KNOW THAT I CELEBRATED PURIM -- EXACTLY ONE YEAR AGO TODAY -- ON MARCH 12 -- IN YOUR B'NAI B'RITH WOMEN CHILDREN'S HOME IN THE BEAUTIFUL HILLS OUTSIDE JERUSALEM?

MRS. NAVON WAS WITH ME -- AND WE TALKED TO THE YOUNG BOYS AND WATCHED THEM AT WORK WITH THEIR CRAFTS. THEY SANG FOR ME. I LEARNED THAT DAY THAT 70% OF THOSE YOUNG PEOPLE WOULD BE REHABILITATED. THAT IS AN UNBELIEVABLE RECOVERY RATE! I ASKED THE DIRECTOR HOW IT WAS POSSIBLE AND HE SAID THE KEY TO THE THERAPY USED IS LOVE. (NO DRUGS ARE USED, THERE IS A ONE-TO-ONE STAFF/PATIENT RATIO.) EVERYONE WHO WORKS AT THE HOME -- GARDNERS, JANITORS, DRIVERS, COOKS, ETC. ARE A PART OF THE TEAM.

MUCH ATTENTION IS GIVEN TO PHYSICAL CONTACT -- HOLDING AND HUGGING THE KIDS AND SO FORTH.

THEY ALSO STRESS THE IMPORTANCE OF CONTINUITY IN STAFF. AN ENORMOUS EFFORT IS MADE TO KEEP STAFF. ALL OF THIS IS CRUCIAL TO CAUSES -- DEVELOP FEELINGS OF TRUST AND CONFIDENCE THESE KIDS DESPERATELY NEED.

AND THEY LEAVE THE HOME PREPARED FOR FULL, RICH LIVES -- CONTRIBUTING MEMBERS OF SOCIETY. THIS WAS A "VERY SPECIAL PLACE."

CLEARLY, THE B'NAI B'RITH WOMEN TRANSFORM COUNTLESS YOUNG LIVES BECAUSE YOU REACH OUT, BECAUSE YOU BRING TOGETHER THOSE WHO NEED HELP AND THOSE WHO CARE.

AND WHILE WE'RE TALKING ABOUT THE CHILDREN, IT SEEMS TO ME THAT THIS IS A PARTICULARLY APPROPRIATE TIME FOR US TO CONSIDER ALL THE THINGS THAT BRING US TOGETHER, JEWS AND CHRISTIANS ALIKE. WE ARE BROUGHT TOGETHER BY OUR BELIEF IN THE FAMILY AND CHILDREN, HOME AND TRADITION, RESPONSIBILITY TOWARD OTHERS IN THE FORM OF GOOD DEEDS. I KNOW THAT YOUR HERITAGE DEMANDS OF YOU CONCERN FOR THOSE LESS FORTUNATE -- DEMANDS THAT YOU COMFORT THOSE IN NEED, WHEREVER THEY MAY BE.

I LIKE TO THINK THAT I SHARE THAT DUTY WITH YOU -- THE DUTY TO COMFORT THE AFFLICTED, AND TO AFFLICT THE COMFORTABLE.

THERE ARE GREAT OPPORTUNITIES FOR ME AND FOR ALL OF US TO HELP CARE FOR OTHERS. AND WITH THE OPPORTUNITY COME THE RESPONSIBILITY.

I AM WELL ACQUAINTED WITH THE STRUCTURE OF THE NATIONAL JEWISH COMMUNITY AND ITS LOCAL ORGANIZATIONS. I KNOW THAT YOU, THROUGH YOUR GROUPS BOTH NATIONAL AND LOCAL, DO REACH OUT TO OTHERS WITH A WIDE RANGE OF IMPORTANT SERVICES: CARE OF THE ELDERLY; RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE NEEDY; CARE OF CHILDREN; THE DEFENSE OF LIBERTY AND FREEDOM; CARE OF THE ILL; AND INVOLVEMENT IN THE EDUCATION OF CHILDREN. THESE ARE AREAS OF GREAT INTEREST TO ME. AND I LOOK UPON THE AMERICAN JEWISH COMMUNITY AS A MODEL FOR NATIONAL VOLUNTEERISM.

IN OUR DEEDS AT HOME AND IN THE COMMUNITY, WE CAN ALL DEMONSTRATE OUR RESPECT FOR HUMAN DECENCY AND JUSTICE -- OUR INSTINCT FOR WHAT IS FAIR -- OUR STRENGTH AND HUMAN SYMPATHY -- OUR SHOW OF DISCONTENT WITH THE WAY THINGS ARE -- OUR DEMAND FOR STANDARDS AND MORALS, AND OUR ABILITY TO FEEL GUILT FOR HUMAN SUFFERING.

AND WE MUST MAINTAIN THE REAL AND MEANINGFUL SUPPORT FOR THE CHILDREN -- OUR OWN CHILDREN AS WELL AS THE TROUBLED CHILDREN YOU SO GENEROUSLY CARE FOR IN THE B'NAI B'RITH WOMEN CHILDREN'S HOME.

THANK YOU. IT IS WONDERFUL TO BE HERE WITH YOU. I BRING GREETINGS FROM THE PRESIDENT. HE IS IN WASHINGTON MONITORING AND DEALING WITH THE INTERNATIONAL CRISES -- AND HANDLING THE DIFFICULT PROBLEMS THAT FACE OUR NATION.

Attached are the following:

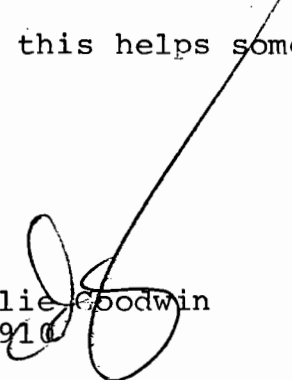
