JEANNETTE SHEET GLASS CORPORATION

In November 1978, A.S.G. Industries shut down its sheet glass manufacturing plant in Jeannette, Pa. Following this shutdown, the former employess organized an effort to purchase the plant and re-open it under an Employee Stock Ownership Plan.

With their own funds and with grants and loans from the state, the 350 employees raised close to \$3 million. On July 6, 1979, the employee group, now the Jeannette Sheet Glass Corporation applied for an EDA loan guarantee for \$2.8 million.

The corporation received an EDA guarantee and the employees were able to re-open the plant and go back to work 14 months after it closed.

Mr. Bill Pofaute, the President of the company will escort the First Lady through the plant.

Following the Johnstown flood, several neighborhood flood relief associations were formed in the Johnstown area by homeowners seeking assistance to rebuild their homes. Mr. Ed. Cernic and Mr. Harry Hamilton, who were involved in the flood recovery efforts, formed the Southern Allegheny Flood Recovery Association out of these various neighborhood groups. The Association helped homeowners obtain loans, grants and other forms of assistance they needed to recover from the flood.

Local businessmen soon came to the Association for assistance. Today, most of its efforts are focused on securing assistance for local businesses. The Association works closely with state and federal agencies.
